

appointment to the Trustee position for the Mangrove Mountain Union Church. Our purpose for doing this is to find a more direct and less costly route to the Trusteeship than the estimated cost of \$150,000+ proposed by the Liquidator.

A response to this move from the Liquidator's side has indicated some changes to his position. Firstly, the Liquidator now indicates that he "does not, in principle, have any opposition to" our Group being able to continue to use the property which is held in trust. Secondly, The Liquidator now appears "willing to consider further ways in which the ongoing costs and expenses of the liquidation can be minimized". And thirdly, the Liquidator's side have proposed a meeting between the parties in the coming weeks (a marked pick-up in pace from the Liquidator's side). This is encouraging news for our "Save the Union Church" Campaign!

On the fundraising front, as I write this article, we are mid-way through the Harvest Festival Weekend and our Plant Stalls at two locations - The Mangrove Mountain Public Hall and the Silver Gully Event Hub. While the Festival does not appear to be as busy as last year, its looking like we will raise a good amount towards our campaign. Our thanks to "Andreasens Green", "Colourwise Nursery", "New Leaves" and several individuals who have contributed beautiful plant specimens from their own gardens. Our gratitude also to "Meliora" orchard (Kemps) for oranges, The Bee Man, CWA Mangrove Mountain Evening Group, Georgia Sidiropoulos for her delicious home cooked treats and Phil & Sue Douglas for vege produce.

Our GO FUND ME campaign is now up and running at "Little White

Church Rescue". So far it is up to \$1,635. Still a fair way to go, so please promote this to your friends and look out for further opportunities to support our fundraising efforts.

Our Mangrove Mountain Christian Group congregation continues its worship services on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of each month at the MM Public Hall. Our next service is on Sunday 26th June. We warmly welcome all to come and hear our Guest Preacher, Dr Gavin Williams.

## Free computer classes for seniors

Older Australians who would like to better understand how to use computers will benefit from free "Computers for Seniors" classes now being run by Kariong Neighbourhood Centre.


The centre is a partner in the Federal Government's Be Connected program, an initiative aimed at increasing the confidence, skills and online safety of seniors who use the internet and related technology.

Under the program, Kariong Neighbourhood Centre runs free classes for over 50's seeking assistance in the use of computers, tablets and smart phones. "Lessons are tailored to meet the needs of participants, and are conducted one-to-one", explains program tutor David Cox. "This approach is designed to ensure that the lessons give participants the knowledge and skills they're seeking".

Popular topics for lessons include basic computer skills, using email, sharing photos, managing the storage of photos and documents, using mobile phones, creating online accounts, using the internet safely, conducting Internet searches and displaying COVID vaccination status on a phone.

"Lessons are kept to 45 minutes in length to limit the amount of new information a person has to absorb all at once", says David. "But participants can keep coming back for as many sessions as they want."

"We understand that new technology can be daunting, especially as it sometimes seems to grow more complex by the day", he says. "So we try to address the questions that participants want answered, as simply and as practically as possible. And we focus on showing the participant how to accomplish the task themselves, to give them the confidence they need."

## **VOLUNTEERS NEEDED** FOR EMERGENCY RADIO **COMMUNICATIONS NETWORK**

The Mangrove Emergency Planning & Communications Committee have received a new grant to develop a volunteer-driven Community Emergency CB Radio Communications Network.

The past few years have been tough for the Central Coast, particularly for those living in the Mangrove Mountain district and surrounding areas who have been dealt blow after blow, experiencing, catastrophic bushfires, storms and floods.

Keith Aranjo, who is part of rolling out the radio network says the recent events have only added to the programs importance and is calling on volunteers to join the program.

"Even today with mobile phones you still lose service during a large bushfire, and that is why we need a radio communications network set up so that those cut off can relay and receive information.

"In order for the whole communications system to work however we need more volunteers across the rural areas of the Central Coast, mainly those living west of the M1 motorway as they have been mostly impacted by the large bushfires we have seen in the last couple of years.'

"There has been an increase in bushfires, storms, and flooding, so it just means that people can feel more secure and get help when there is an emergency and find out what they need to know to protect them and their family."

Member for Gosford, Liesl Tesch is encouraging locals to volunteer for the initiative.

"Communication is vital during emergencies and unfortunately as Keith pointed out, it is often affected in emergencies. As we continue to face the challenges of climate change the need for consistent and reliable

"It's great to see locals being proactive and designing programs to have in place in another emergency."

## Council's Community Grant Program now open

Central Coast Council's 2022-23 Community Grants Program is now open, with \$900,000 in annual funding available to support local community groups and organisations to deliver worthwhile projects, programs and events that strengthen our community.

Council Director Community and Recreation Services, Melanie Smith said local community groups and organisations have until 30 June to apply for funding under the program to help bring their big ideas to life.

"This year, community groups and organisations will be able to apply for funding under three programs: the Community Development Grant Program, the Community Events and Place Activation Program and the Community Support Program," Ms Smith said.

"Council's Community Grants Program supports local groups and organisations to develop initiatives aimed at enhancing community connection, activating places and spaces and improving quality of life on the Coast.

"Grant writing sessions, information sessions and drop-in sessions have been running in May and are continuing during June, and are designed to support community members through the application process.

Funding of up to \$20,000 per project is available under the Community Development Grant Program and the Community Events and Place Activation Program, with applications closing at the end of the month.

"Community groups and organisations can also apply for funding of up to \$5,000 per project as part of the Community Support Program, which will remain open throughout the year."

Council Administrator, Rik Hartsaid Council's Community Grants Program provides community organisations with the support to deliver activities, events, programs and projects which build the community's capacity and create stronger local connections.

"With \$900,000 in annual funding on offer, this is an opportunity for community groups and organisations to put ideas into action, making a difference to our community and creating a stronger Central Coast," Mr Hart said.

"If you are looking to deliver a worthwhile project or event over the next 18 months, I highly encourage you to read the guidelines and apply now."

Council's 2022-23 Community Grants Program includes:

- Community Development Grant Program one round only, opened 1 June 2022, closes 30 June 2022. Applicants can apply for up to \$20,000 per application with a total available annual program allocation of \$300,000.
- Community Events and Place Activation Grant Program one round only, opened 1 June 2022, closes 30 June 2022. Applicants can apply for up to \$20,000 per application with a total available annual program allocation of \$300,000.
- Community Support Grant Program small grant program, open all year round and assessed monthly, up to \$5,000 per application with a total available annual program allocation of \$300,000.

## WISEMANS FERRY ROAD LEFT OFF THE AGENDA

Council recently announced a large program of works including roadworks at Avoca Beach, Berkeley Vale, Budgewoi, Copacabana, Davistown, East Gosford, Erina, Gosford and other areas but there were no announcements for the repair or rebuilding of Wisemans Ferry Road.

During the recent floods, Wisemans Ferry Road suffered more damage, adding to the myriad of deficiencies and dangerous locations including reductions to single lane and landslips just waiting to happen.

Wisemans Ferry Road provides critical access for residents between Wisemans Ferry and Lower Mangrove and beyond. During the floods, some residents were completely isolated due to road blockages, loss of power and loss of phone connections.

Residents and and community groups such as RiverCares have been

pleading for years to have this road restored but again have been ignored.

Money is being allocated to services such as Open Space and Recreation, Leisure & Community Facilities and Water & Sewer upgrades. Residents will be able to enjoy tennis and netball, better facilities at beaches and pools, even better urban stormwater management but during bushfires, storms and other disasters residents and emergency services won't always be able to rely on access via Wisemans Ferry Road.



## A HERITAGE CRUISE TO BROKEN BAY AND DANGAR ISLAND

On Monday 16th May a group of 50 descendants of first fleeters enjoyed a day cruising on the Hawkesbury River, being shown indigenous and early settler sites in Broken Bay and exploring Dangar Island.

The group from the Hunter Valley and Central Coast Chapters of First Fleeters chose the date to commemorote the departure of the first fleet from Plymouth on 13th May 1787.

Dangar Island has a rich indigenous history being known as a gathering place for aboriginal people and harbours rock carving and fishing sites. It is also significant in the establishment af the colony.

Governor Arthur Phillip with his senior officers visited Dangar Island in March 178 only two months after arriving at Botany Bay, on a quest to find suitable agricultural land. A plaque commemorates that landing and was of great interest to the visitors.

The Central Coast Chapter of First Fleeters meet on the second Saturday of the month at the Point Clare Community Hall at 10am for 10.30am. An invitation is extended to interested parties, whether you are a first fleeter, suspect you are a first fleeter or are interested in early Australian history. All are welcome. Since the fellowship was formed in 1968 over 9000 individuals have established their descent from nearly 200 of those original arrivals in 1788.



## The Empath/ Narcissistic Dynamic

Simply put, I would define a true empath as a person who is overly attentive to the needs of others at the expense of themselves and a true narcissist as being overly attentive to their own needs at the expense of others. (A mirror of each other.) You could conceptualise this by thinking of a bell curve, where each one is at opposing ends and the mid-area between the two extremes represents a majority of the population who have a healthy balance of both.

People with strong empathic traits are people who give very easily of themselves and often take on take on the burdens of others, both physically and mentally, hence why they are often referred to as 'sensitive'. They usually find it hard to say "no" to others and find it harder to delegate to reduce the load on themselves. They often find themselves with little time due to their tendency to be 'overgivers' (and because other people benefit from their presence) and can often become exhausted and stressed from not spending enough time and energy tending to their own needs. They are usually people-pleasers as they would often prefer to "go along to get along". Empaths usually prefer to be in their own company, in order to conserve and protect their energy. Their main challenge

tree was an opening through which a child could easily crawl. Michael, by now, was feeling very tired and seeing a soft bed of dry grasses just inside the opening at the base of the tree, he decided to get inside and have a short rest. As soon as his head touched the ground he fell into a deep sleep.

It was dark when he awoke, and this time he was frightened. He could barely move, as the inside of the tree trunk was as small as he was, and the opening was there no longer. There was nothing he could do. He was as trapped as the small, sad butterfly that he had crushed earlier that day. However, he wasn't crushed. Outside the tree trunk, he could still hear the bush noises and they gave him some comfort. He would have to wait until some help arrived, and he hoped that would not take too long.

throughout their lives is learning to set healthy boundaries by saying "no" when necessary and learning how to delegate to others without feelings of guilt. Another challenge is that due to their easy-going nature they are more likely to attract those who take them for granted and abuse their kindness, which they spend their lives trying to overcome. Once an empath learns to stand in their own power they are a powerful force to be reckoned with.

In contrast, people with strong narcissistic traits are more likely to follow a tendency for self-service (acting out of their egos) and selfinterest by abusing their own powers and having little concern for the way their behaviour affects those around them. They like to know that they are in control of their surroundings. Narcissists sometimes have a parasitic energy about them, taking off others and rarely giving anything back. For them, it's all take, take, take whilst leaving a trail of destruction behind them. Like a parasite, they often move from one host to the next as they thrive off the energy of those around them. The narcissist's challenge in life is to learn how to assert their needs without disregard for the needs of others. Another challenge is to learn to release their need for power and control over others and seeing the value in those around them. Narcissists often find themselves alone (by choice or not) due to repelling others from wanting to be in their mostly negative energy. They can harbour feelings of shame and guilt, especially if they have a small amount of conscience that the way they treat others is unhealthy.

Considering the polar opposite traits of both types, it is quite natural that people who are more empathic will attract those who are more narcissistic due to the empath's ability to constantly give and the narcissist's ability to constantly take. This dynamic is usually based in roots of generational trauma where each depends on the traits of the other to feel validated. One is keen to please the other due to their willingness to be 'liked' and 'needed' and the other is keen to have the other do things for them to fulfill their desire to be nurtured. On both sides they are searching for something they don't have themselves. We call this a co-dependent relationship, which can often feel comfortable until one of them evolves and realises they need to detach from the toxic nature of the relationship. In most, if not all, cases it is the empath who ends up finding the strength to leave the relationship in order to regain their power and independence much to the dismay

of the narcissist who would prefer to hold on to their domain of control. The empath in this case finds that they have to let go of everything they knew to be comfortable and familiar, often including their financial security, to start over again (but the freedom that comes from it makes it worth it in the end).

What I find interesting is that at the deepest levels, both the empath and the narcissist at each end of the spectrum share something in common, in that the one thing they both need to work on is the ability to love themselves and feel complete without external validation of others. It's my clinical presumption that both would often have been exposed to an upbringing where they lacked love or attention from either or both parents or grew up in abusive environments where family dynamics were unstable.

They could also be teachers to each other, if they want to be. The empath can learn that it is okay to spend time, money and energy on themselves and the narcissist can learn how to give of themselves to others in a way that uplifts others and not putting them down. The empath can learn that sometimes saying "no" is necessary and it's okay not to do things simply out of obligation to 'keep the peace', and the narcissist can learn that it's okay to surrender their control and learn to cooperate with others for mutual benefits instead of abusing their own power.

But in the most extreme cases, the narcissist refuses to let go of their desire for control and the empath finds a way to escape their clutches and chooses to have a situation of nocontact or low-contact, depending on the circumstances eg. children, in order to find their own sanctuary away from external control. Note: these dynamics can exist not just in partner relationships but also parent-child, boss-employee, work colleagues and friendships in general.
