PILE BURNING AFTER BUSH FIRE DANGER PERIOD ENDS

April 1st marks the end of the Bush Fire Danger Period for the Central Coast Region. While this means you are no longer required to acquire a Fire Permit to burn, you are required to notify us of any planned burn, at least 24 hours BEFORE you light up.

Additionally, you will still need to follow the council 'Open Pile Burn Policy', which can be found online. Notifying us of your planned burn can help reduce unnecessary emergency calls and allow help to go where it is needed.

Notifying us is as easy as jumping online to: https://www.rfs.nsw.gov.au/fire-information/BFDP/burn-notifications or google RFS pile burn notification.

As mentioned, you are required to notify us of any planned burn, at least 24 hours BEFORE you light up. Then,

all you need to do is:

- Notify your neighbours at least 24 hours BEFORE you light up, so they know that you will be burning,
- Check the weather on the day, avoiding hot and windy weather
- Take all reasonable precautions to ensure you are conducting a safe pile burn.

We also appreciate a quick email or call from residents who will be lighting up just in case we get a fire call.

Alternatively, your local RFS brigade may be able to assist you with your pile burns.

A member of your local brigade will come out and inspect your piles and organise a time to come and light up and manage the piles until they are at a level that is deemed safe. This is a great training opportunity for brigades and allows us to meet more of our community.

Newcastle Disease Burial Pit Repairs

After the destruction of commercial poultry and pet birds during the 1999 Newcastle Disease outbreak, carcasses and shed litter were buried at three locations in the Mountain District.

The material was placed in shipping containers which were buried or in lined pits that were capped. Both methods are susceptible to producing leachate discharge and releasing

methane gas.

One of the burial pits, located in Waratah Rd, is being recapped due to subsidence and leachate concerns.

Groundwater around all pits is being monitored by the use of a series of bores. The Mangrove Mountain & Districts Comunity Group is attempting to obtain reports on the results of tests on the water from these bores.

After twenty three years, all the sites continue to pose an ongoing risk to groundwater, the environment and residents and are subject to regular and ongoing monitoring and maintenance by the DPI.





Notice of 1080 Program

The NSW National Parks and Wildlife Service (NPWS) is conducting an aerial baiting program in Brisbane Water and Popran National Parks from Saturday 6th to Sunday 14th May 2023.

The operation will use 1080 (sodium fluoroacetate) poison for the control of wild dogs and foxes.

The program is designed to minimise predator impacts on wildlife, especially threatened species, and to minimise impact of wild dogs on neighbouring stock.

Signs will be placed at the entry to the baiting location. Domestic pets are not permitted in NSW National Parks managed lands. Pets and working dogs may be affected (1080 is lethal to cats and dogs). Pets and working dogs must be restrained or muzzled in the vicinity and must not enter the baiting location. In the event of accidental poisoning seek immediate veterinary assistance.

Council Unit Manager of Leisure Beach Safety and Community Facilities, Phil Cantillon said the free event is designed to address key concerns young people have identified within the Central Coast community about how they are engaged in community life.

"A key finding in the Central Coast Youth Strategy 2019 – 2024 identified that young people felt there are limited opportunities where they can access safe and affordable venues to socialise, meet their friends and hang out," said Mr Cantillon.

"Our youth also said that while there are a great range of programs, events, and activities on the Central Coast they aren't regular enough or inclusive enough for them.

"This forum is providing the platform for business stakeholders to hear from a unique perspective on how best to engage with and increase participation from young people.

"I want to particularly encourage student representatives from local high schools, TAFE, and universities to come together to utilise this opportunity and ensure that their voices are heard."

To help ensure the day addresses these key areas the Y4Y action team have broken the day into two parts:

1. Presentations from guest speakers who will highlight ways to better include young people in community life, events and initiatives. Speakers will include Jahin Tanvir a 2022 Young Australian of the year finalist, Founder of Breathe and Board Director at the Adolescent Health Association of Australia, and Brad Cardis, Owner of Fixx Events and Marketing.

2. Group workshops opening a dialogue directly with young people, businesses, organisations and event organisers.



Administrator Rik Hart encouraged the community to have their say.

"The financial performance of the organisation has turned around and Council's steadfast financial management has increased our financial stability," Mr Hart said.

"This draft Operational Plan shows a continued focus on delivery of services to the Central Coast community through prudent expenditure and incorporates the necessary adjustments to accommodate the increased depreciation trend and rising costs due to inflation.

"This is not a Central Coast Council problem but a challenge facing all councils in the current economic climate, and notably the limitations placed on councils to increase revenue.



DLHHS Celebrates their 40th Anniversary!

On Saturday 25th March 2023 at the historic former Wesleyan Chapel built in 1855 located in Gunderman, 54 people attended the Dharug and Lower Hawkesbury Historical Society's 40th Anniversary. We were fortunate to welcome our inaugural President Lorraine Banks (who drove up from Canberra) and had the well wishes of Heather Winch, one of the founders of the Society. Also in attendance were previous Presidents of the Society, members from the Dural and Districts Historical Society, the Convict Trial Project and the Hornsby Shire Historical Society.

The name of the Society was chosen at the first meeting in March 1983. The initial assumption was to be the called Wisemans Ferry and Districts Historical Society, but as most people present lived on the north side of the River and as it was believed the Dharug people lived in the area, the original members wanted the historical Society to encompass the first occupants as well as the history of our European settlers so they agreed to be called the Dharug and Lower Hawkesbury Historical Society.

As befitting such an auspicious day we welcomed emeritus Dr Grace Karskens as our guest speaker. Grace has been involved in researching and exploring the Hawkesbury and environs for many years from her earlier work on the history of the Great North Road and its convict builders to the secret history of Dyarubbin, the Hawkesbury-Nepean River which is the subject of her highly acclaimed publication People of the River Lost

Worlds of early Australia. Grace explained this book examines early settler history and the great experiment of settlement, aboriginal history, environmental and flood history and the interactions of all of them.

Grace explained that over the last forty years there has been a revolution in our view of history. Whilst she always wondered growing up in the bushland suburb of Baulkham Hills who lived here before us, schools did

not mention Aboriginal people in the telling of our history. The submerged history which treated us as if the land was a blank sheet when the Europeans arrived has been revolutionised.

Grace described her study of the river as a humbling but evolving journey in which she was helped by a group of Darug women. The chance discovery of Rev. John McGarvie's list of over 170 Aboriginal place names in geographical order along the Hawkesbury and Macdonald rivers which he documented in 1829 has given rise for further research. The Real Secret River: Dvarubbin became a collaborative project that drew together Darug knowledge holders, artists and educators with historians, linguists and archaeologists to reconnect the names McGarvie collected back to their river places.

These place names list culturally significant locations each name holding a spiritual meaning for Aboriginal people despite many of these indigenous names being forgotten after colonisation. Each name would describe the geography, or landmark or even a cultural event. Wisemans Ferry was called Woolloomoorang and Sackville was called Dorumbolooa which means 'rainbow moves through'.

Of the 170 Aboriginal place names the Darug women have sourced over 90 of the names and it seems there was a whole country of Aboriginal names

see to believe". It fears the unknown. It is associated with our perception of the material, physical reality.

The right brain, in contrast, is the feminine, creative, imaginative and intuitive side that is expansive and open to all potentialities. It accepts things for how they are rather than judging, and is okay about not needing to know or understand things all of the time. It is the risk-taking side, the side where faith in the unseen and unexperienced exists and hence does not require proof in order to believe, ie. "believing in order to see". It is associated with our perception of the spiritual or unseen reality. It embraces the unknown and thrives on spontaniety. 

and ecologically friendly practices, thinking 'outside the box' and critically thinking about the way we've done things in the past to make way for a more naturally aligned and universally supported lifestyle. As more people tire of the 'rat race' lifestyle and feel driven to get closer to nature a trend of relocating to the rural based community lifestyle is becoming more popular (and necessary). One of the benefits of this trend is that moving away from heavily cemented cities and out to the natural landscapes allows for a re-establishment of the human brain to connect telepathically with the environment around them, whether this is recognised or not. This is how we exist in our most natural state. Some refer to this as "nature's internet".

When it comes to quantum healing sessions, the forum of global QHHT practitioners has been noticing changing trends in how clients experience their hypnosis sessions. A few decades ago, it was nearly standard for a client to have little or no recollection of what they experienced under hypnosis due to the conscious mind (left brain) being 'knocked to the side' to allow for universal knowledge (from the right brain) to come through.
