Constitutional Referendum on Councillor and Ward numbers

A Constitutional Referendum to determine the future number of Central Coast Councillors will be held at the same time as the local government election for Central Coast Council on 14 September 2024.


The Referendum had been previously postponed from 4 September 2021 due to the Public Inquiry about the Council.

The Central Coast Local Government area is currently divided into five wards, The Entrance, Wyong, Budgewoi, Gosford West and Gosford East, with 15 councillors. Each Ward votes for three Councillors but the Councillors act for the LGA as a whole.

Referendum question

Community members will be asked to vote on whether they feel the current structure of 15 Councillors should be reduced to nine Councillors.

The reduction of Councillor numbers would also require the reduction of Wards in the Central Coast Local Government from five to three, with




each Ward to be represented by three Councillors.

Councillor roles and responsibilities

Councillors are the governing body of a council, similar to how a Board of Directors is the governing body of a private corporation. Councillors elect the Mayor.

Councillors are expected to represent the views of the whole community (key stakeholders) while making decisions in their interests, demonstrate conduct that the community expects and deserves, and plan and oversee the running of a significant and complex business of Council.

Currently, the Administrator of Central Coast Council, Rik Hart, constitutes the Council and must perform all the functions, powers and duties of the Council, which must be treated as if they were performed by the Council. The Administrator effectively

acts as the Mayor and the Councillors. This means the Administrator conducts the Council Meetings and undertakes the administrative, civic and ceremonial functions of the governing body.

The "For and Against" arguments presented by the council are simplistic and the issues should be considered in much greater depth. The comparison of the options (15 vs 9 Councillors), is broken up into four areas:

Decision making -

- A larger number of Councillors may lead to less cohesion and poorer decision making.
- Reducing the number of Councillors may lead to greater cohesion and improved decision making.

Representation -

- Reducing the number of Councillors may mean that electors feel they are not adequately represented.
- A larger number of Councillors may mean that electors feel they are adequately represented.

Costs .

- A larger number of Councillors will be an ongoing cost for Council.
- Reducing the number of Councillors will provide an ongoing cost saving for Council.

Diversity -

- Reducing the number of Councillors may mean there is less diversity on Council with fewer different points of view.
- A larger number of Councillors may mean there is more diversity on Council with different points of view.

Regarding costs, Councillors are paid \$34,000 per annum. So for 15 councillors the total would be \$510,000 or \$306,000 for 9 councillors. The difference, \$204,000, is not really significant considering the total annual expenses are around \$730million (2024 FY). Also, after the administration is ended, there will be no Administrator's salary.

Notification of wild dog and fox control program

Greater Sydney Local Land Services will be leading an integrated wild dog and fox control program in the Central Coast with support from NSW National Parks & Wildlife Service, Central Coast Council and the Forestry Corporation. This coordinated program is part of ongoing work to reduce pest animal numbers and their impact on primary production and native wildlife in these areas.

1080 wild dog and fox ground baits and Canid Pest Ejectors will be used on the listed properties below from **Tuesday 23 April to Friday 31 May**. Pets and working dogs may be affected (1080 is lethal to cats and dogs). **Please restrain all domestic pets and working dogs and ensure they do not enter the baiting locations during this time**. In the event of accidental poisoning of domestic pets seek immediate veterinary assistance.

Revised dates for Public Hearings on reclassification of community land

Revised dates and venue changes have been announced for the two public hearings into the reclassification of 10 Council owned properties from community to operational.

As previously advised, the sites to be reclassified were reviewed by Council in 2023 and the choice of sites was streamlined to ensure that only sites with the highest level of community benefit were included.

Most of the sites will continue to remain in community ownership in the future, being either retained in Council ownership or transferred to well-established locally based community organisation that provide valued recreational, sporting or accommodation facilities.

One property will be sold on the open market with the proceeds of sale being used to fund a new community centre. Both the property to be sold and its replacement are located at Norah Head.

The reclassification of some of the other sites will allow vital road upgrade projects to proceed in the fast-growing northern sector of our area.

The reclassification process is overseen by the NSW Government through the Minister for Planning, Housing and Infrastructure and there is an extensive series of public interest tests that must be met in order for the reclassifications to gain ministerial approval.

The 10 properties were on public exhibition from 20 February to 18 March 2024.

The revised dates and new venues for the public hearings are:

- Wednesday 8 May 2024 6pm 7.30pm at The Erina Centre (Erina Library)
- Thursday 9 May 2024 6pm
 7.30pm at Wyong Golf Club Auditorium

The public hearings are held in accordance with the Local Government Act 1993 and will be chaired by a person who is independent of Council.

The hearings will provide opportunities for the public to comment on the change of classification of the lands from community to operational, including the opportunity to make a short verbal presentation to the chairperson of the hearing. Written submissions will also be accepted by the chairperson.

Following the public hearings, the chairperson will prepare a report on the hearings, a copy of which will be

Born in the small village Frazzano' in the province of Messina, Sicily in Italy on the 14/2/1932 to Nuzia and Calogero.

Antonio was the second child of four having an older sister, Maria and a younger brother Lorenzo and a

and others. He bought a small farm in Calga in 1959. Living in Annandale at the time he came to his farm every weekend and that is when he met his wife to be, Valerie in 1962 they married in 1963.

During this time he worked for DMR on the Expressway. Until in 1964 the Dept. of Main Road acquired his farm for the new road to go through.

Tony and Val then settled in Ironbark Road Mangrove Mountain where they raised their 4 children,



younger sister Catena.

He worked on farms in Frazzano' until he was 23 years old. Then he and 5 others from the village came to Australia on board the Flaminia (an old army ship) to cut sugar cane in Cairns. He did that for 6 years, coming to Sydney when the cane season finished and going back the following year to cut more cane.

While in Sydney he worked in different jobs including IXL, the Waterboard, on Gladesville Bridge Carlo, Nancy, Paola and Catena. Their 13 grandchildren and 14 great grandchildren were also lucky enough to spend much of their time on the farm.

The day mum was taken from us was the hardest day of our lives, our family will never be the same without her.



Farmers Warned — Safety First Around Farm Vehicles After Three Deaths This Year

SafeWork NSW is reminding farmers to wear seatbelts, use helmets and choose the right vehicle when using side-by-side vehicles, quad bikes and motorcycles after a spate of incidents where people, including children, have been seriously injured or killed while using farm vehicles.

In the most recent incident on February 14 at Coonamble, SafeWork is investigating an incident where a 37-year-old man and a four-year old suffered serious injuries when ejected from a quad bike. Initial enquiries indicate that neither was wearing a helmet.

SafeWork is currently investigating three fatalities which have occurred since January 1, including:

 On January 8 in Goohli, a sideby-side vehicle being driven by an adult with two child passengers were mustering cattle when the ATV rolled into a dam trapping and causing the death of one of the child occupants. Initial enquiries indicate that none of the occupants may have been wearing their seatbelts.

- On January 25 in Narromine, a 51-year-old man died after being ejected from a moving side-byside vehicle while undertaking farm-related work. Again, initial enquiries suggest that the seatbelt was not being worn.
- On February 1, a 32-year-old female contractor was thrown from a motorbike and suffered fatal injuries on a property 120km east of Tibooburra while not wearing a helmet.

SafeWork is reminding people using side-by-side vehicles to use all available safety features, including wearing seatbelts and helmets which will help protect operators and passengers from fatal or serious injuries in case of roll over.

Since 2001, there have been more than 56 deaths in NSW from quad bike incidents. A further 20 people have died on side-by-side vehicles. Rollovers can occur even at low speeds and on flat terrain, leaving riders trapped, or crushed under the quad bike.

For farmers that continue to use quad bikes, SafeWork advise users to adhere to the manufacturer's instructions, particularly relating to load limits and keeping loads balanced. Heavy or unstable loads like chemical tanks for spraying can affect braking, alter the centre of gravity and make the vehicle difficult to control and more prone to rollover.

Head of SafeWork NSW, Trent Curtin said "A quad bike can weigh 400 kilos and reach speeds of more than 50 kilometres per hour. They are extremely dangerous and are certainly not a machine a child under the age of 16 should ever operate or be a passenger on.

"The safety features on your vehicle could save your life. It is an unnecessary tragedy when workers operating vehicles with numerous safety features including roll-over protective structures and seatbelts lose their lives by simply not wearing their seatbelt.

"Where SafeWork Inspectors come across workers operating side by side vehicles not wearing seatbelts or operating quad bikes without wearing helmets or having an operator protective device fitted, they will be taking a zero-tolerance approach and issue notices and fines."

The effects of Stress?
