



Exploring the Gosford Glyphs and Aboriginal Engravings in the Brisbane Waters National Park

The Dharug and Lower Hawkesbury Historical Society invite you to join us as Robert Pankhurst takes us on another fascinating exploration of several significant aboriginal rock engravings sites in the Brisbane Waters National Park. Some suspect they were carved in the 1970's, but their true origin remains a mystery.

The Community Environment Network (CEN) invites the Central Coast community to celebrate its 25th anniversary at a gala dinner to be held at Mingara on Saturday, July 24.

The gala dinner will be a great chance for friends old and new to celebrate the 25th anniversary of the CEN together.

CEN's mission which has not waivered is to support Ecologically Sustainable Development (ESD) and to oppose threats to ESD. Over the last 25 years CEN has established a variety of programs to engage the community in understanding, experiencing, learning and nurturing our environment. Our core programs included Waterwatch, Land for Wildlife, Bush Regeneration Team, Habitat for Wildlife, Wildplant Nursery and the Central Coast Marine Discovery Centre.

These core programs are complemented with smaller grant-based projects for wetlands, threatened species, habitat restoration and environmental education.

Over the last 12 months the CEN

had 22 funded positions engaged on a variety of environmental works. Last year the average wages totalled \$500,000 plus another \$100,000 for local contractors.

Complementing the work of staff and contractors are our volunteers and donors. CEN experience is that for every \$1 cash spent, there is \$4 of environmental work done by volunteers. Hence, an expenditure of \$600,000 by CEN generates a further \$2.4 million by volunteers to give a total of \$3 million of on-groundwork in an average year.

Come along and join the gala dinner it will be an opportunity to reflect both on what we've achieved, where we stand today and what the future holds.

The Power of Forgiveness

A theme that often comes up in OHHT sessions is the concept of forgiveness. Most often it is a situation where the client is finding it hard to move on from a certain emotional trauma due to the emotions that get stirred up in the presence of someone they often have trouble relating to, or in other cases when the person they had trouble with has passed over to the spirit side and they feel a sense of unresolve that is holding them back from healing the underlying issues. Either way, the issue can be dealt with independently by anyone who understands such metaphysical procedures, or it can be accomplished during a session with the guidance of a practitioner (whether QHHT or another modality).

The important thing to remember about applying forgiveness is that it is NEVER about the other person; it is always about YOU and YOUR healing journey. The other person can carry on in their ignorance but when you have the ability to forgive the other person, it tends to make you more tolerant of their behaviour. It runs off your back better like water off a duck's back (by theory at least, as everything relies on the person's belief system). Like the quote says from the bible, "forgive them for they know not what they do". The other person is responsible for

their actions, and you are responsible for yours. You do not ever need to allow someone else's 'trash' to come and ruin your garden, so to speak. Or in the case of the other person being passed over, it allows the client to find a sense of closure and peace in order to move on in their life without holding onto this 'baggage' unnecessarily.

There is a "forgiveness ritual" that I will share with you from some course notes from the Level 1 QHHT training that may help those who would like to try this for themselves. If I were using this in a session, I would tell the client to picture the person in their mind and say "We tried, we really tried, but it isn't working. Let's tear up the contract." Then I would have them see themselves literally tearing up the contract and throwing it away. Then have them say "I forgive you. I release you. I let you go. You go your way with love, and I go my way. We don't have to be connected anymore." Then the person has to forgive themselves for any part they have played in the karma they had created with this person. Once it is released, there is no karma and the trauma is released.

This ritual does not have to be done in front of the person as it can be difficult (especially if they have passed) and remember this is for you, not them. The reason why this ritual can help people overcome their emotional connections to this person is that at the energetic (metaphysical)

level the energetic dynamic between the two people is cut, and this then bleeds down through the person's emotional and mental bodies, into the physical. They are no longer affected by the other person's behaviour. (Remembering it is up to the person's belief system which will determine how thoroughly it works. But most of the time it does.)

My intention is that by providing this ritual to the greater community, people can learn to do this for themselves, if they feel confident. My goal in my QHHT journey is to empower people to help heal themselves instead of needing to seek help from outside of themselves, but I realise it is a learning process and that's why practitioners such as myself exist to help guide people to connect with the deepest parts of themselves and find true and lasting healing.

I currently have 9 approx. 'free' practise QHHT sessions (2-4hr interview and 2hr hypnosis) available to complete my QHHT internship. QHHT = Quantum Healing Hypnosis Technique. THE KILKENNYS

All roads lead to somewhere, even to the always-present past, short cuts to enriching aspects of who we are, and how that came to be.




Not so long ago (Harvest Festival weekend) at the Somersby School of Arts Hall, a display of local history explored life along some of our lesser-known by-ways.

There is not space here for all of the information presented, or to detail some other Kilkenny Road dwellers, past and present, so I will summarise the life and times of Frank and Nellie Kilkenny and family, Vera, Kathleen, Reta and Ruby.

Of course what we don't know far exceeds what we do, and like our own memories, the storied life is a creative gestalt dependant on "gaps".

We can trace some of Frank's life prior to his moving with his family to the district, and establishing his farm "Brinawa" at Somersby, (Brinawa is said to mean either Place where Rock lilies Grow, or Lilies Growing in the Rocks).

Frank was born in 1871, about the time his father Paul died (most likely in a flood). Both he and his brother Michael were good horsemen and in 1891 were the first to traverse the country between Delegate and Orbost by sulky. A feat for which there was prize money they did not claim.

1907 finds him in Bombala where he was a bootmaker and bicycle agent, and active in community affairs being nominated for the Bombala Council election. From 1910 to 1913 he is plying his trade in Inverell before moving to Gosford, where he continued to be



active in the Grand United Order of Oddfellows. By 1915 the Kilkennys are in Gosford, as this advertisement attests, and also working on the farm at Somersby.

Frank was active in local affairs on the Mountain. In 1917 he was voted joint vice-president of the Somersby Progress Association, he organised Progressive Euchre Parties, presided at send-offs for WW1 volunteers, Reddall and Studds, and welcomehomes for McFadyen, Dorran and Studds He contributed to Mountain exhibitions at the Gosford Show, took part in community debating competitions, and amongst other things, was appointed President of a committee to further the candidature of H G Parry as Councillor for E Riding, Erina Shire Council.

To supplement his farming, Frank used to collect boots and shoes in a bag from Noel Harris in Gosford and take them to Somersby where he did the repairs. He also made custom orthopedic boots and shoes, using cork to build up the soles or heels as required. He also shoed his own horses. In the 1920s Frank was selling

Indian Runner, Muscovy and Pekin ducks, and Buff Orpington and Plymouth Rock hens. In 1936 he

was President of the Somersby Fruit Growers Association.

Of the daughters brought up at Brinawa, Vera was a registered nurse, and married, as did Reta after working as a telephonist in Gosford. Kathleen

(unmarried) remained in the district and is perhaps best remembered for her contribution to local schooling:

Kathleen Kilkenny's School

Extract from: Somersby School (By Esma Hoipo)

The Gosford Times 1948
"Prize Winning Essays Trace
History of Education in the Gosford
District."

"The next attempt at establishing another school was by Miss Kathleen Kilkenny who is a still a resident of Somersby. Miss Kilkenny opened a subsidised school but this too closed after a few years. Miss Kilkenny had her school in a shed which still stands on the orchard of Mr. Medlicott."

Kathleen remained in the area until

Kathleen remained in the area until her death in 1981.

Ruby was a dressmaker. She loved animals, particularly cats. She never married but took care of her father for the rest of his life after his wife Nellie (Ellen Rankin) died in 1937. These were turbulent times. Depression followed by WW2, and locally there were devastating bushfires in 1944 across the whole district—houses and the old Somersby School of Arts Hall destroyed, not to mention farm machinery and other infrastructure. Then again in January 1952 bushfires swept through. Only timely intervention saved Kilkenny's home.

By February 1952 Frank had his Dodge 1924 utility on the market, and before leaving the district Frank and Ruby resided on the Bowmer property near Piles Creek. Mrs Bowmer was the daughter of Henry Pile. By 1954 Frank and Ruby were living in Eden, NSW.

Frank Kilkenny died in 1956.

So next time you are passing Kilkenny Road, take a detour to the past and remember Frank, Nellie, Vera, Kathleen, Reta and Ruby (and Tom), and the contribution they made.

At the Somersby School of Arts Hall we were pleased to be able to display a more extensive collection of images and information – it will be the venue for further celebrations of our shared heritage. The Hall is itself a heritage listed site, which needs community protection. Don't forget the CWA Long Table Lunch on the 24th of July as a way of helping. (Phone 4372 1280 0r 4376 1247)

"The White Lily"

We are all used to the beauty of our Mountain Districts and the particularly stunning displays of the abundant Gymea Lilies that grow so prolifically. So characteristic of our area are these spectacular plants that we have adopted them as our community flower, with the image of their red flower adorning the welcoming "Protected by Community" signs that were erected by the Mountain Districts Association some years ago.



It was with much surprise then that this Bucketty local spotted a WHITE Gymea Lily flower along the roadside at Kulnura, just to the West of Greta Road.

A bit of internet sleuthing tells me that these are the standard Doryanthes Excelsa variety and the white ones are a very rare, recessive genetic variation. Apparently the birds that propagate the plants as they feed on the flowers are not attracted to the white flower heads.

Just goes to show that it pays to keep our eyes open to something new even when we think we've seen it all.

Multiple Rain Events Sees Mangrove Creek Dam Reach 100% Capacity

Mangrove Creek Dam was completed in 1982 and from a low of 10.27% during February 2007, July 2022 has a seen the dam reach full capacity for the first time and actually overflow.

Council advises "While the overflow from the Mangrove Creek Dam will contribute to the level of the already flooded rivers, it is a relatively low rate and small in comparison to existing catchment flows. For comparison the current flow over the spillway is less than 2 gigalitres per day, with the Warragamba Dam spilling at 515 gigalitres per day at its peak.

"Although rising water levels are unpredictable during a natural disaster, Council crews are on ground monitoring the situation and providing daily advice to impacted communities as required.

"The dam level remains significantly below any levels that require activation of the Dam Emergency Plan."

The Dubbo Gully Area downstream of Mangrove Creek Dam, remains closed due to flooding. Whilst the Mangrove Creek Dam Picnic Area remains open, the dam spillway is not visible from this area.

How the dam works

Mangrove Creek Dam is the largest of the region's three dams and acts as a main back up to the water supply.

Water is released from the dam when stream flows are low in Mooney Mooney Creek, Ourimbah Creek and Wyong River.

Water is drawn from the dam via the intake tower and then released via valves at the outlet works, this water then flows 20 kilometres downstream to Mangrove Creek Weir and pumped to Mooney Mooney. From here the water is further pumped to Somersby balance tanks and then transferred from the balance tanks to Somersby Water Treatment Plant. After treatment, the water is then distributed around the Central Coast.

Details

The dam is designed as a storage dam, having a relatively small catchment area. Water from the Wyong River, Ourimbah Creek and Mardi Dam is pumped to Mangrove Creek dam when flows allow.

- Total capacity: 190,000 megalitres
- Catchment area: 101 square kms
- Surface area: 7 square kms



• Maximum water depth: 65 metres

Geology

The site has a rock base of fine grained Narrabeen sandstone which also forms the valley walls. The cliff tops and surrounding high level land is mostly Hawkesbury sandstone.

The naturally V-shaped valley is the ideal storage with a small surface area compared to volume – which means less surface evaporation.

Provision was made in the design to be able to increase the height of the dam wall by 25 metres to a total capacity of 420,000 million litres if the need arose in the future.


Monitoring the dam

Mangrove Creek Dam is staffed 365 days of the year to enable daily monitoring and safety inspections of the embankment and surrounding structures.

Instrumentation located within the dam embankment allows staff to monitor and record any movement activities, seepage or any other physical changes to the dam and surrounding structures. There are also regular surveys carried out on the structure.


This is the fifth instalment of a serialised publication of the novel "Butterfly Magic"




