HIGHER RATES FOR 7 EXTRA YEARS

The Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal (IPART) has approved Central Coast Council's 2022 Special Variation to maintain rates at their current levels for an additional seven years, equalling ten years in total to 2031.

Council's Administrator, Rik Hart said IPART's determination supporting the continuation of Central Coast Council's current rate structure for a further seven years is a sensible decision.

There is no current plan to increase rates during the term of the special variation (increase) except for the incremental rate peg adjustments as determined by IPART every year.

The Draft Long Term Financial Plan and Delivery Program will be considered in the Ordinary Council Meeting on 24 May 2022 to be placed on Public Exhibition for public comment at yourvoiceourcoast.com.

Wollombi dodges a coal bullet

Until recently, an area between Broke and Wollombi had been included in the NSW Future of Coal Statement as one of 13 potential areas for coal exploration.

However, in a rethink, in May this year the NSW Deputy Premier Paul Toole ruled out coal mining in Wollombi and at Ganguddy-Kelgoola near Rylstone.

There had been strong opposition on many fronts, including from the Wollombi Valley Progress Association. Protests had been held in Mudgee and Bathurst, where a crowd gathered outside the office of the NSW Deputy Premier, Paul Toole.

The community of Wollar however was not so fortunate with exploration approved to the east of the village leaving it to be potentially virtually surrounded by coal mines.

The Nature Conservation Foundation states "But the government has removed that right for some communities by introducing a new process called Competitive Allocation, which sidesteps community consultation and goes straight to the issuing of exploration licences"

CFL and **LED** lights – are they safe?

Considering my passion holistic health. I felt the need to raise awareness to this topic due to my concerns about the rapid rate that LED lights in particular are replacing old style incandescent bulbs over the past few years. This topic is extensive so my aim is to raise the most important issues and include relevant links for those who would like to research further for themselves.

LED stands for 'light emitting diode'. The light emitted from these diodes has a different waveform compared to the old-style incandescent bulbs. On a waveform graph, the oldstyle bulbs produce an even wave with the traditional peak and trough pattern. But the waveform of a LED would have only the peak component sticking up from the baseline, with the trough component being nonexistent. The best way to compare this physically is to imagine the light from an old-style bulb producing a constant (but oscillating) light source whereas the light being emitted from a LED bulb is like being in a room where someone is turning the light on and off at such a rapid rate that your eyes have trouble detecting it. This phenomenon is called 'flicker'.

LED flicker has been associated with eye strain, fatigue, headaches and even elevated risks of seizures (www.waveformlighting.com/humancentric/are-led-lights-safe-are-thevharmful-to-vour-health). It is best to aim for a LED bulb with a flicker rate of less than 5% or a flicker index of less than 0.2. Unfortunately, not all products are labelled with such info. The same article I have referenced above also covers the side effects of "blue light", which is referring to the blue end of the light spectrum, as opposed to the yellow end that is used in incandescent bulbs. Blue light is emitted from many digital devices as well (ipads, tablets smartphones, laptops and PC's, except for when 'night' mode is activated) and its most known side effect is disruption to circadian sleep cycles. Blue light glasses can be helpful especially for children/teenagers in the later hours, especially when being on devices is unavoidable before bedtime, eg. studying. Another major concern is the direct damage to the retina of the eye from direct exposure to a LED light beam.

Further information on the negative impacts of LED's, as well as CFL's (compact fluoro light bulbs) can be found at https://emfacademy.com/ safest-light-bulbs which also refers to another article describing "dirty electricity", being https://emfacademy. com/dirty-electricity-filter-guide. A simple way to detect dirty electricity is to hold a portable AM radio (switched on, but not on a station) near to an electrical device, or lamp, and turn the device or lamp on and off several times. If you can hear a difference in the white noise sound on the radio, like a strong hum, it means there is a buildup of dirty electricity. The problem with dirty electricity is that it creates an increase in EMF (electromagnetic frequency) radiation within buildings which has a negative impact on the human energetic/auric field, as well as at the cellular biological level.

The best way to avoid the effects of LED's (and CFL's) is not to use them in the first place, but it seems that lighting shops and stores are only selling LED's these days. With some effort, incandescent bulbs can be located and purchased online (eg. Amazon), depending on whether they arrive intact after delivery. The next best option is to be aware of the different types of LED's, with the aim of buying ones that measure less than 350 lumens (brightness) and less than 2,000K (colour temp). See You Tube video "How to choose a healthy light bulb" on the channel called Illuminating Health, and she mentions this at after 3:00mins. (Note it's produced in the US.) Of course, if you still have incandescent bulbs in use,

don't swap them for LED's, and use any spares you may have for as long as they operate. (Unless you don't like the look of your power bill.)

My biggest concern is the culminating effect of not only the digital devices many of us are using frequently, but also the fact that the government has incentivised the installation of LED's in households during last year. (I recall they had an offer to get multiple LED's installed for a bargain price.)

These effects are especially not conducive to our optimal brain function, as these EMF's interfere with our brain wave states. Ideally, our brain waves are meant to have a calm and even waveform, but too many EMF's can create distortion which displays a messy waveform. I recommend watching the video called "Two Powerful Methods to Awaken

Heart + Brain Connection" by Gregg Braden Official on You Tube, where he shows a new brainwave state called Gamma which has been emerging and detected by scientists (timestamp: 0:48mins) which I would refer to as the "consciously aware" or "bliss" state. At 7:31mins, he shows two comparison graphs for what ideal vs. distorted brain waves look like, which result from emotional and environmental factors.

My unproven hypothesis (based solely on my knowledge learned during my QHHT related studies as well as my understanding of electromagnetism and the human body) is that LED lights can have a profound impact on the brain's function, hence the reported symptoms of headaches, eye strain, and potential seizures. I personally have a concern that the over-use of LED's can directly interfere with

the brain's ability to evolve into the Gamma state, which is a very peaceful and enjoyable state to be in for those who have ever reached it.

I hope the information I have provided here has given you some food for thought, and to help bring attention about how we can be aware of what is happening around us and ways to negate the impact and take back our power where we can to improve our health choices wherever we can. I invite you to delve into further research to learn more for yourself.



Notice of 1080 Program

The NSW National Parks and Wildlife Service (NPWS) is conducting an aerial baiting program in Brisbane Water and Popran National Parks from Sunday 22nd May 2022 to Sunday 5th June 2022.

The operation will use 1080 (sodium fluoroacetate) poison for the control of wild dogs and foxes.

The program is designed to minimise predator impacts on wildlife, especially threatened species, and to minimise impact of wild dogs on neighbouring stock.

Signs will be placed at the entry to the baiting location. Domestic pets are not permitted in NSW National Parks managed lands. Pets and working dogs may be affected (1080 is lethal to cats and dogs). Pets and working dogs must be restrained or muzzled in the vicinity and must not enter the baiting location. In the event of accidental poisoning seek immediate veterinary assistance.

Member Spotlight - Beryl Collins



This month we get to know the wonderful Beryl Collins, who lives in Kulnura. Beryl was recently awarded the Garden Clubs of Australia Ann Williams Clark award for her long and outstanding service to the Kulnura & District Garden Club, and we were delighted to interview her for this month's member spotlight.

1. How long have you been a member of KDGC and why did you join?

InlateFebruary 1980, Margaret Davis OAM, Founder and then President of Garden Clubs of Australia, rang me and said "I've been given your name as a likely person to start a garden club in your area. Would you be interested?" I responded enthusiastically, "Yes, certainly". I then spent the following week driving around the mountain calling on everyone I thought might be interested in joining a garden club. 3. What do you most like about being part of KDGC?

- 4. What do you enjoy most about gardening / gardens?
- I enjoy the beauty, peace, and tranquillity of a garden. A place to marvel at the wonders of nature and the diversity of plants. A place you feel you can restore your soul when digging in the earth and experience the sense of achievement when your plants flourish and bloom.
 - 5. Who inspires you?

I always feel inspired by talking to other passionate gardeners.

6. What's a key piece of wisdom you'd share with a new gardener?

Never think your garden is complete. Don't be afraid to move a plant to a more suitable position. Be creative with your garden design.

7. What have you learned since joining KDGC?

There's always SO much more to learn!

8. What's your favourite plant / flower / veggie / herb?

Having planted 76 camellias, 41 roses, 5 different coloured wisterias, magnolias and many, many other varieties of plants and trees, it's hard to choose, I love them all!

9. What is one thing that you can do / have done that not many people

I raised \$13,000 by running raffles for charity - \$6,000 for the Fred Hollows Foundation and the remainder divided between Vision Australia and Guide Dogs NSW. I then started a knitting drive on the coast, asking

Her love of country was reflected in her long association with CWA, her quilts and music.



The Liquidator has offered that he and his legal advisors will prepare and lodge an application with the NSW High Court for orders to appoint our congregation, the Mangrove Mountain Christian Group Inc, to the position of replacement Trustee for the Union Church. The Liquidator requires a binding agreement from our group to pay the estimated costs of his legal advisors, the court process, an additional sum



to himself, and sundry other costs. The all-up cost estimate from the Liquidator exceeds \$150,000. We are struggling to understand (nay accept) that such an amount can be considered fair payment to these "professionals and institutions" for the return of our Union Church property. It was taken from us improperly (read the Trust Deed!) The above sum does not include our own legal costs.

Please continue your prayers for the Liquidator, and hope that he experiences his own "road to Damascus" event (like the conversion of Saul). We must also pray for the correction of a system which allows the taking of an asset, held in a charitable trust for Christian worship and for our local community, all just to pay exorbitant and unjustifiable costs.

The Liquidator did not respond to our requests for access to our Union Church on Good Friday, Easter Sunday and 24th April (day before ANZAC Day). However a wreath from our congregation was placed at the Union Church (a Registered War Memorial Site) on the Sunday before ANZAC Day.

Our Mangrove Mountain Christian Group congregation is growing, with worship services on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of each month. Our next service is this Sunday 22nd Mays will be on Good Friday 15th April and Easter Sunday 17th April, but check the location.

Our Bible Study group continues meeting on the 1st, 3rd and 5th Monday evenings from 4.30 pm to 6.00pm (winter times). BYO chair and, if you want, a non-alcoholic refreshment. You are very welcome to come for a "test drive" with us.

SIX YEARS SINCE THE COUNCIL MERGER COASTIES PAY THE PRICE

12 May marked six years since the Council merger – Our community should be asked about the future direction.

The Central Coast Friends of Democracy (CCFoD) is calling on the NSW Government to pay the \$100 million that it owes our Central Coast community and conduct a poll about the future of our Council.

On 12 May 2016, the NSW Liberal Government merged Gosford and Wyong Councils to become Central Coast Council. Six years later, staff have been sacked, rates are rising, community assets have been sold, services have been cut and local democracy has been taken from our community.

Central Coast Council is not alone. By October 2020 the failures of the NSW Government merger process were clear.

The 20 amalgamated councils around NSW faced losses of \$1.03 billion in three years and ratepayers faced hikes in rates and cuts in services. Eight out of 10 of the worst performing councils in NSW were merged councils. In May 2021, IPART determined rate increases for seven merged councils ranging from 8.0% to 53%.

The NSW Government must answer questions about its failed council mergers across the state.

In November 2020, Greg Warren, NSW Shadow Minister for Local Government, said the opposition, with support from the cross benches, would establish a parliamentary inquiry into the failing merger process and identify options the government must take to repair the damage done to councils and their communities.

"For the Central Coast, staff estimated the true cost of the merger

process in the order of \$100 million – but the NSW Government provided only \$10 million for the process," said Jane Smith, Coordinator of CCFoD and former Mayor.

"In contrast, the State Government used the Stronger Communities Fund intended for merged Councils, to give \$90 million to Hornsby Council which was not merged. There are questions of integrity around that decision and the Stronger Communities Fund."

"The Central Coast community has been treated with contempt.

The Public Inquiry into Central Coast Council provided very few answers for our community and ended up being a "tick a box" exercise to allow the NSW Government to remove our local democracy," said Ms Smith. "The figure of '\$565 million debt'

"The figure of '\$565 million debt' has been used to create a false narrative. Improvements were necessary but claims of budget mismanagement and deficits have been contradicted in comments from independent experts on Council's Audit, Risk and Improvement Committee (ARIC) including:

"...So I'm not saying I'm happy with having \$500 million worth of debt, but when we came into this and you are asking me about the three years accounts, there is nothing in those accounts in terms of debt, in terms of operating result, that is a concern to me as an independent professional". (Gordon, Public Inquiry 2021)

Communities around NSW are calling for the right to reclaim their Councils.

Our community on the Central Coast deserves to have a say about the future of our Council.

CCFoD has established a community survey on the future of Council and a petition calling on the Premier to deliver the \$100 million that the government owes the Central Coast.

Federal, State & Council Neglect On Show as Wisemans Ferry Road slips into the River

Spencer and Gunderman residents are furious with the constant decline of Wisemans Ferry Road (WFR), especially since the floods in March 2022 where there have been numerous landslides, hundreds of potholes and craters causing extensive damage to cars and putting lives at risk.

In addition to the two 2012 failed embankments there are now a further four sections of Wisemans Ferry Road where the dual carriageway has changed to a single lane road with a 'Give Way' sign and/or traffic lights to allow motorists to share the road one direction at a time. It is inevitable that there will be a head on collision leading to potential fatalities.

A temporary fix was attempted by



the Central Coast Council on Friday 7th May at the first single lane section on the Spencer side of Gunderman to reinforce the road back to where it was before the recent floods and to prevent further collapse of WFR. Signage stating 'Road closed to Spencer' at Wisemans Ferry and at Mangrove Mountain is ignored by the daily traffic flow of large trucks adding to



the deterioration of WFR.

WFR is a secondary arterial road and is utilised when the M1 is closed due to a major accident or bushfire and the traffic has to be diverted. Once again Spencer and Gunderman were excluded after the last Federal elections funded \$86.5M under the 'Central Coast Roads Package' but WFR was not included. If the Coalition is returned to government on 21st May, the Prime Minister, Scott Morrison has pledged \$40M for road maintenance for the Central Coast but this has to be distributed amongst 60 roads in this region!
