Tougher penalties for environmental crimes

17th May 2024

The Central Coast will benefit from the NSW Government's introduction of landmark environmental reforms that ensure NSW has the strongest environmental regulations of any state or territory in Australia.

Central Coast Council's Acting Director Environment and Planning Luke Sulkowski, said the reforms to existing legislation are welcomed, agreeing an overhaul and tougher penalties were needed.

"It means that Council can take a tougher stance on environmental crimes, including being able to issue much higher on-the-spot fines for a range of offences including pollution offences and failing to comply with lawful directions and orders.

"For example, the on-the-spot fine amount for the pollution of waters was previously \$4000 for an individual and \$8000 for a corporation.

"The same offence now carries a monetary penalty of \$15,000 for an individual and \$30,000 for a corporation for a first offence, and \$22,500 for an individual and \$45,000 for a corporation for another offence.

"The same new monetary penalties apply to individuals and corporations who fail to comply with directions and orders issued under the POEO Act to remedy environmental nuisances and pollution." Mr Sulkowski said.

Council Elections and Community Representation

With the Central Coast Council elections and the referendum on the number of councillors and wards scheduled for September 2024 the report "Not so Simple: the origins and implications of Central Coast Council's 'financial calamity'" by Graham Sansom, Adjunct Professor, Institute for Public Policy and Governance, University of Technology Sydney makes for a compelling read.

The report offers a neutral assessment of the administration and the events leading up to it. A short timeline:

2016 - The Central Coast Council was established in May by a merger of the Gosford and Wyong LGA's.

2016 - Initially the LGA was governed by a state-appointed Administrator (Mr Ian Reynolds) and interim General Manager (Mr Rob Noble).

2017 - The first elected council and mayor took office in September 2017. 2018 - A 'permanent' Chief Executive Officer (Mr Gary Murphy) was engaged.

2020 - In late October 2020 the elected councillors were suspended by the state minister for local government, who appointed an Interim Administrator (Mr Dick Persson AM).

He took office at the beginning of November and soon after dismissed Mr Murphy, who was replaced by an interim CEO (Mr Rik Hart).

2021 - Mr Rik Hart takes over as administrator.

2022-MinisterforLocalGovernment, the Hon Wendy Tuckerman tabled the report into the Public Inquiry into Central Coast Council.

2022 - The Minister terminates all Councillors.

Professor Sansom's report concludes that the Interim Administrator laid almost all the blame for CCC's financial situation at the feet of the former CEO and Chief Financial Officer (CFO), and the councillors. It also states that "the current situation at Central Coast again demonstrates the fragility of local democracy in NSW, captured in the Minister's statement on 26 April: **'Public interest trumps democracy and we have to do what's best for the ratepayers.'** This begs the question: what about all the citizens?

Alone amongst the states, the NSW constitution defines local government as comprising 'elected or appointed' bodies, and there is now an ingrained tendency on both sides of state politics to replace elected councillors with appointed administrators when significant problems need to be addressed. The LG Act has been amended more than once to give the Minister alternative ways to intervene when necessary, yet suspension of

democratically elected councillors remains a regular occurrence."

The Minister for Local Government, at the time, the Hon Shelley Hancock MP, had the option of ending the administration and restoring the elected council under a PIO (Performance Improvement Order) overseen by a financial controller.

The Interim Administrator (Mr Dick Persson AM) has made clear his preference for a smaller number of elected councillors and opines that councillors should operate more like a 'board of directors'. Hence the 'constitutional referendum' to decide whether the number of councillors should be reduced from 15 to 9 and wards reduced from 5 to 3, although Mr Persson acknowledges that this change could not guarantee improved outcomes and performance.

The NSW Local Government Act 1993 (LG Act) provides a clear role for a council and councillors:

Section 222 Who comprise the governing body?

The elected representatives, called "councillors", comprise the governing body of the council.

Section 223 Role of governing body

(1) The role of the governing body is as follows—

(a) to direct and control the affairs of the council in accordance with this Act,

[through to]....

(k) to consult regularly with

community organisations and other key stakeholders and keep them informed of the council's decisions and activities,

(l) to be responsible for ensuring that the council acts honestly, efficiently and appropriately...

Section 232 The role of a councillor

(1) The role of a councillor is as follows—

(a) to be an active and contributing member of the governing body,

(b) to make considered and well informed decisions as a member of the governing body,

(c) to participate in the development of the integrated planning and reporting framework,

(d) to represent the collective interests of residents, ratepayers and the local community,

(e) to facilitate communication between the local community and the governing body,

(f) to uphold and represent accurately the policies and decisions of the governing body,

(g) to make all reasonable efforts to acquire and maintain the skills necessary to perform the role of a councillor.

(2) A councillor is accountable to the local community for the performance of the council.

It can be seen that under the LG Act a council is more than just a board of directors and is required to proactively represent the interests of residents, ratepayers and others in the LGA.

Do you think that ratepayers and residents will be effectively represented if there are fewer than 15 Councillors?

YOUR HEALTH Fresh, Pure Air

What is air?

By volume, dry air contains 78.09% nitrogen, 20.95% oxygen,[2] 0.93% argon, 0.04% carbon dioxide, and small amounts of other gases. Air also contains a variable amount of water vapour, on average around 1% at sea level, and 0.4% over the entire atmosphere. Air content and atmospheric pressure vary at different layers, and air suitable for use in photosynthesis by terrestrial plants and breathing of terrestrial animals is found only in Earth's troposphere and in artificial atmospheres.

How important is fresh, pure air to our wellbeing? Especially in our homes?

Many people live in closed houses with no windows open and no fresh are circulating through them.

Our lungs and whole body needs fresh, pure air each day, and especially in the night.

In the cool of the evening it may be necessary to guard against chilliness by extra clothing; but there should be a free circulation of pure air through the room during sleeping hours.

The free air of heaven, by day or night, is one of the richest blessings we can enjoy.

Many are suffering from disease because they refuse to receive into their rooms at night the pure night air.

Fresh air will purify the blood, refresh the body, and help to make it strong and healthy. The invigoration produced will be reflected upon the mind, imparting to it tone and clearness, as well as a degree of composure and serenity. It gives a healthful stimulus to the appetite, renders the digestion of food more perfect, and induces sound, sweet sleep.

Living in close, ill-ventilated rooms, weakens the system, makes the mind gloomy, the skin sallow, and the circulation feeble; the blood moves sluggishly, digestion is retarded, and the system is rendered peculiarly sensitive to cold. One should so accustom himself to fresh, cool air that he will not be affected by slight changes of temperature. Of course he should be careful not to sit in a draft or in a cold room when weary, or when in a perspiration. Regular exercise would induce the blood to the surface, and thus relieve the internal organs. To deprive the lungs of air, is like depriving the stomach of food. Air is the food that God has provided for the lungs. Welcome it; cultivate a love for it, as a precious gift of heaven.

In order to have good health, we must have good blood; for the blood is the current of life.

It repairs waste and nourishes the body. When supplied with the proper food elements and when cleansed and vitalised by contact with pure air, it carries life and vigour to every part of the system. The more perfect the circulation, the better will this work be accomplished.

- 83% of participants either not having developed their business work health and safety or feeling like they needed help in developing the framework.
- 56% of participants not having an emergency plan for their business,
- 45% of participants had not discussed work health and safety issues with their staff and
- 38% of participants did not have any work health and safety policies in place for their business.

The businesses completing the pilot



program found:

- For over 70%, it was the first time they had received on-farm advice and assistance in developing their work health and safety framework.
- 97% of farmers felt their understanding of work health and safety increased through the program.
- 97% of farmers felt the visit helped their business comply with obligations.
- 97% of farmers would recommend this program to other farming businesses.

Central Coast Water Rates to Rise 12% on 1 July 2024

• Central Coast Water Rates will have risen 51% in just 3 years

• A Typical Water Bill on the Central Coast will be 28% higher than Sydney Water, and 13% higher than Hunter Water

Central Coast Council will rubber stamp next year's water rate increase at its 28 May meeting, but ratepayer Kevin Brooks, who has campaigned against recent rate hikes, has been informed of the increase early after making queries to IPART about water pricing across the three main NSW water utilities (Sydney, Hunter and Central Coast).

Email from IPART confirming next year's increases indicates a typical water bill on the Central Coast will rise 11.9% from \$1,414 per year to \$1,582 per year on 1st July.

This means Central Coast water bills will have risen 51% in just 3 years.

In contrast, Sydney Water and Hunter Water will not be increasing prices at all next year. A typical water bill in Sydney remains \$1,232 and Hunter \$1,407.

This means Central Coast customers will be paying 28% more than Sydney customers for a worse service.





The village people were very kind to them giving fresh food like figs, oranges etc. The officials at the top of the army realised that Gallipoli was not a success and after eight months or so ordered an evacuation BUT this had to be done silently as they did not want the enemy to find out so during the night with silence all the soldiers were evacuated to Lemnos. A granddaughter of a nurse Sister Nell Pike spoke on the nurses experience and how horrific it was.

In 2020 the Lemnos Trail was formed and there are so many headstones of the fallen and the villagers to remember them named streets, hospital and even a football field ANZAC. This was a learning and interesting programme to watch.



Major planning changes coming into effect

The NSW Government's Transport Development planning Oriented reforms estimated to deliver 170,000 more well-located, well-designed and well-built homes throughout Sydney, the Illawarra, Hunter and Central Coast begin this month.

In December 2023, the Transport Oriented Development State Environmental Planning Policy (TOD SEPP) identified 31 stations across 13 local government areas, around which new housing is to be located within 400m.

During engagement with the Department of Planning Housing and Infrastructure, Central Coast Council has welcomed the opportunity to develop housing plans for existing TOD sites, while also requesting the addition of new sites.

As a result, Woy Woy Station has been selected to be included in this program. Woy Woy Station will join Gosford, Tuggerah and Wyong Stations in the TOD Program, as announced in December 2023.

Member for Gosford, Liesl Tesch MP has spoken of the desperate need for increased housing in our Central Coast community, "Access to affordable housing in our community is at an all-time low. Every day, I speak with people who are being pushed out of our community as they cannot afford to rent or buy in our community.

"We need more well-located homes to provide affordable housing within our community. We need to be encouraging more diverse housing types to ensure that our community's right to a safe home close to amenities is met. We need to ensure that these houses are built in areas close to infrastructure, community centres, green spaces and jobs. We need housing where our community can not only live, but live fulfilling lives.

"I really want people like the students I taught to be able to afford to buy homes, to be able to continue to live in the communities that they grew up with dignity and equity.

"Throughout the consultation process, consideration has been given to existing infrastructure capacity or planned upgrades that will support increased density. The TOD policy is designed to support more homes to be built near transport, jobs, services, night-life and open spaces.




