Hazards Near Me app

"Hazards Near Me NSW" is now live. Replaces "Fires Near Me" and includes floods and other other warnings.

You can find current information about local emergencies on Hazards Near Me. The app shows information provided from emergency services on:

- bush fires
- floods
- advice on what to do to stay safe.

The app also provides other warnings and activities in your area:

- fire danger ratings
- total fire bans
- hazard reduction activities.

The app can send you push notifications when there are new incidents or when information changes.

By setting a watch zone, you can get notifications about incidents in your area and by setting up a user account, you can get the same information across all your devices.



What's changed?

In February 2023 the NSW Rural Fire Service app Fires Near Me NSW was updated to include additional information about other emergencies from the NSW State Emergency





Service. Fires Near Me is now called Hazards Near Me.

Over time, more alert types and functions will be added to the app.

This app was developed in response to the finding by the independent Flood Inquiry for the need for a single source of advice that can provide warnings for different types of hazards,

Existing users of Fires Near Me will need to update their app through their phone's app store. New users can download the app by searching for 'Hazards Near Me' in their app store

Central Coast Roads Package update

Central Coast Council continues to deliver a range of grant funded road and drainage upgrade and renewal projects under the Federal Government's Central Coast Roads Package.

There are 21 road infrastructure projects already completed across the region since 2020 and the following 6 projects under the Central Coast Roads Package are currently underway or commencing shortly:



- Ridgway Road, Avoca Beach road and drainage upgrade
- Del Monte Place, Copacabana road and drainage upgrade
- Lushington Street, East Gosford road and drainage upgrade
- Steyne Road, Saratoga road and drainage upgrade
- Springwood Street, Blackwall road and drainage upgrade
- St Huberts Island Bridge safety improvements

What is shadow/inner work?

Shadow or inner work could best be defined as the process by which a person comes to the realisation that everything that exists, or happens, outside of themselves is a reflection of what exists, or is happening, inside themselves (at the emotional, mental and spiritual levels). It is the process by which a person chooses to stop perceiving an event as something that is "happening to them" and in place chooses to perceive that something has come into their awareness to SHOW that an aspect inside of themselves needs looking at in order to heal that aspect, which, when practised consistently over time, lifts a person out of victimhood and into their inherent power. This could otherwise be phrased as beginning to integrate their Higher Self, or re-integrating lost aspects of their soul. And it's a lifelong process. We are always on the path of healing. We are always learning to get to know ourselves better.

What is the Higher Self, you may ask? It's the greater, expanded part of you that is connected to everything both within this realm and the universe itself and knows everything about you (even better than what you think you know about yourself) and everything outside of you, as everything is connected to everything (the quantum field). It could otherwise be called universal consciousness. This is the part that is accessed during a QHHT session or in other modalities of past life transgression or soul retrieval work.

As a person begins the journey of shadow work they will be confronted with the darkest places inside of themselves, and some call this the "dark night of the soul". Their Higher Self will bring certain events experiences (eg. relationship dynamics, short term interactions or external events in the world) that the person needs to face to confront their innermost fears and insecurities in order to FEEL the emotions that come with such experiences to fully process and transmute (release) these negative aspects of themselves. These confronting experiences are known as 'triggers' due to the fact that emotions buried deep within ourselves are 'triggered' as the person is exposed to things that confront their belief systems as they know it.

Such a journey will often bring up traumatic events from the past that they have not fully processed at the time of the event (eg. a traumatic break up, or death of a loved one, or other traumatic/abusive experiences) and will usually go through periods of intense emotions with much crying (aka releasing) which helps to

clear stored emotions from parts of their body. This process of releasing old 'stuck' energies (as emotions are "energy-in- motion") results in physical healing to parts of their body affected by these stuck emotions. This process can happen with the person's awareness or at an unconscious level. This is also the specific process that occurs in every QHHT session, and every case is different.

An outcome of a person going through much inner processing is that they will find that things don't seem to trigger them anywhere near as much as before. They have a new-found strength, resilience and perseverance that enables them to face future life events more consciously, meaning that they 'respond' from their higher/ integrated self by internalising the pain they are feeling and examining why they are feeling it, than reacting from their unhealed self by projecting their pain onto others. They realise that in hurting someone else is to in turn hurt themselves because everyone is just a mirror to everything outside of themselves, and on the higher levels we are all 'one'. Another common phrase most would relate to is to "do unto others as you would have them do unto you".

I am still doing 'free' practise QHHT sessions (2-5hr interview and 2hr hypnosis) to complete my QHHT internship. QHHT = Quantum Healing Hypnosis Technique. For





KULNURA AND DISTRICT **GARDEN CLUB** MARCH '23

"Winter is an etching, spring a watercolour, summer an oil painting, and autumn a mosaic of them all." Stanley Horowitz

I need to remember not to start every article with an expression of surprise at how rapidly the preceding month has disappeared! It doesn't help that February is at least 2 or 3 days shorter than the other months, so perhaps my astonishment at how quickly it has disappeared is allowed to be expressed just one last time. The upside is that we are now into my favourite season, autumn. I love the crisper mornings, the early mist, the anticipation of glorious colours as the leaves turn, and the relief that we don't have to swelter through the hot, hot days of summer for at least another 9 months. It's also the best season for gardening.

Our February meeting was a longawaited visit to the beautiful property of Sid and Pam Leotta at Jilliby. This visit had been delayed several times due to floods and other obstacles, so even though the day dawned with rain showers and grey clouds, an enthusiastic group of almost thirty people gathered to marvel at Sid's perfect circles, talk to Pam's gorgeous alpacas, and enjoy the results of the dedication and hard work that Sid and Pam have invested in their beautiful gardens.

We are fortunate that KDGC members meet in beautiful gardens on the Central coast (and in the Hunter Valley occasionally) as many garden clubs hold their monthly meetings indoors. We get to see such a variety of inspiring outdoor spaces and meet interesting people at the same time. If you have a garden you'd be willing to share with our garden club, we'd love to hear from you! If you don't have a garden, but would enjoy hanging out with us anyway, we'd also love to hear from you.

March in the garden:

As the days are cooler it's ideal to spend time outdoors and there is no shortage of things to do in the garden. This year I'm going to try some potted bulbs, so it's the perfect time to prepare the containers and pop the bulbs into the fridge for a few weeks.

March is also the month to:

- Aerate your lawn (once it dries out a little)
- check for the pests that thrive in these wet and humid conditions
- · check roses for aphids and fungal diseases
- feed everything in the garden
- Sow beetroot, broccoli, cauliflowers, leeks, parsnips, peas, radishes, silver beet, turnips, calendulas, cornflowers, delphiniums, dianthus, everlasting daisies, Livingstone daisies, pansies, polyanthus, poppies, snapdragons, stock.

To celebrate St. Patricks' Day, sow your sweet peas on 17th March. Actually, this is the traditional date

for sowing sweet peas, but it's only a guide. Sweet peas need a sunny spot with good drainage and support for the climbing varieties. It's important to pick the flowers often, because once pods form, the plant thinks it's time to stop flowering. I think there's nothing nicer than a little bunch of sweet peas on the window-sill, and the fragrance is sublime.

Recipe

I'm going to risk my reputation here and share a recipe for brussels sprouts. When I was younger, I made my Mum write a note to the boarding school principal saying I was allergic to these small packages of evil. Nothing anyone could say would convince me otherwise, and it wasn't until very recently that I gave them a second chance. Now, they're a key staple in my fridge and I have to admit I've been wrong about them all these years.

Here's a recipe to make them irresistible.



Brussels sprouts with burnt butter and black garlic (from Ottolenghi's book, "Simple")

*you can buy black garlic at Harris Farm or from speciality growers online, or for the truly dedicated, you can make your own. (but be warned, making black garlic takes weeks, so plan ahead!)

Ingredients:

450g Brussels sprouts, trimmed and cut in half lengthways (400g)

1 tbsp olive oil

³/₄ tsp caraway seeds

20g black garlic cloves (about 12), roughly chopped

2 tbsp picked thyme leaves 30g unsalted butter 30g pumpkin seeds, toasted 1½ tsp lemon juice 1 tbsp tahini salt

Method:

1. Preheat the oven to 220°C fan.

- 2. Mix the sprouts with the oil and ½ teaspoon of salt, then spread out on a parchment-lined baking tray. Roast for 10 minutes, until the sprouts are golden-brown but still crunchy.
- 3. Meanwhile, lightly crush the caraway seeds with a pestle and mortar. Add the black garlic and thyme and crush them to form a rough paste.

4. Put the butter into a large sauté pan and place on a medium high heat. Cook for 3 minutes, until melted and dark brown. Add the crushed garlic paste, sprouts, pumpkin seeds and 1/8 teaspoon of salt. Stir for 30 seconds, then take off the heat. Stir in the lemon juice and transfer to a large bowl or individual plates. Drizzle over the tahini and serve at once.

Running an eagle eye over the region's road network

Central Coast Council is currently undertaking a road condition survey across the region's entire sealed road network of more than 2,000 kilometres, using state-of-the-art technology to efficiently gather accurate data for effective road management and works planning.

Council Director Infrastructure Services, Boris Bolgoff said the data gathered from this survey will help plan for the distribution of available Council and grant funds for road renewal projects where they are most needed, and the scheduling of maintenance works.

"We've engaged a data collection specialist to undertake this comprehensive electronic assessment using a Hawkeye 2000 Network Survey Vehicle to complete in-depth road analysis," Mr Bolgoff said. "Equipped with a digital laser profiler and eight roof-mounted digital cameras, the vehicle captures highdefinition imagery of Council's road pavement across the Central Coast Local Government Area.

"This technology greatly improves efficiencies as the process is much quicker than more labour-intensive methods of assessing road conditions. This means Council can progress to plan and deliver improved roads for the community faster."

Council Administrator, Rik Hart said the maintenance and improvement of our road network continues to be a key priority.

"Managing and maintaining our extensive network of roads is a big job and we are embracing new technology to effectively collect accurate data and plan works for this important infrastructure," Mr Hart said.

"This is one way that Council is delivering on a commitment to responsible governance through improved efficiencies in work practices for the benefit of our community."

This road condition survey is in addition to the routine pavement inspections undertaken to identify defects, such as potholes, which guides upcoming road maintenance works.

An ongoing road renewal program is in place and delivers treatments such as preservation sealing, heavy patching, rehabilitation, and resurfacing.

Council crews are on the ground each week undertaking road renewal works and are currently completing Glen Road, Ourimbah, and preparing for Bay Road and Eloora Road at Blue Bay in late February.

Several other roads across the region are already planned for road renewals this year, including:

- Ilya Avenue, Erina
- · Haynes Road, Umina Beach
- · Debenham South, West Gosford
- Tuggerawong Road, Tuggerawong

To view this financial year's road and drainage capital works projects and their status, use Council's online Capital works interactive map at centralcoast.nsw.gov.au.
