SOMERSBY RURAL FIRE BRIGADE PILE BURNING

FOR RESIDENTS AND FAMILIES IN THE SOMERSBY & SURROUNDING AREAS **Pile Burning**

- > Burning of cut & stacked vegetation is referred to as a pile burn
- > Pile burns can be a useful method for reducing bush fire fuels, bush regeneration, property maintenance & agricultural activities.



BEFORE YOU LIGHT THAT FIRE:

There are four simple steps; STEP 1 Seek environmental approval (if required) STEP 2 Obtain a Fire Permit (if required)

STEP 3 Provide notifications STEP 4 Check if it's a Total Fire Ban Day

Key things you'll need to consider prior to lighting the pile burn:

- > Pile size may be up to 2 m in diameter & a maximum height of 1.5 m
- > Vegetation must be of a diameter of 150 mm or less
- > Dry & dead vegetation generated on the premises only
- The burning of non-vegetative waste is not permitted. Building materials (treated pine, gyprock, asbestos) plastics, furniture & tyres are prohibited
- > Notify the NSW RFS & adjoining neighbours 24 hours prior.
- > The statutory Bush Fire Danger Period runs from 1 October to 31 March, however it may vary due to local conditions. If you are planning to light a fire in the open during this time, you will need a Fire Permit.



Right & Wrong of Pile Burns



WRONG: Pile burns are not bonfires. They don't need to be high. This pile will be too hot. Pile burns must be constructed from natural vegetation only, not household or building rubbish.



RIGHT: Make the pile wide and long rather than high. This will spread the heat and be safer. One pile of vegetation may be burnt at any one time.



WRONG: Don't pile vegetation around the base of trees or directly under low canopy.



RIGHT: Try to choose a space with open canopy away from the base of trees. All combustible material within 4.5m of the fire must be removed



From tomorrow it is expected that 'the food, goods or services are obtained locally, unless the food, goods or services or equivalent food, goods or services are not reasonably available locally'.

Locally is defined as within the local government area where the person resides or no further than 10 kilometers from the persons place of residence if within another local government area.

I am aware that this is likely to cause concern for those residing in the Macdonald Valley within the Hawkesbury LGA and would generally shop at Wisemans Ferry or Glenorie (Hornsby and The Hills LGA). Given that goods and services are not 'reasonably available' to those residents locally, it is permissible for those residents to travel more than 10 kilometers from their place of residence to obtain food or other goods and services.

I.E - Persons from the Macdonald Valley may travel to Glenorie to do their shopping rather than Windsor if so preferred.

It should be noted that the public health order stipulates that it must only be essential goods and services for the household.

Discretion can be utilised by Police in the enforcement of this particular aspect of this order however if you are found to be a significant distance from your home and using shopping as an excuse, that it is unlikely to be seen favorably.

EXPLORING THE GOSFORD GLYPHS AND ABORIGINAL ENGRAVINGS

The Dharug and Lower Hawkesbury Historical Society invite you to join us as Robert Pankhurst takes us on another fascinating exploration of several significant aboriginal rock engravings sites in the Brisbane Waters National Park. Robert will take us to areas to see an array of unusual engravings including a man with four boomerangs and a rare drawing of a dolphin. Robert will also take us to see the 'Gosford Gylphs' - there's over 300 of them! No one knows who made them or when. Some suspect they were carved in the 1970's, but their true origin remains a mystery.

Robert has spent over 60 years exploring areas around the Hawkesbury and the southern Central Coast, including Brisbane Waters looking for Aboriginal rock carvings, foreshore middens and sites that contain ancient indigenous engravings. The flat exposed areas of Hawkesbury sandstone within the park provides an ideal 'canvas' for Aboriginal artists, and there are hundreds of rock engraving sites throughout the park. Aboriginal sites on Hawkesbury sandstone have a

distinctive style of engraving which is unique in Australia.

Location:- To meet at the end of Bambara Road just off Woy Woy Road, Kariong as there is a large parking area. We will have a quick morning tea and then car pool to a smaller car park at the top of Bambara Road near the Kariong Fire Station before we head off on our walk.


A PASSION FOR **GARDENS AND COMMUNITY**

It is with much sadness and a feeling of great loss to those in the gardening community that we convey the news of the passing on Friday 9 July 2021 of Dr. Stephen Goodwin.

The Kulnura & District Garden Club were extremely fortunate to have Stephen, who had a PhD in Entomology as a member since September 2009. Stephen served on the Committee in many roles including Vice President, Flower Competition Convener, and organiser of our programme each year - not an easy job as most meetings are visits to rural properties and in obtaining the services of a Guest Speaker.

Stephen was also an active member of the Matcham Rare Plant Garden Club and was widely known as a knowledgeable and passionate gardener. In 2020 he was awarded the Ann Clark Medallion by Garden Clubs of Australia.

His passion for gardens and community meant he offered his assistance in many ways such as fund raising for the local Mangrove Mountain Community and bringing environmental issues to the attention



of the community, local council and to court. Stephen was also a foundation committee member of the Kariong Plant Lovers Fair which is now run each spring. Stephen along with his wife Marilyn had lived on their beautiful property at Mangrove Mountain since 1998 until the progression of his illness forced them to downsize to the Southern Highlands in September 2020.

CENTRAL COAST COVID-19 EXPOSURE SITES

A Central Coast resident, who was identified as a household contact of four previously announced Central Coast cases has been diagnosed with COVID-19.

A long list of exposure sites have been identified in San Remo, Tuggerah, Lake Haven, Charmhaven and Northlakes.

Testing clinics on the Central Coast in response to these exposure sites are extending their operating hours.

Liesl Tesch MP, Member for Gosford is thanking the community for going out and getting tested.

"I have heard the Central Coast community are all getting tested and staying on top of COVID-19 to ensure themselves and their family are safe."

"I want to applaud those who have been to get tested, not just over the recent days, but since this lockdown began."

The community spirit on the Central Coast is second to none and without the efforts of all of us we could be in a very different situation."

"We have done an incredible job keeping COVID off the Coast and if we continue to be diligent, get tested if we have been to any exposure sites, or if we have even the slightest of symptoms and keep adhering to the health advice we will combat this again."

As these COVID cases arose on the Central Coast over the weekend, the "Freedom Protest" in Sydney was taking place.

The protest saw thousands of people in NSW march against the lockdown, not practicing social distancing and many also not wearing masks.

Ms Tesch says the events on the weekend were reprehensible.

"What happened on the weekend is beyond upsetting to us all and I feel your pain and deflations at what took place, especially when the majority of us have been following these restrictions and doing the right thing."

"If you know anyone who attended the event contact Crime Stoppers to ensure they are held to account for their appalling actions and so they do not potentially spread the virus in our community."



CONSTITUTIONAL REFERENDUM POSTPONED

A Constitutional Referendum to determine the future number of Central Coast Councillors that was scheduled to be held on 4 September 2021 has been postponed to a future date to be determined.

The Minister for Local Government has published an order in the Gazette under section 318C of the Local Government Act 1993 (the Act) postponing all council elections to 4 December 2021.

The decision to postpone all council elections has been made in response to the escalating outbreak of the Delta variant of the COVID-19 virus in Greater Sydney and the potential for further outbreaks in regional areas.

Based on this advice, these risks have been considered and the Central Coast Council constitutional referendum will be postponed to a future date.

A report recommending a new date and the future conduct of the constitutional referendum will come back to Council.



COUNCIL **REVIEWS** WATER AND **SEWER OPERATIONS MODEL**

Central Coast Council commissioned an independent review of the model governing its water and sewer operations.

Council CEO, David Farmer said the review was Council undertaking due diligence in the ordinary course of its business to explore if there were opportunities to produce better value and return on investment for the Central Coast community.

"Central Coast Council is unique in New South Wales in being the only Council owned water authority alongside the State owned Sydney Water and Hunter Water. This means there is a complex legislative environment requiring Council to adhere to dual regulations across both the Local Government and Water Management Acts," Mr Farmer said.

and performance in how water and sewer services are delivered.

"This review is about gathering and assessing all the data to get an informed view of all the possible operating structures. No decision has been made about a future model and whilst there is no intention to sell the water and sewer assets, this will be one of the options in the comparison of operating structures.

"The scope of the review includes investigating alternative governance models including commercialisation within Council, corporatisation, joint venture or selling the assets. These will all be compared against the status quo. The sale has been identified as a "non-preferred option" but has been included for completeness.

"I can assure the community that there will be no impact to the delivery of water and sewer services during this review."

Council Administrator, Rik Hart said he supported the review but remained adamant he was not in favour of any water and sewer asset sell-off.

"Council's water and sewer assets generate significant revenue and once profitable, ratepayers should benefit on an ongoing basis. There is no plan to sell this business," Mr Hart said.

The review will continue for the next few months with a report to Council with any recommendations. Staff and unions have been informed about the process.
