THE DHARUG AND LOWER HAWKESBURY HISTORICAL SOCIETY

The re-scheduled Annual General Meeting to be held on Saturday, 27th May 2023 followed by an afternoon with our Special Guest Marilyn Wood, a previous DLHHS president and long-time member of the Royal Australian Historical Society and the Society of Australian Genealogists (S.A.G.)

The AGM is to take place at the Chapel at 1.00pm and we encourage our members to attend so we can elect a Committee to help the Society to function in 2023. We encourage any member who would like to get involved to nominate for committee or any other position.

An invitation extends to the general public to join us for the afternoon.

After the AGM is conducted Marilyn will be talking about her project with S.A.G. to research and write about the lives of women who lived during Australia's colonial period. The bones of each woman's story will be factual, but their lives will be written in the mode of historical fiction, recreating the sounds, smells, the atmosphere and the social customs of colonial Australia.

Marilyn will talk about her ancestor and some of the highlights (and low lights) of Ann Stephenson's life in the convict society of Paramatta. A woman although small in stature was not afraid to open her mouth, and could only be removed from the courthouse by the vigorous intervention of 2 constables. Marilyn will also talk about another ancestor (from her extended family) Elizabeth Perry, most famous for her marriage to James Ruse, with whom she co-partnered the pioneering of agriculture in the New South Wales colony and how when they moved from Parramatta to the Hawkesbury district where their domestic life took an unconventional turn.





Proposal for 400 Head Cattle Feedlot at Mangrove Mountain

A DA for a feedlot for 400 cattle has been submitted for a property at 2 Hershon Road Mangrove Mountain.

The cattle are to be housed in two steel framed feedlot sheds of approximately 84 metres by 24 metres with compacted earthen floors and concrete perimeter aprons.

Drainage and retention basins are to be used to ensure all surface water runoff generated within the proposed development footprint is effectively diverted, captured and released, as per the relevant guidelines.

The Statement of Environmental Effects states "Wastes (manure) will be scraped and stockpiled (no longer than two (2) days) within a nominated area of the feedlot pens. Trucks will attend the site and directly load all wastes (manure) onto trucks for removal and transportation off site.

Feed will be delivered daily to the feedlot, directly unloaded into a nominated area of the feedlot shed and distributed directly to feed pens for consumption by the cattle" The subject property has been previously used for open grazing while nearby properties are used for poultry, small cattle herds, horticultural and rural-residential purposes. Popran National Park lies to the east.

Residents of neighbouring properties are concerned about the noise, smell, effects on the environment. There is additional concern about the well being of the cattle.

Curiously, the Statement of Environmental Effects, clause 4.2.8 Employment, mentions "Upon completion of construction (capacity of 999 head) ..."





May in the garden

I'm loving the cool mornings and the beautiful valley mists, and we've been busy preparing our garden for a family wedding this week. We've refreshed the gardens with woodchip, done lots of pruning and tidying, and some autumn planting. The dahlias are still bringing much delight and the roses are full of beautiful blooms. It is my favourite time of the year.

May is a great month in the garden to:

- Plant vegetables including brussels sprouts, cabbage, cauliflower, broccoli, peas, broad beans, radish, turnips, swedes, spinach.

COVID-19 Leave Grants To Support Aged Care Workers

The Commonwealth Government has announced COVID-19 leave grants for aged care workers who contract COVID-19 and do not have entitlements available to them to take time off work.

The \$750 grants will come into effect from July 1, 2023, and cover Australian Government funded aged care providers, home care package providers, and aged care workers.

The grants will be per person and per week.

Federal Member for Robertson, Dr Gordon Reid MP says that this is a welcome announcement and will benefit aged care workers on the Central Coast.

"We owe so much to our hardworking and dedicated aged care workers who have cared for our elderly and most vulnerable during the past several years while we have battled a global pandemic", Dr Reid said.

"What the COVID-19 leave grant will mean is aged workers will not have to worry should they have no entitlements available to them when they are sick", Dr Reid said.

"This is about protecting our elderly Australians and ensuring our aged care workforce is supported", Dr Reid said.

Providers will need to apply for COVID-19 leave grants on behalf of an employee and can do so through the Australian Government GrantConnect website.
