Still, we have heard nothing back from the Liquidator, or his Solicitors, in response to the request that our group (MMCG Inc.) be appointed as the replacement Trustee for the Mangrove Mountain Union Church property.

Since the Liquidator was appointed over a year ago, he has done little to sustain the intent of the Trust Deed over the property. In fact, most of his actions seem to be obstructing the intent of the Trust. Actions like denying use of the property in accordance with the Trust Deed, a change to building insurance such that public use of the buildings is not covered, changing of locks to prevent use and upkeep of the buildings by community members, and delays in responding to correspondence and meeting requests.

We continue the campaign for the rightful return of the Union Church, that is held in trust for us, and for the purposes of Christian worship and community use.

Our fund-raising efforts continue with the GO FUND ME campaign "Little White Church Rescue". We also have two upcoming events. The first is the inaugural "Taste of Europe" event with a unique and delightful

Invite you to: "A Reawakening of the Black Duck Songline", An afternoon with Special Guest Speaker Robert Fuller.

Please join us at the Chapel on Saturday 27th August where we are pleased to welcome Robert Fuller who is an anthropologist/archaeologist and did a research Masters degree at Macquarie University in indigenous astronomy, and published an article on the cultural astronomy of the Kamilaroi and Euahlayi peoples in New South Wales. Robert has recently completed his PhD on the cultural astronomy and songlines of the saltwater Aboriginal peoples of the Australian East Coast.

Robert will be presenting an analysis of a significant Aboriginal songline in south-eastern Australia that has not been previously recorded. As part of a larger project examining the astronomy and songline connections of the Saltwater Aboriginal people of the New South Wales coast, the Black Duck Songline was identified that may have links to the Pleiades star cluster.

The Pleiades, known by many Aboriginal peoples as the Seven Sisters, is one of the most important elements of Aboriginal cosmologies across Australia, and features in songlines and oral traditions, as well as being a resource calendar identifier.

Aboriginal songlines are a unique development of Aboriginal culture that celebrate the travels and feats of

KULNURA & DISTRICT GARDEN CLUB - AUGUST 2022

The warmth of a fireplace, a delicious morning tea, the aroma of soup for lunch, and the promise of learning and laughter enticed twenty members to gather at the Kooree Guide Cabin Mangrove Mountain for our July meeting.

Jacqui gave us an informative lesson on how to plant bare-rooted trees / shrubs and Alex shared his favourite gardening tool, a Stihl portable hedge clipper. We were entertained by our resident stand-up comedian David Abberton whose enthusiasm for gardening is contagious. He revealed the wonders of sweet potatoes and demonstrated that what you see isn't always what you get - the exterior doesn't always tell us what beautiful colours await inside. Kind of like people in a way!

While it's always wonderful to visit and meet in a garden, our meetings indoors are filled with information, plants, tips, learning and laughter. We have made the best of the inclement weather this past few months even though it has prevented us from visiting the gardens we had planned. We still have our monthly plant competition, raffles, and opportunities to learn and discover new things.

August in the garden:

As vegetable prices increase and lettuce is the new avocado, August is a good month to:

- Plant a vegetable garden. If you have limited space, many vegetables can be grown in pots or containers, so if you have a sunny spot with well-drained soil, now is the time to consider converting it to a productive patch.
- Prepare the ground for sowing lawn in September
- Plant summer and autumn flowering bulbs
- Pinch off early buds to strengthen spring flower seedlings
- Prune bougainvillea
- Prepare dahlia beds
- Check orchid leaves for black mould
- Plant citrus and feed with a good citrus food
- Plant potatoes and sweet potatoes
 Sow beetroot, cabbage, capsicums, carrots, celery, chicory, cress, endive, herbs, kohlrabi, lettuce,
- mustard, onions, parsnips, peas, potato tubers, radishes, rhubarb crowns, silverbeet, sweetcorn, tomatoes (protect from late frosts)
- Sow ageratum, alyssum, amaranthus, aster, balsam, begonia, English daisy, carnations, celosia,

chrysanthemum, coleus, cosmos, dahlia seeds, delphinium, dianthus, everlasting daisy, gazania, geranium seed, gerbera, gloxinia

- Tidy up garden paths, "wet-andforget" stone steps and paths to clear up any slime /moss
- Dream about booking a trip to WA to see the wildflowers (Late August to early November)

Recipe: Artichoke Dip – (Jocelyn Selwood)

This recipe is a family favourite given to me by my dear friend Jocelyn 20 years ago!

440g can artichokes, drained

1 cup parmesan cheese, freshly grated

1 cup whole egg mayonnaise (I use S&W)

Preheat oven to 180C.

Chop artichoke into small pieces. Mix with parmesan and mayonnaise. Place in a small oven-proof dish which can be used for serving.

Bake for 20 minutes till it bubbles and has a golden crusty top.

Serve immediately with slices of baguette.

Book of the month:

Australian Dreamscapes: The art of planting in gardens inspired by nature, Claire Takacs

In Australian Dreamscapes, Claire Takacs showcases the



varied gardens found in the Australian landscape, from lush green oases to semi-arid settings. Claire profiles Australian gardens, gardeners and garden designers who are drawing on the international movement towards a more naturalistic approach to planting design. Similar to the New Perennial movement and Prairie-style, these gardens take into consideration how plants grow in the wild and have created highly textural, visually pleasing gardens that appeal not only to our love of beauty, but that sit gently in their surrounding landscapes, giving a strong sense of place.

Across 15 chapters and 22 gardens, Claire's stunning photography is accompanied by essays written by the garden owners or designers. The chapters detail the journey to establishing the gardens, their motivation, and the struggles and rewards the gardens bring day in, day out. Beautifully presented, Australian Dreamscapes is an inspirational journey through the diversity of gardens in Australia.

LA NINA STRIKES YET AGAIN!

No sooner had the residents along the Lower Hawkesbury River started clawing back their lives and getting their properties back in order after the floods in March 2022 when La Nina struck again on Monday 4th July! These residents were still in the recovery phase from the March floods.

The Spencer and Gunderman communities have been impacted by floods for a fourth time since February 2020! This time the floods were higher and more devastating than in March causing further damage to property, motor vehicles, boats, pontoons and jetties, as well as Wisemans Ferry Road.

The SES came straight away to help with the evacuation on Monday and then by boat on Tuesday onwards as Wisemans Ferry Road was cut off at the various creeks all the way up to Wisemans Ferry. The Spencer RFS along with other brigades from the Central Coast helped with welfare checks and later with the clean-up.

River Cares was able to implement the Community Led Emergency Response Plan by keeping in touch with every hamlet (creek community) continually through out every day for updates, providing weather and tide information, road conditions, taking requests for supplies and additional fuel, checking on the elderly and the sick, whilst simultaneously liaising with the ABC, the SES, Resilience NSW for food hampers and for fuel, Welfac, the Council and other emergency services. The Salvos and the Red Cross kept in touch and along with Foodbank and Southlakes Inc., generously donated food hampers and care packages.

Morale and resilience started strong but upon realising this flood was far worse than in March the majority of the residents in both Gunderman and Spencer already at the end of their tether were now showing signs of

despair, frustration and exhaustion.

Once again the Spencer and Gunderman communities have banded together to face the clean-up and recovery but how much more can these resilient residents endure?



The Property Market

Greens demand a return to democracy

The Central Coast Greens demand that the Minister for Local Government, Wendy Tuckerman, return the right of residents of the Central Coast to democratically elect our councillors.

The June 1 announcement by Tuckerman and parliamentary secretary for the Central Coast Adam Crouch to continue administration of our Council until September 2024 was met with universal surprise and disbelief on the Central Coast.

Initially, residents were led to believe that two years of administration plus a lengthy public inquiry were adequate.

In fact, according to the administrator Rik Hart, the troubled financial affairs of the Central Coast Council have now substantially been addressed.

AT THE SAME MEETING, council CEO David Farmer reported that the "Council is on track to forecast a yearend surplus for the 2021-22 financial year as indicated in the Quarter 3 Business Report." Surprisingly, In their statement Tuckerman and Crouch, they claim that the administrator and CEO require more time to 'complete the reforms necessary to ensure the ongoing sustainability of the Council'.

The minister knows that a fiveyear term following a period of administration is an acceptable solution to avoid the cost of holding two elections in two consecutive years. Shellharbour and Wollongong Councils implemented a five-year term solution in 2011. The minister has no reason why this solution is unavailable to the Central Coast. Only one election is needed to restore Councillors to our Council, and that election should be held sooner rather than later.

Jamie Parker, the Greens Local Government spokesperson said:

"If the Minister succeeds in delaying the election until 2024, the Central Coast will have been without Councillors for four years."

"Four years is too long to wait for local people to get a democratically elected voice back on their council."

"We're calling on NSW Labor to commit to bringing this election forward if they win government in March 2023."

Since the announcement by Tuckerman and Crouch, many signatures for a resident's petition to have the minister reconsider her decision have accumulated. The Greens support this grassroots

initiative by residents and encourage the minister to review her decision urgently.

To suspend an elected government requires exceptional circumstances. The Greens contend that exceptional circumstances no longer exist at Central Coast Council and that Tuckerman must return the normal governance by elected Councillors at the earliest practicable occasion.

Central Coast residents are concerned that controversial new developments without any supporting infrastructure and an attempt to sell off our Central Coast Water entity may go ahead in the additional two years under an appointed administrator.

The Greens strongly affirm that government by elected representatives remains the preferred and expected situation for all forms of government in Australia.
