

Somersby RFB: We plan to hold a Get Ready Weekend on Saturday, September 11. We will be situated at Somersby Public School from 9.30am to 2pm. All this, of course, depends on our present lockdown. At this stage we haven't planned an online GRW

Bucketty & District RFB: We had planned a day of community engagement for September 11 which involved hiring skips at the Station for a big community cleanup by interested residents from Fernances Crossing, Murrays Run and Bucketty - mixed in with a smorgasbord of Fire Preparedness activities and fact-sheets and social distanced chats over coffee

- but with COVID-19 meant we had to cancel all that and our (masked) face to face plans.

Nevertheless we will continue to seek to connect our residents with their brigade around the key topics of fire safety and property preparedness as we head into Fire Season 2021-22.

Don't be fooled by the somewhat "nice" weather. It is very dry. There is a heavy fuel load underfoot from all the rain at the beginning of the year, and the horrible fires of 2019/20 have not given us any immunity from a burning bush. Indeed, there have been 4 local fires in the past week - 3 escaped pile burns and 1 house fire.

So our Brigade members - using a mix of social media, letterbox drops, articles in local newsletters, and organising one on one phone consultations for interested residents on Get Ready Day itself to ensure all are prepared.

Preparing a Rural Property

There are 5 actions you can take to prepare a rural property or farm for bush fires:

- 1. Clear/slash flammable materials around structures like homes or sheds
- 2. If the conditions are right and you have the permits, approvals and skill, conduct a controlled burn.
- 3. Plough firebreaks around paddock boundaries to prevent the spread of fire.



A message from our new Chair

I am honoured to take on the role of Chairperson of the Community Environment Network for the next 12 months.

There are multiple challenges to our environment both locally and globally.

You only have to look at the Central Coast Council's Operational Budget for 2021-22 to illustrate the threat to our environment and the lack of consideration for our environment.

With the Council's current financial crisis, one has to wonder why the staff recommended to the Administrator that \$8.1 million or 4.6 per cent of the capital works budget is allocated to new 'Footpaths'. One has to question why 'Footpaths' are so prominent as new projects across Council when services are being cut.

When you take a deeper look into the capital works budget the allocation to new footpaths becomes even more questionable when you examine the new green budget projects. In the capital works budget \$7.8 million or 4.4% is allocated to green projects.

Initially this looks impressive until you realise that \$6.9 million is the construction of a waste cell at Buttonderry Waste Management Facility with only \$50,000 or 0.02% of the capital works budget allocated to a saltmarsh swale.

Within the green budget no new projects are allocated to address climate change or undertake responsible land management within the Coastal Open Space System (COSS).

Although there are multiple challenges facing our environment I admire and respect the dedication of CEN staff and the many volunteers



who all work towards protecting our local environment.



Livestock **Poisonings Prompt Warning**

LIVESTOCK producers in the Central Coast are being warned to watch for signs of plant toxicity in their animals following several fatal poisonings in the region.

Greater Sydney Local Land Services District Veterinarian Dr Aziz Chowdhury said he had responded to calls for assistance a local producer after a young heifer suddenly died.

"Investigations revealed the cause of death to be heart failure caused by the consumption of the plant Mother-ofmillions (Bryophyllum spp)," he said.

"Ingestion of the toxins can be cumulative and livestock eating small amounts, several times within a few days can suffer poisoning. Eating about 5 kg of mother of millions will kill an adult cow.

"Eating a large amount, as we saw in this case, can cause death instantly."

Dr Chowdhury said livestock needed to be treated within 24 hours of consuming the plant.

"Look out for signs such as diarrhoea, usually with blood in the faeces, heart arrythmia, difficult breathing, or if they suffer a collapse. Horses can also show signs of abdominal pain (colic)," he said.

"If you notice any of these signs, you should seek veterinary assistance immediately."

Dr Chowdhury said poisoning commonly occurred between May and October when the plants are in flower.

"Mothers of million plants are frequently seen in the Greater Sydney region growing in lighter soils along roadsides resulting from dumped garden waste. They are also commonly seen as 'escapees' from abandoned gardens on rural properties.

"Cases of toxicity occur in all year

around, mainly over winter and are most often seen in introduced cattle or those unfamiliar with these plants."

A lack of adequate food supply can also be an issue.

"Pastures that have been overgrazed or overstocked can predispose livestock to eating anything they can. Producers should evaluate their pastures to determine if adequate forage exists before introduce livestock on to the paddock," he said.

As we look forward with the end of the lockdown not known, we plan to further develop our zoom sessions to include outdoor household exercise activities with the focus of advancing on badge rewards.



MARKET IN REVIEW

A move to the country has become even more appealing during the pandemic as some Australian cities endure repeated lockdowns and workers adapt to the new work-fromhome (or anywhere) lifestyle. The exodus of city dwellers to regional areas during the COVID-driven lifestyle shift has continued, with new Australian Bureau of Statistics data showing 11,800 people moved out of Australia's capital cities in the March quarter – the largest net loss on record.

Historic low interest rates and a rise in demand for regional over the past year has caused house prices to skyrocket, with 58 regional suburbs joining the million-dollar club in the 12 months to June 2021, taking the total number of multimillion-dollar regional suburbs to 110, according to new analysis from realestate.com.au.

Looking across the states, there are now 58 multimillion-dollar regional suburbs in NSW, 42 in Queensland, nine in Victoria and one in Western Australia. Suburbs had to have at least 10 sales in the 12 months to June 2021 and in the previous year to be included in the data.

Economist at realestate.com.au Anne Flaherty said the number of new million-dollar regional suburbs is extraordinary. "Traditionally we

think of regional areas as being more affordable, but this growing demand for regional lifestyle suburbs is just pushing up property prices in these areas," Ms Flaherty said.

"A lot of the demand has come from people moving away from cities, chasing that lifestyle driven in some ways by COVID. But Ms Flaherty said regional price growth could start to wane once Australia reaches the other side of the pandemic. "It'll be interesting to see if we start to see more people return to cities she said.

"It's possible these suburbs could below million-dollar drop back medians depending on the area. A lot of regional suburbs are actually more volatile than suburbs closer to cities, so they're more affected by swings in demand.

"I wouldn't expect the demand to change too much over the short term, but over the long term we might start to see a shift in preferences for where people want to live, which could impact those regional areas."

The COVID-led lifestyle shift as seen regional property prices rise exponentially over the past year, and the trend is likely to continue in the months ahead. "I think we'll definitely see more regional suburbs join the million-dollar club because property prices haven't finished rising, and the level of price growth in regional Australia has been outperforming the greater capital city areas of Australia," she said. "There's still a lot of momentum [in regional Australia] so there are a lot of suburbs that are going to tip over that million-dollar mark over the coming months."


