

"The statement also acknowledged the impacts climate change will have on First Nations communities and the importance of working with Indigenous people to successfully design and implement adaption and

Lentil & Brown Rice Soup

- \circ 5 cups vegetable stock
- \circ 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ cups red lentils
- \circ 1 cup brown rice
- \circ 1 can diced tomatoes

- o 2 -3 carrots, diced
- \circ 1 onion diced
- \circ 1 stalk finely chopped celery
- 3 cloves minced garlic
- Handfuls of fresh basil, oregano, thyme, parsley and a bayleaf

- Pinch salt
- Combine everything except parsley and vinegar in pot and bring to boil
- Simmer, covered, stirring occasionally for 45 -55 minutes until lentils and rice tender
- Stir in parsley and vinegar.
- Optional: Service with a generous sprinkle of grated parmesan cheese




