Indigenous **Black Duck** Songline

The Dharug and Lower Hawkesbury River Historical Society invite you to "A Reawakening of the Black Duck Songline", an afternoon with Special Guest Speaker Robert Fuller.

Please join us at the Chapel on Saturday 31st July where we are pleased to welcome Robert Fuller who an anthropologist/archaeologist and did a research Masters degree at Macquarie University in indigenous astronomy, and published an article on the cultural astronomy of the Kamilaroi and Euahlayi peoples in New South Wales. Robert has recently completed his PhD on the cultural astronomy and songlines of the saltwater Aboriginal peoples of the Australian East Coast.

Robert will be presenting an analysis of a significant Aboriginal songline in south-eastern Australia that has not been previously recorded. As part of a larger project examining the astronomy and songline connections of the Saltwater Aboriginal people of the New South Wales coast, the Black Duck Songline was identified that may have links to the Pleiades star cluster.

The Pleiades, known by many Aboriginal peoples as the Seven Sisters, is one of the most important elements of Aboriginal cosmologies across Australia, and features in songlines and oral traditions, as well as being a resource calendar identifier.

Aboriginal songlines are a unique development of Aboriginal culture that celebrate the travels and feats of the Creator Ancestors as they created the very landscape. Songlines serve as routes of travel for trade and resources and are renewed through ceremony.

The identification of the Black Duck Songline and its possible connection to the Pleiades, is an example of the potential reawakening of other longdistance songlines in Australia and their connection to the cosmology of their communities.

We will meet at the Chapel at 12.00pm for lunch at 12.30pm.

Robert will commence his talk at the Wesleyan Chapel, 6445 Wisemans Ferry Road, Gunderman after lunch.





LOCAL UNION CHURCH EXPECTED TO BE LISTED AS A WAR MEMORIAL

A representative from the Central Coast Council of RSL Sub-Branches has submitted an application to have the Mangrove Mountain Union Church listed as a war memorial.

Before the Mangrove Mountain RSL/Mangrove Mountain Memorial Club were built the Mangrove Mountain Union Church was a focal point for remembering and commerating those locals who fought in the wars and those who lost their lives.

In the book "Every Mothers Son" by Michael Rooksberry the importance of the church is made clear:

"A special service was held at the church on Sunday morning, October 17, 1920 to unveil a memorial tablet commemorating the names of the men from Mangrove Mountain who were lost in World War 1.

The October 14, 1920 issue of The Gosford Times carried the following description of the ceremony...On Sunday last the Special Service in connection with the unveiling of a Memorial Tablet commemorating the names of the men from Mangrove Mountain who made the great sacrifice whilst on active service in the Great War, 1914-18, was held and was very largely attended by the residents of

the district. A pleasing feature of the event was the large attendance of exmembers of the A.I.F. Mr John M. McDonald, of the Presbyterian Church of New South Wales, officiated and performed the ceremony of unveiling and dedicating the tablet. The service throughout was most impressive and will be remembered by all those who were present. Mr George T. Hunt ably presided at the organ.

Today there are two superb honour rolls on display on the north wall of the church. Both are done by hand, including the artwork, and are mounted in simple wooden frames. They each have the same ROLL OF HONOUR across the top with Mangrove Mtn. just beneath. This is followed by two columns of names.



Make mobile calls without a mobile service? YES

Many residents of the district are frustrated by the lack of a mobile service, because they are out of range of a mobile tower, or their nearest tower is unreliable or not functioning because of a power outage. But it is possible to make mobile calls without a mobile service, if you have an internet connection.

I have had ongoing service issues with my landline for more than thirty years and had to give up dreaming about a mobile service, to replace the landline, years ago because I live in a reasonably remote area out of range of

any planned towers.

Then last year came a revelation. During a visit from my family I noticed that my son in law was making a receiving calls on his mobile. On checking I discovered that he was using my internet service and the 'Wi-Fi calling' function on his phone to make the mobile calls! Except for times when lightning strikes my satellite dish I have a reliable NBN satellite internet service. Having access to this technology has been transformative.

Instead of relying on the mobile phone network, WiFi calling and texting use any available WiFi network to place a call or send a TXT over the Internet.

WiFi calling is regular calling on your mobile, except your phone carrier routes the call over an available WiFi network instead of its mobile network. When you call, your phone automatically selects the best network - mobile or WiFi - you don't need to do anything. On top of that WiFi calling doesn't cost anything extra. Your phone service provider will treat your WiFi calls as though you were making regular mobile calls.

Why hasn't this solution been discussed in the comprehensive investigations made locally? It may be that people are concerned about the reliability of their internet service, don't have a mobile plan that includes Wi-Fi calling or or see the few other requirements as an impediment.

To use Wi-Fi calling, you need to:

- Have a Wi-Fi calling compatible smartphone or tablet. This includes:
 - o Apple iPhone 6 onwards, Apple Watch 3 onwards
 - Samsung Galaxy devices, S7 onwards, Note 5 onwards
 - Google Pixel 2 devices onwards o LG devices G6 onwards
- Have a mobile service provider who offers Wi-Fi calling. It is important to check that this is available from your provider, or change if it is not. To turn on Wi-Fi calling? For iPhone:
- 1. Go to Settings
- Select Mobile 2.
- Turn on Wi-Fi calling For Android devices:
- Go to your phone's calling app
- Select More or the three dots in the top right corner
 - Select Settings 3.
 - Turn on Wi-Fi Calling

Using Wi-Fi calling in a 'zero or irregular' mobile service area is incredibly simple, convenient and cheap. Superseded new mobile phones with the function are, online, about 30% of the price of new phones!! Refurbished more current phones are also cheap. If you don't have a mobile plan that includes Wi-Fi calling you can buy an unlimited annual contract for \$200 for unlimited local and 20 other countries.

5 Lands Walk postponed

Due to the Public Health order issued on 23 June, the 5 Lands Walk, scheduled to proceed on Saturday 26th June, will be postponed to a date in the very near future.

The 5 Lands Walk President Pauline Wright says "While we are confident that we can comply with the newly announced COVID-19 restrictions with some modifications, we are concerned about the possibility that an asymptomatic person could unknowingly come to the event.

"If we go ahead now the 5 Lands Walk will be restricted but if we proceed later it will be a celebration. The 5 Lands Walks mantra is 'connecting people to people and people to place' and we aim to exclude no-one. Wearing masks and the other restrictions mean that many people will be unable to participate in the celebrations. We don't want to risk the health of or community by gathering people together right now. We would like to minimise the risk to our community and see everyone come together later, when our community can connect with each other with reduced fear and enhanced sense of belonging.




