MMUC FAQS

Over recent weeks there has been much comment, speculation and at times misinformation circulated about the sale of the Mangrove Mountain Union Church property. To set the record straight, the answers to some of the frequently asked questions are below.

Why take the drastic step of selling the Church?

The decision to sell the Church was not made lightly. The committee members had all been actively involved in and loyal to the Church for many years, and it was with sadness and regret that the decision to sell was made. Ultimately, with little community support, little interest in the Church as a worship centre for some years, no potential for meaningful income in the foreseeable future and the appointment of new members to the committee not possible under the Constitution (see below), the sale became the only viable option.

Why insist on selling the Church when there are so many people putting their hands up to keep it running?

The Constitution of the Mangrove Mountain Union Church Inc specifies the criteria for membership of the MMUC Inc. To qualify for membership, a person must be a representative of a group that has been conducting services in the Church building on a regular basis (being more than twice per month for more than 2 months or once a month for more than 3 months, per year) for at least one year. There had been no applications for membership of the MMUC Inc in the previous 2 years and indeed no one who fulfilled the membership criteria. Unfortunately, the recent interest and support of the community has come too late to be of any practical or meaningful use.

Why can't the Constitution simply be changed to enable new members to join and take over management of the Church?

At the relevant times, there was simply no group to approach to enquire whether it would take over the management of the Church. A change in the Constitution could only have taken place prior to the appointment of the liquidator, and for the above reason this was simply not feasible.

Why was a liquidator appointed when the Church isn't actually insolvent?

The committee members had an obligation to ensure MMUC Inc remained solvent. With the Church having minimal use and patronage for some 5 years, there was little income generated yet the running costs (maintenance, insurance, pastoral fees and the like) remained at least the same. The committee members were largely funding Church expenses out of their own pockets. With consistently low attendance, there was no potential for the income to increase in the near future, so while the Church was not at the time insolvent it was heading that way, and were it not for the personal contributions of the committee members, the MMUC Inc. may well have become insolvent some time ago.

I heard that the Special Resolution to appoint the liquidator wasn't even validly passed?

The committee members sought legal advice before appointing the liquidator. The resolution to appoint the liquidator was valid because it was passed by three-quarters of the members, in accordance with the MMUC Inc. Constitution.

Where does the Constitution say that the members can sell the Church?

The Constitution provides at Part 1(3) (a) that the MMUC Inc can "manage, repair, let, improve, sell, mortgage or otherwise deal with control of the land, the building and the hall."

What will happen to the proceeds of the sale?

The amount that remains after satisfaction of all debts and liabilities (including sale costs and liquidator's fees) shall be transferred to another Christian organisation with similar charitable and educational purposes, which is not carried on for the profit or gain of its individual members. This is provided by clause 45 of the Constitution.

Past MMUC Committee

Mangrove Emergency Planning & Communications Committee Inc.

The MEPCC was established following the 1994 bush fires and based on recommendations made to the Royal Commission that followed.

Two actions carried out by the MEPCC were the installation of a radio based emergency communications network and the establishment of a telephone tree system as the most simple and efficient means of quickly reaching the residents in our area.

However over time the radio equipment has become outdated and fallen into disrepair ant the telephone tree suffer from a major weakness in that during disasters the landline and mobile phone systems regularly fail.

It is proposed to apply for funding under the Black Summer Bushfire Recovery Grants scheme to establish a new UHF CB network to cover an area that includes Gunderman, Spencer, Mangrove Mountain, Kulnura, Somersby, Mt White, Ravensdale, Yarramalong, Wyong Creek, Dooralong, Jilliby and other areas nearby.

COUNCIL PLANS MORE PRICE INCREASES

Central Coast Council has endorsed the process for the preparation of the draft pricing proposal to the Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal (IPART) for its water, sewerage and stormwater drainage prices from 1 July 2022.

IPART sets the maximum prices for Council's water, sewerage and stormwater drainage services. Council's pricing proposal has been developed and is now ready to submit to IPART for their review.

Administrator Rik Hart said that Council's current water, sewer and stormwater rates, which were significantly reduced by IPART in its 2019 determination, are not financially sustainable.

"I want to be upfront with the community about our pricing proposal. As it stands, the current pricing levels will see ratepayers having to subsidise the operations of the water, sewer and stormwater drainage businesses. But even worse, there will be insufficient funds to invest in maintenance and upgrades to ensure the community can be provided with a safe, clean and reliable water supply as well as an effective sewer and drainage system that does not harm the environment," Mr Hart said.

"We are proposing to IPART that we increase our revenue for our water, sewer and stormwater services. We're suggesting we return our prices for these services similar to 2018-19 levels, with an allowance for subsequent inflation.

"By doing this, we can be prudent and efficient with our expenditure, and still deliver the needs that the community outlined during the consultation program we ran earlier this year.

"IPART will fully test our proposal and may make changes to what we have submitted."

Mr Hart added that Council is continuing to move forward in its financial recovery and also driving productivity gains.

"Over the relatively short period of the last six months, Council has significantly reduced its expenditure across the entire organisation in both materials and contracts and staffing numbers and their associated costs. There has been close to a 25% reduction in Council's gross weekly payroll due to the significant restructure of the organisation and particularly the reduction in the management staffing levels by around 35%.

"This has not resulted in the 25% reduction of services delivered to the

community.

"This is a straight productivity gain and the community are the ones who benefit from this," Mr Hart said.

Below is an outline of the timeline to follow for Council's pricing proposal:

September 2021: Council submits their pricing proposal.

September/October 2021: IPART will review the pricing proposal and make it public on their website. They will undertake a public consultation process, giving the community an opportunity to provide feedback – which is encouraged by Council.


October/November 2021: IPART will hold a public hearing with locations and times advertised in local newspapers, on IPART's website and via Council's communication channels.

March/April 2022: IPART will release a draft report and determination detailing proposed prices. The community has a further opportunity to respond to the draft reports by making submissions to IPART.

May 2022: Following consideration of submissions, IPART will release their final report and determination on prices that will come into effect on 1 July 2022.

Council will inform the community once the pricing proposal is made public on IPART's website in the coming weeks.

Union Church Update 10th September 2021

The campaign to "Save the Mangrove Mountain Union Church" continues. We are working towards:-

- Preventing the sale of the Mangrove Mountain Union Church (MMUC).

- Stopping the winding-up of the MMUC Association by the Liquidator.

- Returning the MMUC Association to management by, and for the benefit of, our local community.

- Widening MMUC Association membership, thereby enabling more community involvement.

We have now covered our initial account for legal services up to and including lodgement of the Caveat over the Union Church land title. We are very grateful for the generous responses to our first financial appeal in order that this account could be settled. Our appreciation is also extended to those who have written/ emailed to the Liquidator requesting that he renounce his appointment.

Our plan from here on is to seek advice on the Briefing and Engagement of a Barrister. Our Solicitor has advised that the terms of the original Trust Deed for the Union Church do not support the sale of the property. However, an action in the NSW Supreme Court maybe required to assert this position and will involve further significant expense.

We are now canvassing fundraising opportunities, but they are limited in the current Covid-19 lock-down environment. Continuing financial support for the "Save the Mangrove Mountain Church" campaign will be critical for the Church to remain a living and useful part of our community.

What can you do to help us?

You could also say that there is strong community support and financial backing for the Church to continue operating and therefore you do not understand why the former committee chose to wind the Church up. We are also preparing for our 100 year celebrations next year. The Country Women's Association (CWA) of New South Wales was formed at a time when it was seen that there was a need to improve the conditions of women and children on the land. There were very few amenities in the country areas and there was a desperate need for baby health services, maternity hospitals and ambulance services. Most country roads were unsealed and after rain, road travel was often impossible.

A Bush Women's Conference was held in Sydney during the Royal Easter Show in 1922 and the CWA of NSW was born. The first branch was formed at Crookwell in the Southern Tablelands and membership spread to the North West Slopes and Plains then on to other places in the State.

The first project was for a Seaside Home to which women and children could escape from the summer heat of the inland and Keera House was opened at Dee Why in 1924. While families were there, they also took advantage of the availability of medical facilities such as doctors and dentists.

CWA of NSW was instrumental in establishing Baby Health Centres all over the State and the first of these was established in Moree in 1925. The first maternity hospital set up by members of the Association was opened in Hillston. It was a three bed ward and during the 10 years

that it operated in the name of the Association 700 babies were born. Other hospitals soon followed this one and were eventually taken over by NSW State health authorities.

The first CWA Branch on Mangrove Mountain was formed in 1932 and run until 1975. Researching the history of this branch has been very interesting, as we look at many of the events on the mountain that CWA has been involved in. When the branch was formed in 1932 the members were fund raising to help support the Baby Health Clinic that was opened the same year in the Gosford rooms at Gosford station in Mann St. The baby health nurse was funded by the government, but, all other costs were raised by the CWA branches surrounding the area. Woy Woy rooms also became a Baby Health Clinic and also Terrigal rooms.

Drug Lab Raided at Kulnura

NSW Police Strike Force Garlow raided a property off Kyola Rd, Kulnura on Sept 8th and found \$3 million worth of methylamphetamine in a drug lab.

Two men were arrested for allegedly making the drug ice and dealing in the proceeds of crime.

Police also seized chemicals and equipment used in drug manufacturing as well as bullet proof vests and tasers.

Police said that this drug lab could have ben operating for many months, perhaps years.







MARKET IN REVIEW

The latest REA Insights Housing

Market Indicators Report showed demand, based on the number of views per listing of properties for sale on realestate.com.au, hit an all-time high in August, ahead of a delayed spring selling season in locked-down markets.

Aviation firefighting simulator given real life tick of approval

Nine aviation personnel from across the country have enhanced their capabilities and skills using the new aviation simulator located at the NSW RFS Training Academy in Dubbo.

The new simulator, which was announced in April, helps to expand NSW's specialist aviation personnel capacity and assist with addressing recommendation 10 from the NSW Bushfire Inquiry. The simulator provides the NSW RFS with the ability to safely train and develop skills in the field of aerial firefighting.

The NSW RFS is also building an Aviation Centre of Excellence at the Academy, which will further enhance their aviation training capabilities.

Personnel completed an Air Attack Supervisor (AAS) course at the Academy in June, where participants were required to undergo two sessions using the aviation simulator, with a further 16 trainees completing an Air Base Manager course at the same time.

Minister for Police and Emergency Services David Elliott said the AAS course allowed participants to undertake basic firefighting air attack missions in a mock aircraft, enabling them to direct aircraft and practice communication skills.

"Highly trained NSW RFS aviation specialist instructors have been gearing up over the last few months to become proficient in the use of this simulator and as we've now seen, ready to train NSW emergency services personnel," Mr Elliott said.

"The devastating 201920 season saw aerial firefighting assets play a vital role in supporting our firefighters on the ground, and courses like this make sure NSW is as prepared as possible for this and fire seasons to come."

Further aviation focused programs and forums will be held at the NSW RFS Training Academy this year, with Air Base Operation and Aviation Communication programs to be held in other regions.

"The NSW Government remains committed to ensuring our hard working firefighters and support crew have the resources they need to keep our communities safe and work continues with Dubbo Regional Council to have the Aviation Centre of Excellence built and open in 2022," Mr Elliott said.


