BUSH FIRE DANGER PERIOD IN PLACE FOR MOST OF NSW

- No fires without a permit (except cooking fires)
- Notify local fire authority and neighbours 24 hours before lighting up
- Recent wet weather continues to build on grass fire concerns.

NSW Commissioner Rob Rogers said the majority of state will be in the Bush Fire Danger Period from Friday 1 October 2021 with only a handful in southern NSW starting on the first of next month.

"With the Bureau of Meteorology continuing to forecast wetter than average conditions through spring we are expecting to see strong grass and crop growth particularly in areas west of the divide. Commissioner Rogers said.

"As we enter the warmer months this will begin dry out and may prove problematic for both landholders and firefighters.

"Grass fires typically move three times quicker than bush fires and can impact on lives and livelihoods with little to no warning.

"It is important that we all understand our level of risk and prepare accordingly.

"Now is the time to review you plans, prepare your properties and have the conversation with your family about what you will do during a fire – talk about when you'll leave, where you'll go, what you'll take and what you'll do with animals."

Theremaining nine local government areas will commence their Bush Fire Danger Period on 1 November.

"Anyone wishing to light a fire during the Bush Fire Danger Period must obtain a free permit in addition to notifying their local fire authority and neighbours 24 hours before lighting up," Commissioner Rogers said.

"While hazard reductions are an important part of preparations, landholders need to be extremely careful, as escaped burns can lead to heavy penalties.

"If a fire does escape, make sure you

call Triple Zero (000) immediately so that emergency services can respond and minimise the damage."

Administrator Plans To Extend Duration of Increased Rates Despite Council Surplus

Council's operating surplus (excluding capital revenue) year to date was \$11million compared to the budgeted surplus of \$2.9million.

Council Administrator, Rik Hart said "We are proposing to make an application to IPART to maintain the current level of rates for a further seven years, consistent with what we asked for from IPART earlier this year."

SERVICE LEVEL CONSULTATION TO INFORM FUTURE RATE PROPOSAL

Council Administrator, Rik Hart said the two years of heavy losses and overspending left Council having to restructure its business and budget to produce a surplus to repay the \$150million debt over the next 10 years.

"We cannot forget, loans of \$150million were provided to Council in 2020 based on Council's financial recovery plan which included sale of assets, reduction in costs of \$50million, capping infrastructure spending and a rate increase of 13 percent plus rate peg for 10 years in order to repay the loans.

"In less than three years' time we will be facing an average annual income loss of \$25.8million over the next 7 years and this means we will

be forced to reduce or cease many services.

"There has been major restructuring of Council and Council is on track to achieve the \$50million in cost savings including productivity gains. Together with the recent rate increase, Council is budgeting for a small surplus this financial year.

"Our current plan is working, and Council is on track to be able to continue to service its community. However, we face falling off an income cliff if the current level of rates is not maintained beyond June 2024. As it currently stands, if the Special Variation is not extended, in two years ratepayers will be given a 13 percent reduction in their general rate component of the Council bill and Council will need to adjust its cost structures by a further \$25.8million annually on average to cope with that reduction.

"I believe the community values the services it receives from Council, however Council cannot maintain its level of services, or increase them, and repay its debt if it suffers a large reduction of income."

"We are proposing to make an application to IPART to maintain the current level of rates for a further seven years, consistent with what we

asked for from IPART earlier this year."

Mr Hart said ultimately the community will have a major say in whether this application is successful, but they need to understand what the implications of this reduction in Council income will mean on the services that people use daily and that make the Central Coast a great place to live.

"Council will produce two long term financial plans, one showing income at the current rate structure, the second showing the loss of \$25.8million on average from year three onwards. We will undertake community consultation so the community can provide input to whether they would prefer to continue to pay the current level of rates or receive a reduction and see a dramatic fall off in services."



UNION CHURCH UPDATE 9th October 2021

News about the plight of the Mangrove Mountain Union Church has spread beyond our local community. In response to our campaign to "Save the Mangrove Mountain Union Church" we have been contacted by several former Mountain residents with pledges to assist us financially, provide legal advice, and to widely publicise this great injustice to our community.

We are awaiting the advice of our Barrister about next steps to overcome the Liquidator's refusal to cease winding up the Mangrove Mountain Union Church Association and to step back from his appointment.

In the meantime, the local congregation, the Mangrove Mountain Christian Group (MMCG), is planning the recommencement of Christian Services in the grounds of the Union Church following the relaxation of Covid-19 restrictions. The first return service will be on Sunday 24th October at 9.00am. Subsequent services will be on the 2nd, 4th and 5th Sundays of each month.

The MMCG is exploring local interest in a weekday evening meeting to explore Christian Faith. The MMCG is also looking into a Children's Church. We are as yet unable to advise a date that the meeting hall will be available for use by community groups. However, we invite expressions of

interest from groups who might wish to use the Church buildings once they are returned to our community and reopened.

HENDRA VARIANT CASE CONFIRMED NEAR NEWCASTI F

A variant Hendra virus strain has been confirmed in a 7-year-old unvaccinated Clydesdale from West Wallsend, near Newcastle.

The detection of the virus was confirmed through testing at NSW Department of Primary Industries' (DPI) Elizabeth Macarthur Agricultural Institute laboratory and at the Australian Centre for Disease Preparedness.

DPI has routinely tested all Hendra submissions over the past 6 months for the variant Hendra strain following a retrospective detection by researchers in a Queensland horse.

A private vet attended the affected horse in response to a report that the animal was showing neurological signs, collected samples for testing and notified DPI. The affected horse was euthanised

No other horses on the property are showing any signs of ill health.

A District Veterinarian from Hunter Local Land Services has issued an Individual Biosecurity Direction to control the movement of animals and people on and off the property for 21 days.

Public health officers from Hunter region are undertaking risk assessments of any people who have had contact with the infected horse.

Most Hendra cases in NSW have been on the north coast, with a case at Scone in 2019 being the most southern case. Vaccination of horses is the most effective way to help manage Hendra virus disease.

There have been 24 horse deaths in NSW as a result of Hendra virus on 23 properties since the first case in 2006. There have been no human deaths from Hendra virus in NSW.

Hendra virus infection is notifiable in NSW under the NSW Biosecurity Act.

Signs of infection are non-specific in the early stages and anyone who is concerned about possible Hendra infection should isolate the horse and seek veterinary advice.

The group manages eight hectares of bushland and endangered hanging swamp on land owned by the Girl Guides Association which is used by the local community.

The group had completed an accredited Upper Popran creek Catchment Rivercare Plan, involved 15 neighbouring private properties in works on their properties, established 500 metre weed free stretch of creekline, replanted thousands of native speies to provide a seedbank into the future.



LENDING RULES TIGHTEN

Stuart Marsh @nine.com.au has just published this update.

Australia's banking watchdog has tightened the rules on home loan lending to stop banks from offering mortgages to property buyers who may be unable to afford them if interest rates rise. The Australian Prudential Regulation Authority (APRA) has

increased the minimum interest rate buffer it expects banks to use when assessing a person's "serviceability" from 2.5 per cent to 3.0 per cent above the loan product rate.

In simple terms, this means banks and lenders must not provide a home loan to a person until they are satisfied they would still be able to afford the repayments on a rate that is 3.0 per cent higher than the current product's rate. APRA Chair Wayne Byres said the move to tighten lending will prevent banks from lending to borrowers who are taking on too much risk, particularly as the housing market takes off on the back of historically low interest rates. "In taking action, APRA is focused on ensuring the financial system remains safe, and that banks are lending to borrowers who can afford the level of debt they are taking on – both today and into the future," Mr Byres said.

Mr Byres said regulating the minimum buffer rate comes as new home loans that far exceed a borrower's income explode in popularity. "More than one in five new loans approved in the June quarter were at more than six times the borrowers' income, and at an aggregate level the expectation is that housing credit growth will run ahead of household income growth in the period ahead," Mr Byres said. "With the economy expected to bounce back as lockdowns begin to be lifted around the country, the balance of risks is such that stronger serviceability standards are warranted."
