New exemption makes it easier for farmers to fight fires

Transport for NSW and the NSW Rural Fire Service have partnered to launch a trial registration exemption for farmers to help rural firefighting efforts this bushfire season.

Farmers can play a key role in protecting their own or neighbouring properties in the event of a bush or a grass fire, particularly before emergency response personnel are able to attend the fire.

Now, during a trial period that ends on 31 March, the NSW Government is allowing farmers to drive vehicles they use for firefighting purposes unregistered within a 100km radius of their home. Farm Fire Fighting Vehicles (FFFVs) tend to be vehicles used to move around farm properties and not on public roads, and therefore may not be registered. The legal use of these vehicles on public roads to attend nearby fires is an important change during the final few months of the bushfire season, and is something many farmers and rural advocates have been calling for.

The RFS has recognised the value of these vehicles and the important role farmers play in firefighting efforts in rural areas. As well as staying within a 100km radius of the storage address, the vehicle must be maintained in a safe operating condition and have fire-fighting equipment permanently attached to be eligible for the exemption. The trial will run until 31 March 2024 and will inform future options for FFFVs.

Farmers can also contact Service NSW <u>https://www.service.nsw.gov.</u> <u>au</u> on 13 77 88 or visit their nearest Service NSW centre. Minister for Roads John Graham said: "The Labor Government is committed to exploring innovative solutions to help out with rural firefighting efforts and this trial will do just that. "For the duration of the trial, farmers will see the removal of red tape that will allow them to ready vehicles for protecting land, property, stocks and crops.

"The mosquito fleet as it's affectionately known, has been an incredible asset for regional, rural and remote areas and I am glad the Labor Government is supporting the farmers to continue their vital, life saving work."

Minister for Emergency Services Jihad Dib said: "Landholders in rural areas can play a key firefighting role and this trial allows us to test an arrangement that rural advocates have been calling for. "February and March could be challenging months for bush and grass fires, and it is expected this

exemption will make it easier for landholders to fight fires on or near their properties. "This trial reflects our commitment to strengthening community safety and resilience, particularly in rural bush and grassfire-prone regions."

Commissioner of the RFS Rob Rogers said: "Landowners with these vehicles and equipment play a critical role as initial responders to grass fires. "This will lead to an even more integrated relationship between farmers and the RFS, leveraging all available resources and the expertise and dedication of farmers in safeguarding our communities."

NSW Farmers Rural Affairs committee member Garry Grant said: "Stopping fires as soon as we can

to minimise damage and loss is the ultimate goal. "The opportunity to take part in this trial will see the important relationship between the RFS and farmers develop even further."

School Buses: Will Timely Action Be taken?

Recently the NSW Bus Industry Taskforce handed down it's second report into NSW bus services.

The second report outlines a plan to fix the deterioration of bus services that carry 40 per cent of all public transport passengers but receive only 2 per cent of capital expenditure in transport.

Two of the recommendations are:

1. Immediately addressing more than a decade of neglect of investment in school and local bus services and additional frequent and local services to areas with no or very poor service levels

2. A renewed focus within Transport for NSW on better asset management, risk management and safety outcomes, and,

When will action be taken?

On the 8/3/24, my sin was injured on the bus while on the way to school. This is the second school bus incident in our area where children have been injured. I penned this email to our State & Federal MP's:

Dear Liesl & Gordon,

My son travels to and from school on a local bus. Today on the trip to school the bus driver braked hard to stop to pick up another student and my son, who had been seated on the seat at back of the bus, was thrown forward down the isle. After completing the pickup and checking on my son, the bus driver then continued to the school where school staff took care of him. I later picked him up and took him to the local doctor for a checkup.

My son has suffered severe bruising and injuries to his leg, arms and head. Other children on the bus were also hurt.

After the spate of fatal bus accidents highlighted in the media there had been discussion about fitting seat belts to school buses. This seems to have all been forgotten.

Cars and trucks are mandated to have seat belts, air bags and other safety devices and drivers and passengers are obligated to wear seat belts and face hefty penalties for not complying. It seems however that children, among the most vulnerable in our society are forgotten. The school buses in this district are travelling at speed and whilst bus drivers may take care, there will be the inevitable situation where emergency action is required or other vehicles collide with school buses. There had been some comment that it would too expensive to fit all buses with seat belts and if only selected buses were fitted, too difficult to schedule those buses for school runs. Not a good enough excuse. We need seat belts fitted to all school buses. We need seat belts fitted ASAP. We need seat belts fitted before there is serious injury. We need seat belts fitted before there is a fatality.

The NSW Government Ministerial release states "The 204-page Bus Industry Taskforce report calls for modern, fit for purpose bus contracts in the regions. The outdated contract model has meant bus services in rural and regional NSW have not been given the same degree of attention as services in Sydney."

"Local Government also plays a critical role in how bus services are delivered which can be improved by identifying funding options and streamlining delegations to speed up decisions that improve local roads and footpaths for bus users, pedestrians, and cyclists."

"The report makes clear more work needs to be done to better plan and manage essential transport infrastructure. including depots, facilities, bus stops and supporting technology.'

"Safety of bus services remains a top priority of the Taskforce, with a multi-year campaign to promote seatbelt use on buses already underway."

"Work is also continuing on options for safety improvements for standing passengers on buses, including consideration of whether an 80km/h rule for dedicated school bus services could be rolled out to all services.'

Transport Minister Jo Haylen said: "The Second Bus Taskforce report will deliver the biggest improvement to bus services that NSW has seen in

a generation."

"For too long bus services have been the forgotten mode of Transport in NSW. They carry more than 40 per cent of passengers but are lucky to get more than 2 per cent of capital investment. This must change. Tens of thousands of passengers rely on the bus network and we need to do better."

"Too many growing communities were neglected because the former government had no plan for what their future bus services would look like. We now have plan to make sure those communities get the bus services they need."

Howard Collins has already been appointed as the Coordinator General, reporting directly to the Secretary of Transport for NSW, centralising responsibility for bus operations within one area.

Josh Murray is the Secretary, Transport for NSW where he leads a team of more than 29,000 people dedicated to running reliable, essential daily transport services and operations to connect people right across NSW.
