Free broadband access for disadvantaged students

The Albanese Government will provide up to 30,000 Australian families with no internet at home free broadband for one year, as part of our plan for a better National Broadband Network (NBN).

The School Student Broadband Initiative (SSBI) will provide the opportunity for eligible school students to benefit from fast internet at home to support their education. More than 1,000 Australian families have already benefitted from home broadband connections set up under the initiative.

Those working closest with families and students, including State and Territory education bodies, selected charities, and community organisations, will identify families and support them to access the free service.

NBN Co is implementing this target affordability initiative with the support of a \$4.5 million commitment in the October 2022-23 Federal Budget.

The one-year of free services begins from the day the service is activated.

The SSBI is part of the Albanese Government's commitment to narrow the digital divide, including by making full-fibre NBN access available to an additional 1.5 million premises – 660,000 of which will be in regional areas – and working to support First Nations Australians digital inclusion through the formation of the First Nations Digital Inclusion Advisory Group.

Community Emergency Communication Radio Rollout Progressing


The aim of the CB radio system is to provide backup communications during emergencies such as bushfires, floods and storms, when power is interrupted, roads blocked and access limited. This will help communications between residents and emergency services and ensure that residents needs are addressed and emergency services can better target their efforts and get warnings through to residents.

A grant was obtained through the Commonwealth Government BSBR program to fund the supply and installation of a CB Radio and backup battery to participating households.

To date there are over 80 installations either completed or scheduled to be finalised and additional participants are being queued for following rounds of installations. There are also hand held radios being deployed in select situations.

Testing of the system has proven that the locations of the radios has enabled continuity of communications along the extent of the current installations, eg between Mangrove Mountain and Gunderman.

One, at a point about halfway between the bottom of the divi and Tarbay Creek will soon be eliminated when CB's are installed in properties in the area but the second, between the Letter A and the intersection of Bloodtree Rd & George Downes Dr., will require more residents in that area to join in the program.

There also is no coverage south of Peats Ridge Public School to Mt White, so if you live in that area you are encouraged to participate.

The CB radio network is a system of last resort. The basic aims are:

- · Ability to contact someone who can call 000
- Check on neighbours or vulnerable
- · Receive warnings and guides on what action to take
- Provide feedback to emergency services
- · Disseminate information provided by emergency services

Liaison is in progress with emergency and government services such as SES, RFS, Police, Local Area Health, LLS, Council, Red Cross, NEMA and

Protocols for communicating with these organisations are in the early stages of development.

One training session has been held and more are to be scheduled. User guides and communication protocols are being pepared.

July in the garden:

There's no excuse not to be spending time in the garden in the glorious winter sunshine. Even though we desperately



need rain (hard to believe that this time last year we were flooded in) there's lots to keep us busy. Mulching, tidying, pruning roses, preparing lawns for spring, keeping watch for winter pests, and also making sure you are watering well, given the current lack of rain.

Winter warmer recipe:

I visited a friend yesterday and she served the most delicious Moroccan cauliflower. I convinced her to part with the recipe:

Spicy Moroccan Cauliflower

- 1 large cauliflower
- 2 tbs olive oil
- 1/2 tsp dried chilli flakes
- 1 tsp ground cumin
- 2 tsp moroccan seasoning
- 1 tsp sumac
- 1 lemon
- 3/4 cup plain Greek-style yoghurt
- 1/3 cup tahini

Preheat oven to 200°C. Combine spices in a bowl. Drizzle oil over cauliflower and sprinkle with spices. Place in baking dish and pour 1/2 cup water into pan and cover with foil. Bake for 25 minutes. Remove foil and bake for a further 20 minutes. Or, skip this step and cook in air fryer!

Place spinach leaves onto a serving platter, then cauliflower.

Combine yoghurt, tahini, lemon juice, sumac, salt and pepper, in a bowl and pour over cauliflower to serve. (or you can cheat and mix a pre-bought garlic dip with hummus, and add a



When Will Wisemans Ferry Road be Repaired?

A Prospectus developed by Central Coast Council and released in October 2022 identified a number of what are described as "Key Enabling Projects". One of these is the restoration of Wisemans Ferry Road.

The prospectus details are as follows:

Overview

Wisemans Ferry Road is a twolane road that connects M1 Pacific Motorway at Kariong to the ferry crossing over the Hawkesbury River at Wisemans Ferry. This road provides the main access to the remote communities of Spencer, Lower Mangrove and Gunderman and is critical to other Mangrove Mountain communities.

Apart from the Hawkesbury River Bridge the M1 Pacific Motorway and the adjacent Pacific Highway Bridge, the Wisemans Ferry Road ferry crossing is the only other crossing point on the Hawkesbury River for vehicles. It also attracts tourists with a rich convict and colonial heritage along this scenic

route through the hinterland of the Central Coast as well as visitors to the adjacent Dharug and Yengo National Parks.

In February 2012, two sections of road embankment failed on Wisemans Ferry Road at Gunderman. As a result of the high cost of reinstating the two travel lanes a semi-permanent closure of one lane at both sites remains in place. As a result of the natural disasters and storm events of 2022, a number of sites along Wisemans Ferry Road experienced significant damage to the road pavement and embankments with landslides and rockfalls occurring at multiple locations.

CSP Objective

Responsible - Solve road and drainage problem areas and partner with the State Government to improve road conditions across the region.

Benefits

- This project will provide improved access and safety for road users in delivering an enhanced road link between Sydney and the Central Coast.
- The reinstatement of this road is vital to enable this transportation to continue and fully realise the full potential of this essential road corridor.

Project Timeline

A year timeframe for consultation and design of these road works before moving into construction over a two-year timeframe, subject to final design.

The construction of these road works which include bank stabilisation, drainage improvements, pavement widening and carriage construction would commence following execution of a funding agreement.

What is sought from Government?

Contribution of \$10,000,000 to allow for the full restoration of two travel lanes on Wisemans Ferry Road at both embankment failure sites.

The NSW Government support Council's submission under the Regional Road Transfer and Road Classification Review for Wisemans Ferry Road, from Peats Ridge Road to Wisemans Ferry seeking transfer from a Regional Road to a State Road.



It should be noted that there are more than just two locations where the road is reduced to one lane. Central Coast Council has a program to fund a network of roadworks from Capital Funds but all are east of the M1. Wisemans Ferry Road, with the first lane closure dating back to 2007, has all the major roadworks planned pending funding from future grants.

Continuing past practice, the repair and upgrade of this road is a political football forever being passed around

Project Firestorm: Design Thinking for Bush Fire Resilience

Bush fire education in NSW receives a boost with new professional learning course for teachers

From fire-hunting robots to fatiguedetecting goggles, students across New South Wales will be tasked with developing innovative solutions for challenges related to bush fires under an expanded Project Firestorm.

NSW teachers will have access to a new professional learning course as part of Project Firestorm, an awardwinning integrated STEM unit of work for Stage 3 students.

With support from the Office of the NSW Chief Scientist & Engineer, the RFS is launching Project Firestorm: Design Thinking for Bush Fire NESA-accredited Resilience, a professional development course designed to equip teachers with the skills to deliver Project Firestorm in their classrooms.

Commissioner of the RFS, Rob Rogers, said the program is an interactive way for students to become leaders and advocates in bush fire preparation, survival and recovery.



"Project Firestorm is an opportunity for the RFS to help students understand the complexity of disasters and how they can affect their local community," Commissioner Rogers said.

"It challenges students to apply design thinking to solve an authentic problem for their context in relation to bushfire detection, response and management."

NSW Chief Scientist & Engineer Professor Hugh Durrant-Whyte said Project Firestorm was a great example of how students undertaking STEM subjects can be inspired by tackling real-world problems.

"Projects like this give our best young minds a real appreciation of the impact that science can have in our

everyday lives," Professor Durrant-Whyte said.

"My hope is that some of those participating will choose to continue further studies through to university and eventually become part of our next generation of scientists and technologists."

Project Firestorm: Design Thinking for Bush Fire Resilience will be delivered in eight locations across NSW during Terms 3 and 4.

Tim said. 'We lease unused paddocks in the local area and convert them to nourishing food-producing land. We manage three farms and we also lease some crown land in at Tuggerah — 250 acres of culturally significant land, and that's where our main beef herd is. It's really cool to be custodians of that for now. Considering what we do, and how we connect with people, looking after that incredibly sensitive environmental land throughout our farming system is really special.'

The Food Farm supplies beef and pasture-raised chicken and eggs up and down the east coast of NSW. Every week, Tim and Hannah attend popular farmers' markets in Gosford, and at Carriageworks in Redfern, where they have formed strong relationships with customers who care about being connected to the food they eat.

'Soil connects us all, whether we're living in the country or the city,' said Tim. 'It's where we get our food, and our shared landscape. Even if there's a layer of concrete, we're still on it. It's there, even if we've covered it up. That's people's wounds and problems, too. It's still under there, and it's what we build on.'

Farming the valley is part of a deeper healing journey for Tim. Trauma in his

early life eventually led to a radical shift in his approach to agriculture, and today he is clear-eyed about facing life's difficulties holistically, in order to evolve and create change for the better.

'I've been through so many different models—at work and in my personal life. Now being in regenerative agriculture, I feel complete and whole as a person, because our landscape does as well. I was always battling a lot as I grew up, and then I was practicing conventional agriculture. It feels much better doing what we do now'.

Even with the challenges of climate change, Tim believes nature has the solution, if we can just pay close attention

'I aim to look for beauty in nature, even in natural disasters, rather than thinking it's out to get us. My take on it—so that I can get through another thirty years of farming—is to notice the beauty in how nature performs. Accept that these things happen. We all have big emotions and big energies that we put out into the world, and it affects people. It's the same as nature.'

Despite plenty of opportunities to leave the valley, Tim has decided to stay. 'In a way, I definitely see that my role here will move into that

space of men owning who they are and becoming better people. Doing that, in this landscape and in this area, is something I'm called to, I think. I wouldn't want to run away from it.'
