MMUC COMMITTEE PRESS RELEASE

Mangrove Mountain Union Church belongs to the Christian Community of the Mangrove Mountain area and was designed and built to be used for regular worship by Christians of this community.

From its beginning in 1912, Christian people who attended the church have lovingly cared for both the church and its property.

In 1964 a Management Board which was called the Mangrove Mountain Union Church Association was formed by church attendees with the express purpose of managing, repairing, letting, improving, selling, mortgaging or otherwise dealing with control of the property. This Management Board is still commissioned through the MMUC Inc. Constitution with this same task as designated by each group of leaders since that date.

In order to be a member of the Association a person must be a representative of a group that meets and holds services in the building on a regular basis. That person must be nominated by a Minister of the Word, leaders, office bearers or members of the group that meets or holds services at the building on a regular basis. The church from which that person comes must have been in existence for at least one year on the Mangrove Mountain church site. The above criteria for membership is still the case in 2021.

The decision to sell the property was a very difficult and heart-breaking one to make. It was based on the following:

- the ageing and numericallydeclining congregation
- lack of community support over the past few years especially community attendance at services
- rising costs to maintain the buildings and grounds
- the restrictions imposed by the Covid-19 pandemic resulting in little or no income over the last twelve months
- a forecast of little income able to be generated.

The MMUC Inc. Committee understands that the Mangrove

MMUC The Community Will Help

The Union Church is not in itself a religion, it is a property and church building that is shared by Christian denominations primarily for the conduct of Christian services with certain other community activities also permitted. It is established as an association of members by persons sharing the same aims and objectives.

The announcement by the MMUC management committee that they intended to sell the church left the community shocked, devestated and furious.

Residents of the district understand that with all community organisations in the district, the various management committees take on a significant workload and provide a great service to the community. This applies to groups such as the Kulnura Hall committee, Somersby Hall committee, several local Crown Land trusts, the Country Fair comittee, the Community Group, the MDA, Spencer Progress Group, River Cares group, Scouts, Guides, Childrens Centre, the various local District Rural Fire Brigades, CWA etcetc.

Mountain Union Church facility has been part of the Mountain community for a very long time. However, the reality is that its ongoing operation is unsustainable. The current MMUC Inc. Committee would love to see the Church remain on the Mountain as it is part of our collective history. We would like to see it continue as a place of worship in accordance with over a hundred years of tradition. There have been enquiries from independent religious communities indicating strong interest.

Alternatively, a community group may purchase the property and care for it as the current and past committees have tried to do.

It is hoped that the present buildings can be reinvigorated by new owners and continue to be part of the history of Mangrove Mountain.

Over time committee memberships change, persons leave, new persons join but the groups carry on, providing the services that help the community.

All groups have to raise funds to pay bills, purchase equipment, maintain assets, nothing new or unusual in this. All groups also have to put in labour to clean and maintain the assets and to do other works, again, nothing new or unusual.

The MMUC committee stated several reasons for wanting to sell the property and all have been addressed by the community.

Since the notice of sale, the community has rallied strongly and has suggested practical, reasonable and achievable proposals by which the church would not have to be sold and could continue for another 100 years, providing spiritual services to the residents of the district.

- The current committee could delay the sale and allow the community time to increase their engagement with the church and after the twelve months stipulated by the constitution, new members can join the committee.
- Alternatively, the committee has the authority under the Associations Incorporation Act to amend the constitution and can facilitate an increase in membership and the appointment of new committee members. The Church's own 2016 Constitution states:

"34 Special resolution A resolution of the Association is a special resolution:

(a) if it is passed by a majority which comprises at least three-quarters of such members of the Association as, being entitled under these rules so to do, vote in person or by proxy at a general meeting of which at least twenty-one (21) days written notice specifying the intention to continued on pg 3

The Sign

The sign outside the Union church informs us that "There is a time for everything in God' Kingdom". This seemed a bit vague and ambiguous to me, so in seeking a sign for the significance of the sign, I popped into Ken Duncan's Gallery at Erina, as one does when omens and portents could be useful. Being budget week I expected I would have to push past a posse of psephologists pointlessly hovering around a photograph of an eagle, but they had gone to pore over the entrails elsewhere.

And then I saw it. A photograph titled "Outback Oasis". It brought to mind how gardens have long been regarded as sacred places; places of refuge and renewal, sites of mythological significance such as Eden and Gethsemane. Or as Ken Duncan writes "They are havens where, if you can be still enough, you can feel the presence of God and hear his voice".

I never seem to get enough time for the gardening. I realised that in God's Kingdom it is a time for gardening, for nurturing and caring for what we have. It is not a time to desert the garden in our care. After all, you reap what you sow.

A garden is the more successful if it is created to benefit from the variety of colours, textures and forms in the



natural world, and the contrasts and harmonies in their juxtaposition. Many plants benefit their neighbours, perhaps this is also the case with people.

A garden which consists of a few daffodils and nothing else will soon lose its appeal. Just as it takes a village to raise a child, so an individual or group is part of a community, and needs that community to flourish. There is a shared responsibility. Can we really say: "I am not my brother's keeper"?

But perhaps I am missing the point of the revelation. Could it be that now

is the time for the church committee members to put down their burden, attend to their own gardens and allow their neighbours in the community to carry on the mission?

Why "sell the farm" when there is no need to, and before there is time to listen to offers of help.

Then again the sign outside the church might just be a warning that there is no need to rush in God's Kingdom, and that I should slow down and watch the road instead of reading signs when there is a tricky turn ahead.

propose the resolution as a special resolution was given in accordance with these rules, or

(b) where it is made to appear to the Director-General that it is not practicable for the resolution to be passed in the manner specified in rule 34 (a) if the resolution is passed in a manner specified by the Director-General."

- The committee has said that they find the workload too onerous and just don't want to do it any more, the community understands this and there are capable residents ready assist with or to take over these duties.
- The church is a focal point in the community for spiritual occasions (weddings, funerals etc) and it is ironic that after the sale announcement funerals for two residents were held there.
- The church is a shrine to the history of the district and those who have contributed to its advancement over the generations.
- COVID19 is not an excuse, there was government funding on offer and it is a one time event that is now being managed by government.
- There are many residents who are experienced in business, management and finance and who are able to assist with the management and financial planning and marketing of the church.
 Solutions can be found to deal with cost and income issues.
- The underlying requirement to be Christian faith based association can be maintained, services increased and the church not sold if all in the community just practice what they preach.

Some key points.

Membership

For 93 years membership of the Union Church was open to **anyone** in the district, not just Christians but with the proviso that the Church was to be used for Christian worship.

In 2005 the constitution was changed and membership was restricted to three persons from each of the Christian groups meeting at the church on a regular basis (and up to five if there were less than three groups)

In the 2016 constitution the maximum number of representatives of a group was increased to nine if only one group was involved.

Constitution Limitations

There are no requirements in the current constitution that explicitly require the property to be sold.

In fact, the original constitution stated that if for 12 months no religious service had been held, the property could be used "for the intellectual advancement of the residents of the Mangrove Mountain District as the Committee shall deem fit"

Underthe Associations Incorporation Act, committees have the authority by which it could make a range of changes to their constitution. The MMUC constitution could be changed to address some of the problems the committee has identified.

Changes to the Constitution

Since the 1964 constitution, the constitution has been changed four times.

The last of these changes, in 2016, was made by the current committee, so it is not a new experience to them and there are legal experts in the community who could help, if required, with new amendments and others in the community who could cover any associated costs.

Community Support

Since being built in 1912 by the residents of the district, the church, grounds and associated buildings have been managed, maintained and funded by the residents.

Over the years there were a multitude of improvements, pulpit, altar, reading desk and font added, floors sanded and polished. The building was clad, airconditioning installed, pews

replaced, murals hand painted, the list goes on.

Over the years there has been loads of community support in cash and kind. Just the Country Fair alone has donated tens of thousands of dollars over the years for improvements that increased the value of the church. These funds could have gone to other local uses in schools, halls etc but could be lost to organisations outside the district.

Horticulturalists in the district have donated tens of thousands of dollars worth of plants for fundraising sales.

Local residents have carried out extensive plumbing works.

Currently, residents are prepared to volunteer to carry out regular maintenance. There is absolutely no shortage of community support.

Finances

There is ample scope for sufficient funds to be raised to support the operating and maintenance expenses. Up to 2018 there were many groups using the church and hall but for various reasons some moved to other venues and some disbanded.

At the time of the announcement of the sale the church had \$14,000 in the bank, a sizeable amount and much more than most of the other community groups.

The MMUC Committee

The residents of the district greatly appreciate the efforts of the current committee and sincerely thank them and understand that they now find the task too demanding. The residents of the district recognise the gravity of the situation and have stepped up and are ready to take the reins.

The committee is now in a position to set in place a plan to hand the baton to the next generation, another committee who can continue to manage the MMUC for the conduct of Christian Services and the benefit of all the residents of the district.

Union Church -A Letter

I am a relative newcomer to the area and I am opposed to the proposed sale of the Union Church in the near future. However, I am even more concerned about what appears to be the current vilification of 4 senior community members in their unavoidable decision that they can no longer continue as the custodians of the church and its grounds. All these people are well over the age of retirement and several have major health issues. They have been valiantly fighting for years to try and keep the church and it's greatly hurting them now to have to admit their defeat and their inability to carry on. The COVID pandemic was the final issue which they could not battle and has forced their hand in making their decision.

I have been a regular member of the congregation and have not been in agreement with some of the pervious decisions made by the committee members either. But these 4 people (and some others who have now passed on) have been the ones who have been entrusted with decisions for the church and grounds. For years, they have been cleaning, maintaining and repairing the buildings, looking after the grounds and raising the funds to pay the ongoing expenses for

the buildings and the site. The income they get for the occasional hall hire (and some people have complained about those fees), wedding and services for just a handful of people do not cover the costs of maintaining the site. The insurance alone for the old wooden church built in a bush fire rated area are enormous. The church itself is in desperate need of a major upgrade and the cost for that is the vicinity of \$100,000. It badly requires the replacement of the cladding, which needs removing and replacing, and the windows which are also in need of a repair.

Can I ask you to think about when you have offered to assist them with any of these management issues or even the maintenance of the grounds?

Now the committee members are no longer able to maintain the church grounds so contracted someone to maintain them. But I have heard that this person has, on social media, said he is now maintaining the yards without any payment being provided. This accusation is likely to be untrue and can be easily resolved in the examination of the church financial records.

As many are aware the major fundraising effort is with the sale of plants which have been provided by local businesses. Funds raised in this way is usually aimed at providing the funds for the insurance of the property. The job of collecting the plants and then selling them is arduous and tiring and, as the 2 major fund-raising events occur on the long weekends in June and October it also involves all of the committee members who need to spend the whole of the weekend manning their stalls. This is no weekend holiday for these senior citizens.

The idea of the upcoming plant sale, which was being proposed and planned, was for any funds raised to go as a donation to the Country Fair Committee, not the church or the church committee. Again, posts on social media have reported this incorrectly and as further persecution for the commit members.

Another difficulty the committee has faced has been to locate a minister who can come and run services. There is a lack of ministers and most have their own commitments.

Since the announcement of the proposed sale there has been increased interest and attendance at the church services. It seems the announcement of the sale has at last (and no doubt too late) raised an interest in the church. While this is commendable, many of these people arrive well after the service has commenced and their arrival is often noisy and appears to be aimed at disrupting the service. Then, if they decide to accept the invitation for morning tea, they enjoy the privilege of being waited upon while still showing their rudeness and not even allowing any friendly



The committee members are not happy about their decision but cannot see any other course of action which is open to them. They should not be persecuted and are not villains. They were aware their decision would upset many in the community but could not see any other option they could take. Rather than condemnation these committee members should be thanked for all the years they have stepped up and cared for the site and then for the courageous decision they have been forced to make when they are no longer able to carry on.





Blues on the Mountain wiht Ash Grunwald -A Review-

A regular event in the Mangrove Mountain hall in the past 8 years, thanks to the enthusiasm of promoter Ryan Howard, an evening of Blues / Folk / Roots music from a range of local and national artists, this weekend saw the multi-talented Ash Grunwald head the bill, and he agreed to do two shows to assist with the COVID-19 capacity restrictions.

The opening act for the early show is local guitar prodigy, Taj Farrant, who at 11 years old, rips into a number of very grown-up rock songs on backing tapes, and delivers an impressive lead guitar line over the top – showcasing instrumental versions of tracks from Gary Moore, Eric Johnson and Journey, he also produced a fiery rendition of Steve Vai's For The Love Of God, and then a solid vocal on Gary Moore's Moving On.

The late show saw Brandon Dodd open the set, also a member of local Blues band Grizzlee Train, and best known for being part of Kasey Chamber's band, deliver an emotive solo set, which included a couple of rip-snorting blues stompers, and some haunting ballads. Brandon was at his best when letting fly on the guitar, but also has a real feel for honest bluesy songwriting and atmospheric performance at times.

Ash Grunwald has been around for much longer than he looks, over 20 years now, and has just released a new album in partnership with Josh Teskey that was due to be launched at Bluesfest. Not to be dismayed by the



cancellation, Ash has loaded up the van with surfboards and guitars, and has started an extensive regional tour taking in all parts of the country. He is such an engaging personality, full of stories and banter while perched on the Stomp Box, and alternating from deep Delta Blues, from Howlin' Wolf, and a slow version of Crossroads, to his own tracks from the Mojo and Hot Mama Vibes albums, and the new collaboration with Josh Teskey, Push The Blues Away.

Tracks that went OK in the early set appeared to get more life and soul in the late show, and while there were a couple of technical glitches, the party never stopped for long.

Whether on the steel guitar, or one of the Gretsch beauties on show, or on the more eclectic guitars used to deliver a range of tones – the overall sense of joy in the delivery of a rootsy blues stomp was palpable. As we approached the official close of 11.30, Ash asked if he could do one more – and we got the cracking Walking followed by an energetic Shake That Thing, and then an encore of Crazy and a blistering Thinking 'Bout Myself from the recent Teskey collaboration to end the night. The next NSW show

is in Sydney on June 5th, with 1000's of km in between driving up to far North QLD, then over to WA, back to Brisbane and the Gold Coast doing all the small venues, before all the Capital City shows in early June. Don't miss him!

This is the sort of show that relies on the unwavering commitment of a small number of dedicated volunteers, and the willingness of artists like Ash Grunwald to venture out to off-thegrid venues to play for a hungry music-loving audience – and judging by the activity at the merch desk from start to finish, hopefully there is enough in the kitty to replace the radio-jack that got trashed when twirling the steel guitar mid-song!



Australian housing values lifted by 1.8% in April according to CoreLogic's national home value index, with the monthly pace of capital gains easing from a 32-year high in March. Although growth conditions have slowed, housing values are still

rising at a rapid pace, up 6.8% over the past three months to be 10.2% higher than the COVID low in September last year.

The slowdown in housing value appreciation is unsurprising given the rapid rate of growth seen over the past six months, especially in the context of subdued wages growth. With housing prices rising faster than incomes, it's likely price sensitive sectors of the market, such as first home buyers and lower income households, are finding it harder to save for a deposit and fund transactional costs.

There is already some evidence of fewer first time buyers in the market, with the Australian Bureau of Statistics reporting a 4.8% fall in the value of first home buyer home loans through February and March.

Despite the slowdown, positive housing market conditions remain geographically broad-based with every capital city and 'rest-of-state' region continuing to record a lift in dwelling values over the month. Darwin and Sydney recorded the largest monthon-month rise in dwelling values, while Perth values recorded the lowest rate of growth amongst the capital cities at 0.8%.

The four smallest capital cities recorded double digit annual growth, reflecting a smaller COVID-related disruption and an earlier start to the growth phase last year. Melbourne is recording the lowest level of annual growth due to a larger downturn, attributable to the extended lockdown period year.(*NAB last economics)


