Growing Opposition to Feedlot

The extent of community opposition to the planned cattle feedlot at Mangrove Mountain was evident at a meeting held at Mangrove Hall on Friday, May 12.

The proposal would see a 400 head feedlot established alongside Ironbark Road, opposite the intersection with Kirks Road, in relatively close proximity to several homes on nearby farms and residential properties. The DA also reveals the potential to expand the capacity of the operation to 999 head of cattle.

Attendees at the meeting were able to draw on decades of accumulated Assessment Regulation 2000.

Several points of objection have identified:

- 1. Impacts on the environment
- 2. Effect on existing properties, farms, businesses and residences
- 3. Social and economic impacts
- 4. The suitability of the site
- 5. The broader public interest
- 6. Noise, odours and dust
- 7. Water run off
- 8. Containment of animal waste including faeces and urine
- Non-compliance with regulations relating to clearances to boundaries and specified zones



66 people attended the meeting at Mangrove Hall

knowledge of the local environment and weather, expertise in cattle and farming in general, road and traffic conditions and known effects of noise, dust and odours, all pointing to the complete unsuitability of the designated site for the proposed feedlot.

The DA was lodged on 17/02/2023 but initially only three people were advised. Subsequently, other residents found out by word of mouth and approached council to extend the deadline for submissions. However, even after extension to June 6 2023, other residents have only been notified in a slow and sporadic fashion. As knowledge of the DA spreads to the wider group of affected persons more requests are being sent to council to extend the deadline. There have also been complaints of difficulty in accessing the DA documents.

The DA process must follow section 4.15 of the NSW EP&A Act and NSW Environmental Planning and

LOCAL VOICE TO PARLIAMENT INFO SESSION MARKED A SUCCESS

A Central Coast Voice to Parliament information session has been marked a success, after the event saw over 100 Coasties in attendance to learn about what The Voice to Parliament is.

The info session, held at Club Umina last week, featured panellists Jacob Smeaton from Barang Regional Alliance, Aunty Dianne O'Brien and Aunty Robyn Reid from Mingaletta Aboriginal Corporation, and Local Members of Federal and State Parliament, Dr Gordon Reid MP and Liesl Tesch MP.

Central Coast local and proud Kerrupjmara man, Jacob Smeaton, discussed the Uluru Statement from the Hearts' origins and the consensus among the 250 Constitutional Convention delegates.

Dr Reid discussed the importance of establishing The Voice to Parliament and constitutionally recognising our First Nations people. Dr Reid also provided an outline of the Parliamentary process to update how referendums in Australia are held, and the need to ensure First Nations' voices in Parliament.

Dr Reid said The Voice to Parliament is about two things: recognition and consultation.

A Voice will provide advice to the Federal Parliament about laws and policies, through a consultative policy-making process that delivers meaningful change.

Barang Regional Alliance is also set to kick off its 'cuppa conversations' initiative in which local community groups can hold conversations and field questions about the Voice to Parliament.

Liesl Tesch said "With the question set to be asked to the Australian public later this year, it's fantastic to see the turn-out and openness of people to learn and engage.

meet with local community members and discuss details about the upcoming referendum to recognise First Nations Australians in the constitution and to establish an Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Voice to Parliament.

Scams being sent via email, encountered on website links, via txt message or direct phone calls are commonplace.

The latest scam mimics a Telstra bill, with some personal details obtained via the various leaks and corporate hacks that have been taking place. The scammer has a very persistent system and these bills get sent regularly, turning into warning and disconnection notices.

This year, Scams Awareness Week is about empowering people to learn how to spot a scam and encouraging them to take the time to check whether a communication or offer is real.


There are some simple ways to detect a scam. These are some things to look out for:

- A person or a message urging you to act quickly, whether it's a threat to make an urgent payment, a request for upfront payment or a limited opportunity too good to miss.
- A person or a message asking you to update or provide your personal details, such as identifying information, banking details or passwords, or asking to remotely access your device.
- Any payment request via unsecure or unusual methods such as cryptocurrency, gift cards or bank transfer.
- A person or suspicious message claiming they have new contact details or asking



for payment to a new bank account.

WRITING FOR PLEASURE

Australia Post makes a huge profit in delivering parcels which we order over the internet but makes a loss in delivering letters. That's because the only snail mail we generally get are bills and even now companies are encouraging people to get them electronically.

When was the last time you put pen to paper and actually wrote a letter? I wager that most people only write Christmas cards and birthday cards because it's far easier to e-mail, text or use some other form of social media to communicate. We even use digital signatures which are recognized as legally binding. What a boon that is to the hackers of the cyber world who are becoming more and more sophisticated.

Can you imagine having to pay for a mortgage or other high price item which you never applied for? And all because your signature was compromised. It could cost you a lot of time, not to mention the anxiety and small fortune to sort it out.

So where does that fit in? I recently saw an advert for a fountain pen which was cheaper than a cup of coffee so I decided to try it out. I ordered the pen, paid the postage and it duly arrived. I bought a small bottle of ink from Office Works, filled the pen, and started writing.

Initially it was like the proverbial hen scratching but with a bit of practice my scribbling became more legible. I found that I enjoyed it. After a bit more practice I started to research fountain pens and found a whole new world.

Fountain pens have come a long way. They vary in price from a few dollars to a few thousand, and more. Fountain pens, like other things have different brands. There are cheaper Chinese imports, (which tend to be copies of the European brands but at a more affordable price), European, mainly German and French, as well as Japanese and others. The main issue I have found with the Chinese imports is waiting for them to arrive in the post.

In general, most fountain pens come with either a Fine or Medium nib which fits the way most people write, but there's a variety of different nibs ranging from Extra Fine to Broad along with specialist nibs for drawing and calligraphy. There are even fountain pens which act like ballpoint pens in that you click on the end to expose the nib.

Handwriting is becoming a dying art. Research has shown that writing with a fountain pen can improve cognitive function and improve overall mental health. Physically writing forces the brain to think about what you want to say and how you want to say it.

There's no Spell Check, Grammar Check or any other conveniences of the computer and who doesn't remember how they felt when they received a letter in the post telling them all the latest family, or other gossip. It certainly wasn't called snail mail for nothing.

The more you write the better your handwriting becomes. Keep a journal, write your shopping list, start that novel you've always promised yourself or just write whatever comes into your head.

Which pen should you buy? Once again, I researched on YouTube. I looked at the different brands and was able to get comparisons on how they looked and performed. As pens and nibs have evolved so has ink. No longer do we have just black and blue but there's now a whole rainbow to choose from and just as many producers, again varying in size of the bottle and price.

I have purchased several small bottles in various colours online to sample how they perform. It can be fun to see a letter written in turquoise or violet. Ink is delivered to the nib by either a disposable cartridge or a refillable tube in the pen called a converter. This has the advantage of being able to choose which ink, and which colour you want to write with as cartridges generally only come in the basic colours.

Handwriting in general is becoming a dying art and will become so unless we keep it from doing so. Australia Post currently charges \$1.20 for a stamp, less for pensioners. They are already talking about reducing the number of letters delivered to our homes so let's get writing and at least keep your local postie in a job.

Bush Fire Season ends for NSW

The end of April marked the end of the 2022-2023 Bush Fire Season for New South Wales

Commissioner of the RFS Rob Rogers said the Bush Fire Danger Period was extended for several weeks from the end of March in parts of the state due to high fuel loads and warmer than average temperatures.

"We saw an increase in activity late in the season, with significant fires in Narrabri, Mudgee and Upper Lachlan LGAs," he said.

"Across the season, firefighters have worked on more than 24,800 bush and grass fires which burnt through over 116,000 hectares.

"March was our busiest month, with firefighters responding to over 2800 incidents, which accounted for almost 50% of the total hectares burnt across the whole fire season.

"We also sadly saw the loss of eight homes, 15 outbuildings and hundreds of livestock across firegrounds, however hundreds more homes and buildings were saved due to the actions of firefighters and landholders.

"Whilst the bush fire season has

ended, this doesn't mean the risk of fire has, with the shift from recent wet weather to drier conditions already being seen across much of NSW."

Commissioner Rogers reminded landholders and residents about the importance of maintaining their property throughout the year and to be vigilant when using fire on their property.

"With a warm and dry winter predicted, there is a real risk of fires occurring across the cooler months this year," he said.

"Landholders must know their obligations if conducting burns and know the costs if you do the wrong thing, but most importantly, if a fire does get out of hand, make sure you report it immediately to Triple Zero (000)."

Commissioner Rogers noted that the 2022-2023 fire season has been the busiest period of fire activity since the 2019-2020 Black Summer fires.
