# **Union Church Update**

### **26th November 2021**

Earlier this evening we held a Public Information Meeting at the Mangrove Mountain Community Hall. weather was not the best for people to venture out, but we still mustered 22 locals. Thank you all who were there, it is a great encouragement to our efforts.

We recapped on events to date, explained our strategies, and discussed fund raising ideas to support our actions to save the Union Church. Top of the list is still "hands in pockets", but there was good interest in holding a "Ball in the Hall for the Church on the Hill" early in 2022. A "Go Fund Me" campaign was suggested, but we lack the expertise for this (is there a volunteer out there willing to help?).

Having engaged a Senior Counsel, we anticipate receiving his advice in the next week. We expect this advice to provide firm guidance for our strategies to Save the Union Church.

The Liquidator is still yet to set a date for a second meeting. He informs us that he is delayed while seeking his own legal advice as to the relevance of the Trust Deed and its terms. We are hopeful that the advice he receives

will accord with ours and that common sense will prevail.

Last Monday we started an Adult Christian Discussion Group with six bods attending. Breezy conditions, yet the sun did shine upon us towards the end. Next meeting is Monday 6th December from 5pm to 6.30pm. BYO chair and, if you want, a non-alcoholic refreshment.

Our committee is also seeking to submit to the Liquidator, requests for outdoor uses of the Union Church property that can be done within the current restrictions of Covid-19 (and the changed hall locks). Maybe Chair Pilates under the gazebo!

# Have your say on services and rates

Council is inviting ratepayers and residents to have their say about maintaining current service levels and rates in an online survey.

Council Administrator Rik Hart said Council had done everything it can behind the scenes to help Council's financial situation and now it was up to the community.

"Our financial recovery is on track, but we cannot become complacent about maintaining our long term stable financial position" Mr Hart said.

"I am proposing to make an application to the Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal (IPART) to maintain the current level of rates for a further seven years, consistent with what we asked for earlier this

This will allow us to maintain current service levels, continue to find more service efficiencies and pay back loans from surpluses that we must generate according to our agreement with banks.

"Council delivers a huge variety of services for our community including patrolling beaches; maintaining public wharves, jetties, boat ramps and ocean baths; fixing suburban traffic issues, filling potholes, repairing road shoulders and removing debris from shared pathways; maintaining town centre amenity with cleaning and security: cleaning public toilet blocks; care and maintenance of parks, reserves and roadside vegetation; environmental programs like wrack collection in Tuggerah Lakes, water quality monitoring, weed spraying, declared pest management and bush regeneration; operating the Central Coast Stadium, holiday parks and cemeteries; supporting sporting and community associations with grants; and delivering libraries, childcare centres, recreation centres, theatres, galleries, public pools; to name a few

"I encourage the community to read the information materials, keep an open mind and tell us what services you value that make the Central Coast a great place to live." Mr Hart said.



Permanent installation is not so easy though with the cable fixed at one end and a big clunky connector to get through walls etc. There is also no pole adapter but luckily I have machines and made a few adapters to suit with more on the way.

So mine is now on the roof with speeds in the recent storm of over 160mbps and on a nice day exceeding 290mbps direct and around 100 through my mesh network.

I have more pole mounts on order as well as mesh networks to distribute the WiFi signals throughout your home or business.



# Tocal Australian Stock Horse Sale continues a proud tradition

This year's Annual Tocal Australian Stock Horse Sale was held on the 6th of November 2021, and all the effort of staff and students was on show. The online sale, facilitated through Hunter Valley agents Bowe & Lidbury, saw 12 handpicked lots up for sale. The overall result exceeded the 2020 result with returns grossing over \$215,000.

The online only sale commencing at 4pm Saturday 6th November, and closing 24hrs later, the top priced horse for the day went to lot 4, "Tocal Sunset", a 3yo Gelding which hit \$38,900. The 3-year-old gelding had bids from twelve different users with a total of 340 bids. Over the 12 lots offered, the average Gelding price hit \$18,425/head, while the Mare offerings averaged \$17,300/head.

AuctionPlus reported that across the sale, the online catalogue views and active bidders were up on last year. Catalogue views for the auction increased 8% on last year's sale, falling just shy of 7,000 views, while the numbers of online bids jumped from 284 in 2020, to 1,538 in 2021. With the sharp rise in bids placed, the number of active bidders increased from 54, to 66, with a total of 1,225

logins throughout the sale. The results were a strong endorsement of Tocal's breeding and training program.

Tocal College Acting Principal Ms Julie White said "the sale keeps going from strength to strength. She paid tribute to staff members Luke Collard, Chantelle Vella and Simone Harvey who lead the horse course program and were the reason for the successful sale outcome. Many others provided specialist help during the year, most notably Lyn Walsh, Suhas Ranadive and Fiona Lawrence.

Tocal Centre Manager Robert Rein said: "this outstanding result is the culmination of over twelve months







# Call to Expand **Coastal Open Space**

The Coastal Open Space System (COSS) is a network of reserves supporting native vegetation that are managed by the Council for environmental and community values.

Spanning 2,573 hectares, primary purpose of the COSS is to maintain areas of native vegetation, habitat for native animals and a visual landscape that defines the character of the south-eastern corner of our Local Government Area.

The hills from Macmasters Ridge, Kincumber Mountain, Rumbalara Reserve, Mount Elliot and the wetland areas around Brisbane Water and Erina Creek are all owned by Council and preserve the most environmentally sensitive areas from development.

The reservation of the land in the COSS also has the effects of protecting Aboriginal cultural sites and non-Aboriginal heritage items as well as local water catchments and geological formations. The retention of native vegetation provides a green backdrop to many of the urban areas in the city and ensures that most of the residents of the former Gosford LGA live in the
