Mountain Districts Community Begins Preparing a Community Led Emergency Plan

Disasters can happen any time of the year. Some of the most common hazards include bushfires, floods, heatwaves, landslides, severe weather (storms, cyclones, east coast lows), even biosecurity issues (eg Newcastle disease).

Following on from the series of community engagement events led by the Red Cross and supported by the NSW DPI, community members have begun work on developing a community led emergency plan.

Being community led ensures that issues of greatest concern to local residents are included and adequately addressed.

The emergency plan will deal with getting prepared, identifying actions to be implemented as an emergency event unfolds and steps to take once the emergency has passed.

The process is in part a team building exercise that draws the community together around this serious issue and is aimed at improving community resilience, reducing the impact of disasters and accelerating recovery post-disaster.

Local communities know their history, risks, people, resources, capacities and geographical location better than anyone from outside the community and by taking on a level of responsibility for their own emergency preparedness, response and disaster recovery can gain economic, social and environmental benefits.

A team of Ironbark Rd residents led by Anne Graham has been contacting other residents along the road to gather information about the number of residents, basic contact details, availability of transport, special needs, current preparedness, what help may be needed and if they would be able to provide help to others.

Emergency planning is an iterative process and an emergency plan is not a static document but is regularly reviewed and updated with feedback from lessons learnt, actual life experiences, risk assessments and new data and technology. Because of the inherent uncertainty, plans need to be flexible and adaptive.

Effective communication is a critical component of emergency planning. There is a need to disseminate information while planning and preparing and to have communication channels available during emergencies. The CB Radio emergency communications network will be integrated into the emergency plan.

The emergency planning process requires the involvement of emergency services, government bodies, not-forprofit groups and private organisations and helps communities establish working partnerships with these bodies.

More meetings will be held in the New Year to progress the development of the emergency plan and establish more local teams.

Council Financial Sustainability Strategy Will the Special Rate increase be made permanent?

Council's 2023-2024 Draft Financial Sustainability Strategy and revised Long-Term Financial Plan (LTFP) were accepted at Council's ordinary November meeting – signalling Council's confidence in moving from financial 'recovery' to 'sustainability'.

The new Financial Sustainability Strategy (Strategy) identifies highlevel actions that Council must take to sustain a positive operating result position, and to maintain an adequate level of unrestricted cash to support operating activities and the required investment in assets.

Council CEO David Farmer said Council is moving into an exciting, yet challenging, period as it works to build on the last three years' successful implementation of restoring Council's financial position to enable Council to operate, repay emergency loans and meet other financial obligations.

"As we have said before, Council is now out of crisis, and so we have some clear air to start implementing the Strategy that isn't just monitoring, but rather being proactive."

The objectives of the Strategy are to:

- Set the parameters within which Council agrees to operate to provide financial sustainability, affordability, delivery and value for money, over the short, medium and longer term
- Ensure Council generates enough revenue, and controls services and

infrastructure costs, to produce sufficient cash from operations

- Ensure Council maintains sufficient cash (or access to cash) to meet the needs of operations, investments and financing
- Ensure Council can renew or replace assets to maintain the desired level of service and provide new assets to meet demand for growth in services
- Assist Council to use ratepayers' money, together with other funding available, to provide core and other prioritised services
- Provide direction and context for decision making in the allocation, management and use of Council's finite financial resources
- · Guide the elected Council and staff



in the management of its LTFP and determine financial boundaries for delivery of operational and capital plans.

"Our previous strategy looked at the key metrics to manage day to day, but we are now looking 10 years into the future identifying the challenges and then identifying actions to ensure that 2020's financial crisis cannot happen again.

"Community consultation will continue to be an important factor in planning capital works and community needs, and Council will continue to seek funding from external sources, including both state and federal governments.

"However, like most other councils, our challenge to attain and maintain a sustainable operating position will be to look at ways to balance revenue with expenditure.

"Central Coast Council has the unique situation of two of its major income streams currently having expiry deadlines and under the current regime will require applications to IPART to be maintained. A failure to maintain this current level of income will see Council in serious financial problems again. We have seen what the impact of this is on the Council and the community, so we want to ensure that this does not happen

again.

"The preferred Scenario 3 sees Council taking action to maintain income at its current levels and keeping its expenditure on track via ongoing savings.

"While we see small deficits in the final years of the model, they are within tolerable margins of error and positive unrestricted funds are maintained throughout the life of the model." Mr Farmer said.

As reported at Council's October ordinary Council meeting, Council met key government benchmarks for operating results and cash levels, and Council's audited financial statements were delivered on-time this year for the first time since the merger, an indication of Council's growing competence.

Council Administrator Rik Hart said he congratulates the Council team in putting together the Strategy, and the community and stakeholder partners should be confident in the adopted 2023-2024 Strategy.

"We manage assets valued at over \$9.4 billion on behalf of the Central Coast community, so the responsibility of being financially sustainable is enormous. It is also my responsibility to ensure I hand over a financially sustainable organisation to the incoming new Council in September

Council seeking feedback on water and sewer plans for the future

Central Coast Council Water and Sewer is seeking feedback from residents and businesses on the small urban and rural communities across the Central Coast that do not have access to Council's water and/or sewerage services. These are known as 'unserviced properties'.

The two surveys build upon earlier

engagement with the community and will inform development of Council's Water and Sewer Masterplan to deliver services for our customers into the future

Council Director for Water and Sewer Jamie Loader said the first survey is being conducted with the wider community, with a separate survey to follow with owners of 'unserviced properties'.

"The surveys provide opportunities for the community to contribute to planning to ensure safe and reliable water and sewer services meets the needs of our customers. Council is developing knowledge across the community of its water and sewer systems and is keen to understand community interest for including connection of 'unserviced properties'

into our future plans." Mr Loader said.

Council Administrator Rik Hart welcomes the continued engagement and commitment to listen to our customers.

"The surveys are another opportunity for the community to assist Council in developing plans for the future that meet customer expectations," Mr Hart said.

The first survey, targeting owners of serviced properties, opened on 23 November and ends 14 December 2023, followed by a targeted survey to owners of 'unserviced properties' in January 2024.

HELPING SMALL BUSINESSES STAY CYBERSECURE

A new digital resource, called ID Support (visit www.nsw.gov. au/id-support-nsw/small-business), aimed at helping protect NSW small businesses against identity theft and data breaches, has been launched by the NSW Government.

Designed to support businesses of all sizes, this digital resource and webpage features information and tips on how to stay cyber aware, as well as interactive learning modules and printable checklists. Member for Gosford, Liesl Tesch MP said it was important for small businesses to be proactive when tackling cybersecurity-related issues and to remain vigilant.

"Cyber security is of real concern to Australian small businesses. Even minor cybersecurity incidents can have lasting impacts on small businesses – and sometimes the effects of these incidents can be truly devastating. It's important to recognise that not every business is going to bounce back from the impact of what might appear to be a minor cyber security incident.

"In our increasingly digital world, it makes sense that small businesses would want to safeguard themselves against threats to their cyber security by arming themselves with information, skills and strategies.

"It's really pleasing to see – through initiatives such as ID Support from the NSW Government – that it's becoming easier for small businesses to locate and access the information and resources that could make a real difference to cybersecurity incident prevention."

An Australian Cyber Security Centre survey released in 2020 found 62 percent of small businesses across Australia have experienced a cyber security incident. Almost half of those surveyed rated their understanding of cyber security as 'average' or 'below average' and had poor cyber security practices.

Another initiative being undertaken by the NSW Government to help protect NSW residents online and build cyber security awareness is the release of a new type of 'credential technology' that will benefit holders of MyServiceNSW accounts.

This new feature informs people if their ServiceNSW login credentials have been compromised. This complements the new Password Strength Tester, launched earlier this month, which helps people create strong passwords and check whether their password has previously been disclosed in a data breach or leak.

Community members are also encouraged to visit Ms Tesch's office at 20 Blackwall Road, Woy Woy to pick up a copy of 'The Little Black Book of Scams', an internationally recognised resource to help the community learn about scams.

CB Radio Network Update

The community CB Radio rollout is continuing, with a break over the Christmas period and then resuming in Jan '24.

Two training sessions have been held to explain the operation of the radios and the do's and dont's of talking on air and more will be scheduled.

Fire Fighting Units

The Australian Government BSBR Grants authority has approved a variation for the purchase of four fire fighting units. Two types of units are bring purchased, a high pressure sprayer slip on unit that frame mounted and can be placed on the back of a ute and the other a self contained trailer unit.

Two trailer type units of 800l capacity will be deployed in the Burralong Valley area in Laguna and the Berecry Rd area in Mangrove Mountain will receive one 1000l trailer unit and one 6001 high pressure slip on unit.

Both groups will be paired with the CB Radio system to allow communication and coordination.
