Free CB Radio for Eligible Residents as Part of Emergency Communications Network

The Commonwealth Government, through the Black Summer Bushfire Resilience Grants program has provided funding to support a community let program to establish an emergency communications system using UHF CB Radios.

The objective of the CB Radio network is to provide a means for people to communicate during emergencies and disasters.

Community members, working together can seek help, get help and provide help to each other during disasters and emergencies. We can support each other until emergency services and government departments are able to mobilise and respond.

The system enables a channel for critical information to be exchanged between disaster response agencies and the local community.

Radio base stations have been installed at various locations between Gunderman through to Bucketty and hand held units have also been deployed in the region.

Testing has proven that the system functions well even in some of the most radio unfriendly terrain in the region.

The project is overseen by the Mangrove Emergency Planning and Communications Committee Inc. (MEPCC) and is being managed by a project team made up of volunteers from the areas where the system is being deployed.

The objective of the MEPCC is to help prepare the community for all emergencies, including bushfires, storms, floods and disease outbreaks (such as Equine Influenza and Newcastle Disease).

The MEPCC was established following the 1994 bushfires and pursuant to the Royal Commission recommendation that our local community should accept responsibility for organizing and conducting its own contingency plans in conjunction with

Proposed Closure of Kesbys Point Road, Kulnura.

The NSW Crown Lands agency has received a Road Closure application by an adjoining landowner to Kesbys Point Road, Kulnura. This is to be advertised in a local publication. This public way existed before the surrounding properties were even surveyed and granted. Kesbys Point Road was an original European Settler route into the Kulnura area. Before that it was likely an indigenous peoples travel line, following a spur up from Mangrove Creek. The road leads to a sublime lookout, Kesbys Point, above Mangrove Creek. It gives access to a beautiful and pristine area of native

This proposed road closure means the loss of direct and practical access to the northwestern section of MacPherson State Forest, as well as a notable part of our local amenity. For many years Kesbys Point Road has been used by all manner of people, including neighbours, Hinterland and Central Coast residents, and folk from further afield for both passive and active recreation pursuits such as walking, horse-riding, mountain bike riding, landscape painting, bird watching, youth group activities, meditation, and more.

FOCUS ON BUSH AND GRASS FIRE THREAT AS FIRST AREAS COMMENCE DANGER PERIOD

Six Local Government Areas (LGA) in northern NSW commenced their Bush Fire Danger Period (BFDP) on 1 August, as warm and dry conditions increase the local fire risk.

Commissioner of the RFS Rob Rogers said while the statutory start date of the BFDP was 1 October, it was not uncommon for areas, particularly in the north of the state, to start the danger period early – but this year there was an increased risk in many areas due to recent conditions.

"After three years of wet weather, the bush fire risk is returning to NSW," Commissioner Rogers said.

"The wet weather has caused prolific grass growth, particularly west of the Great Dividing Range.

"After a dry July and recent frosts, these areas are drying out quickly, increasing the risk of fast-moving and high intensity grass fires."

While the focus over recent years has been on wet weather, Minister for Emergency Services Jihad Dib has

encouraged the community to shift their attention back to the risk of bush and grass fires.

"The Rural Fire Service has been working hard to prepare for the coming bushfire season, but we also encourage landholders and residents to take the time to prepare their homes, properties and families for the threat of fire," Mr Dib said.

"It is important to make or update your bushfire survival plan and have a conversation with your family to ensure everyone knows what they will do and where they will go if they are threatened by fire.

"Recent research by the RFS showed that 70 per cent of people living in bushfire prone areas have some sort of plan for what to do during a fire, but worryingly less than half had done any preparation work on their property.

"Doing simple things like cleaning your gutters, removing combustibles from your yard, and ensuring hoses can reach all corners of your property

can make a significant difference."

The LGAs that have entered the BFDP are Armidale Regional, Walcha, Uralla, Glen Innes Severn, Inverell and Tenterfield.

Landholders in these LGAs will now need to apply for a permit to burn off and notify their neighbours and local fire authorities 24 hours before lighting up. Permits are free and available by contacting your local Fire Control Centre.

Information about hazard reduction burning, obtaining permits and required notification is also available on the RFS website at www.rfs.nsw. gov.au/BFDP.







New online resources to help the community understand flood risks and be prepared

Central Coast Council has developed online flood risk tools and updated flood and emergency planning information on centralcoast.nsw.gov.au, to help the local community understand their own flood risk and be adequately prepared to respond.

Council Director Environment and Planning, Alice Howe said "Whilst it's not always possible to predict when, where, or how big the next flood will be - we can estimate the likelihood of different sizes of floods and their consequences by using computer flood modelling."

"Our new interactive online flood risk mapping tool for Tuggerah Lakes area, draws on current flood levels directly from the Bureau of Meteorology and converts it into a visual display, which shows the extent of current, minor, moderate or major flood levels for specific properties in the area. For residents in other areas, the region-wide online mapping tool provides a range of flood information on a visual map.

"Both these flood risk tools help the community, especially residents living in low lying areas or within a floodplain, to visualise potential flood impacts to their properties and



surrounding roads or access routes, and plan ahead to build resilience."

When These Mountains Speak

Alison and Michael moved from Sydney to the Central Coast without much of a plan, other than to find some affordable land. It was love at first sight when they saw the property at Jilliby, a gently sloping block, with views over a large dam and rolling hills, backed by natural forest.

'It's such a beautiful suburb,' said Alison. 'The open sky, the tree line, the sunsets and storms. I love the birds, watching eagles come in.'

Along with all this beauty, they saw potential in the land. 'We already had the small garden—Top Garden,' said Alison. 'But whenever we'd walk through the back paddock, Michael would say, "Imagine if this was all vegetables?"'

With the help of friends, they broke ground three years ago and have been planting and experimenting ever since. The lower grass field has been lovingly transformed into an abundant market garden, with sixteen beds, a polytunnel, greenhouse, and cool room. Together, Alison and Michael have created ALAN Foods—All Local, All Natural— supplying fresh organic produce to the local community.

A stroll down through the beds reveals a diverse array of vegetables and fruit trees. Drawing on permaculture principles, attention has been given to the slope of the land, hedgerows,

and companion planting, to help with drainage and shade.

'Michael and I are trying not to interfere as much as possible, trying to let things unfold naturally,' said Alison. 'It's a balance, though, because what we're doing isn't natural — you don't see rows of pak choi or carrots growing like this in nature. But by encouraging diversity as much as possible, we can

attract predatory insects and birds to try and curb the pest population.'

Alison, an exercise physiologist who worked in rehab, developed a connection with nature from a young age. 'My parents have a property at Yango Creek at the back of the Hunter—acreage in a steep valley, with a bit of an orchard. We always used to go up there on weekends and school holidays and run amok.'





Michael was an electrician working in Sydney. His nan and pop lived on the Central Coast, which inspired the move north, but he was also influenced by Alison's family.

"What's really important is community. I feel like I've always been working towards that. At first I didn't really know where I was going, but now I can see it more clearly. I'm still developing, though, and the land is allowing me to do that."

'I have an early memory of visiting that property when Alison and I just met,' he said. 'It was my first time there, and I was looking through their book collection and one green book jumped out. It was a book about permaculture. I remember reading it for days, thinking, "this is awesome!" It was an alternative way of living that



sustainable horticulture has created a deep connection to the land. With the arrival of baby daughter Bonnie, their roots in Jilliby grow deeper still.

'We've had a great community



I'd never heard about. It really put me on the path. I wasn't sure how to apply it, but I feel like we've been moving towards this ever since.'

Now full-time farmers, they acknowledge they still have much to learn, but their commitment to

response,' said Alison. 'We used to do a roadside stall on Fridays on Hue Hue Road and that was amazing, especially through Covid; it was very popular with the locals and there'd be cars lined up as we arrived to set up. Sometimes we'll be out at a café and someone will recognise us and say, 'Hey! You're from ALAN Foods!' and we'll be amazed. The reach is far, which is pretty cool.'

'The more we do, the more positive feedback we get and it spurs us on,' said Michael.

'What's really important is community. I feel like I've always been working towards that. At first I didn't really know where I was going, but now I can see it more clearly. I'm still developing, though, and the land is allowing me to do that.'
