Central Coast Council opens \$9 million landfill cell at Buttonderry Waste Management Facility

Central Coast Council has completed one of its most significant projects recently undertaken – a new landfill cell at Buttonderry Waste Management Facility, costing \$9 million. With Council's existing landfill

With Council's existing landfill cell, which was constructed in 2013, reaching its end of life, Council has designed and constructed a new modern engineered landfill cell - approximately five hectares, or seven football fields, in size.

Central Coast Council's Director Infrastructure, Boris Bolgoff, said the new cell will meet the community's waste disposal needs for approximately the next 4.5 years.

"Council's team, together with our contractors, faced many challenges during the project including Covid-19 impacts to contractor staff, higher than average wet weather and two significant natural disaster events, but have succeeded in delivering the project on time, on budget and meeting expectations."

Mr Bolgoff said while the new Cell has enormous capacity and is needed as an important facility for the community, Council also wants the community be aware of alternatives in reducing waste. "Council, through its Resource Management Strategy, wants to educate the community to look at alternative ways of avoiding the generation of waste and to recycle and repurpose wherever possible.

"Actions like sorting your waste and putting the right items in the right bins, recycling where possible, using reusable containers, finding other use for items, donating to charity, selling or gift it – there are many quite practical and simple ways of reducing waste in landfill," Mr Bolgoff said.

Recovery Unit Manager, Andrew Pearce, said this project was challenging on many levels, with the priority always to ensure the new Cell meets all environmental requirements and community expectations.

The works on the project included:

- The excavation and stockpiling of around 415,000 m3 of soil and rock
- The installation of three engineered leachate barrier liners totalling 153,000 m2 designed to protect the environment. These are a geosynthetic clay liner, high density polyethylene liner, and a cushion geotextile
- Placement of 20,000 tonnes of leachate gravel, 1.8km of leachate collection pipelines, and a leachate pumping station
- Access roads, stormwater management infrastructure, electrical poles / lines, and litter fencing

"The cell has a total airspace of 820,000 m3 which is the equivalent to 430 Olympic sized swimming pools. However as already noted, the best outcome would be that this cell is never filled! Rather, we want to work with the community to reduce waste in landfill.

"Council offers many options for helping the community to deal with waste items.

"You can take your steel, cardboard, E-waste, batteries, motor oil, florescent lights to our Waste Management Facilities for free. Council also facilitates household Chemical CleanOuts, held bi-annually, with the next scheduled event to be confirmed and promoted in early 2023."

Central Coast Council CEO David Farmer said the construction and delivery of the new Buttonderry Cell, is important as it ticks off a major project by Council, as well as delivering an important essential service for the community.

"This facility has been fully funded by Council from revenue received in prior years from the operation of Councils waste management facilities.

Where do the native vegetation provisions apply?

The native vegetation provisions in Part 5A of the Local Land Services Act apply to rural land (land zoned as: RU1, RU2, RU3, RU4, RU6 but not RU5), with some exceptions.

Land that is not regulated by Part 5A includes:

- non-rural areas in the State, defined by the State Environmental Planning Policy (Biodiversity and Conservation) 2021
- National Parks and other conservation areas
 - State Forests
- land in the Sydney or Newcastle metropolitan areas

About 43 million hectares of land in NSW is categorised as rural regulated land, which represents about 53% of the land area of NSW.





LAND TAX WILL HURT FOR YEARS TO COME

The Perrottet Government has passed their plans to tax homes forever, with the taxes calculated based on the value of their property.

Member for Gosford, Liesl Tesch, stated "Perrottet's land tax is incredibly short-sighted, and instead of supposedly helping young people into homes this will impose a forever tax that many simply will not be able to afford.

"You do not need to major in economics to understand the overwhelming issue with the land tax. As it is based off the value of the home, people who buy homes today will find it increasingly difficult to keep a roof over their heads as historically the increase in the value of our homes have far outstripped the value of our wages.

"It will be future retirees who will pay the price. The Liberals have planted the seeds of another housing crisis decades into the future."

The new tax is geared towards first home buyers to opt into an annual fee of \$400 and a tax of 0.3% of the property's value. The scheme will be fully operational from 16 January 2023

Ms Tesch worries that abolishing stamp-duty and introducing an annual land tax will over the long-run result in more household expenses, placing the Australian Dream even further out of



reach.

"Mr Perrottet talks about helping people achieve the Australian Dream. Stamp-duty is a one-off upfront cost, while this land tax is a forever cost and the total paid by a household has no clear limit as no one can tell how long someone will stay in their own property.

"It is no secret that as many enter retirement, the value of their homes is a great source of stability and wealth. The forever tax will jeopardise this, forcing those who can no longer afford it to either sell or enter reverse mortgages."

Economists are also forecasting the initial savings on stamp duty will push up home prices across NSW.

Ms Tesch says, "If the Liberals were serious about improving levels of home ownership without sacrificing future generations, they would invest in social housing, they would not introduce regressive taxes, and they would be able to come up with policies that doesn't simply kick an issue down the road for future leaders to grapple with."



Holistic perspectives on gut health

Over the past decade there has been an increasing awareness of the connection between the gut and brain function. With conditions such as ADD/ADHD and autism, as well as serious allergies, chronic inflammation and auto-immune diseases becoming more prevalent I believe it is now more than ever that people are experiencing first or second hand the after-effects of a society (especially Western ones) that has been dominated by a culture that does not promote a properly functioning gastrointestinal system, which has been aggravated by Western medical practices such as over-prescribing antibiotics, vaccines and pharmaceutical drugs in general, by food industries with products laden with toxic additives and preservatives, by the agricultural industry with the heavy use of pesticides and herbicides, and by the meat industry use of hormones and antibiotics, not to mention the introduction of genetically-modified varieties of fruit and vegetables.

Add to this the consumption of fluoridated/chlorinated tap water, drugs and alcohol, the use of toxic household cleaners, garden products, mechanical products, make-up products, hair dyes, shampoos, soaps and various other lotions and potions, and we have a train wreck waiting to happen in our gastrointestinal systems. Made even worse if one works in an environment where toxic chemicals are a part of their everyday existence.

And I haven't even mentioned wheat yet...

I just about guarantee that any child with challenging behavioural conditions and any adult with chronic mental health conditions, or anyone with serious allergies is very likely to benefit from a conscious effort to reduce toxic overload (of the items mentioned above) which can allow the body to do what nature intended, which is to heal itself.

Antibiotics, as most people know, deplete healthy colonisation of bacterial flora in our gut, and vaccines result in a toxic overload of heavy metals such as mercury (used as 'adjuncts' to help keep the vaccine within the body) which can have long-lasting effects on brain function if no effort is taken to detoxify from them. And most of the other toxic items listed above would contribute to either of these two main effects on the gut/brain connection.

I will also add in the metaphysical considerations of gastrointestinal issues, which are to do with how one 'takes in' and processes new information coming in, and of 'letting go' of what is not needed. That is, if a person has loose motions, I would ask them "what are you trying to let go of?" (it could be a person/s, or situation, or an actual toxin), and if a person has constipation I would ask them "what are you holding on to?" (a person, place or thing). The gut is often affected by our emotional/mental state, hence why it is common for someone to feel a bit 'wrong in the gut' (eg. churning) when they are feeling emotionally turbulent or worried about something, or to get 'butterflies' in the gut when they are excited

So, after knowing all this, what can we do to improve our gut health? First

and fore most it goes without saying that any of the above-mentioned toxic items would be better to be reduced. or eliminated, or replaced with a more gut-friendly option. The amount and pace at which one implements this would depend on the severity of the affected person's condition and how much it is affecting their daily life. Maybe the worst and obvious culprits could be approached first, then the less impacting items approached at a tolerable pace. Examples would be to switch to purchasing from places where you KNOW the products are organic, such as fruit & veg, meat products, and buying raw milk.

One option that may resonate with some is to have colonic hydrotherapy (usually attended in a series of three sessions over 6 weeks) which helps to remove clogged up stool in the large intestine. This procedure is safe for most people but a medical clearance may be needed for some. I can personally recommend "The I AM Wellness Centre" located at Toukley where I have had such a procedure done myself and can vouch for their 5-star service. Such a procedure is closely linked with "letting go" of emotional baggage.

I highly recommend viewing a 3-set video series of Dr. Natasha Campbell-McBride who speaks of the Gut and Psychology Diet (known as the GAPS diet for short), which provides comprehensive information which

actually inspired me to cover this topic. The GAPS diet is a healing diet that helps to restore optimal function of the gut for people who are in need of avoiding toxins and replenishing the gut with healing soups and stews for a prescribed period of time. Search for GAPS 1/3, GAPS 2/3 and GAPS 3/3 to locate each video which can be found in the channel called "The World Foundation for Natural Science". As it happens, the lady who operates The I AM Wellness Centre is an accredited GAPS practitioner who can help to formulate an appropriate nutrition plan for those who need some guidance.

There are various foods/ supplements that can be used to assist in detoxing the body of heavy metals. A useful and informative resource is the "Natural Health Library" on facebook where you can search for the page for information on detoxing. (Alternatively please email me and I will happily send the link to a specific article on the topic of heavy metal detoxing.)

The next aim would be to incorporate things that can help to re-establish healthy bacteria in the gut. Fermented products such as sauerkraut, kimchi and kefir (drinking yoghurt), as well as kombucha (drink) are powerful probiotics that can be added into one's diet to replace healthy bacteria strains for optimal gut function and are a source of easily digestible nutrients that provide nourishment that doesn't

require a lot of energy on our part. Probiotic capsules can be helpful in the initial phase whilst dietary adjustments are made. For anyone who would like to have access to specific links regarding the above suggestions please email me and I will assist in the best way possible for your needs.

For the metaphysical/emotional aspects, it can be beneficial to look at what is going on in your life, such as toxic relationships, or toxic environments/jobs/situations and whether addressing these aspects may make a difference in the way a person's gut functions. (This is where QHHT sessions can be helpful, by accessing one's inner guidance on what a person can do to help themselves heal to the best of their ability.)

I am still doing 'free' practise QHHT sessions (2-5hr interview and 2hr hypnosis) to complete my QHHT internship. QHHT = Quantum Healing Hypnosis Technique. Working together to end domestic abuse

Central Coast Council is once again working with community leaders, to raise awareness and educate the community to help end family and domestic abuse.

The Central Coast has the second-highest number of domestic violence incidences in NSW* and is overrepresented in breaches of apprehended violence orders. Crimes of sexual assault are also on the increase.

Council Director Community and Recreation Services Melanie Smith said all community members can help put an end to domestic abuse.

"The health and safety of others is everyone's business. Domestic abuse is not just a private matter and its impacts are felt across all levels of the community," Ms Smith said.

"Domestic and family violence is one of the largest threats to our communities' safety. Prevention initiatives are proven to help stop the violence before it starts."

Each year, Central Coast Council supports a local campaign to help address the main challenges faced by our community. Over 30 stakeholders from the local community and services sector were invited to a workshop to share their knowledge, skills, and experience of the issue.

This collaboration informed the messages for this years' 16 Days of Activism against Gender-based Violence campaign which has a focus on changing the behaviour of perpetrators.

The national campaign runs from 25 November to 10 December and Council has developed a range of education and awareness raising materials to bring the campaign to the community.
