
Role of the Council and Councillors

Under the NSW Local Government Act 1993 (LG Act), the role of a Council includes:

- to direct and control the affairs of the council in accordance with this Act,
- to consult regularly with community organisations and other key stakeholders and keep them informed of the council's decisions and activities.
- to be responsible for ensuring that the council acts honestly, efficiently and appropriately.

Also, the role of each elected Councillor includes:

- to participate in the development of the integrated planning and reporting framework,
- to represent the collective interests of residents, ratepayers and the local community,
- to facilitate communication between the local community and the governing body,
- to uphold and represent accurately



the policies and decisions of the governing body,

And finally:

 A councillor is accountable to the local community for the performance of the council.

Democratic representation

According to the 2021 Census there are 346,596 people on the Central Coast with 263,967 over the age of 18.

In the conduct of their job Councillors would be expected to be open to dialogue and discussion with residents, particularly those able to vote in elections.

Fifteen councillors gives a ratio of about 18,000 voters to each councillor but with a reduction to nine councillors this increases to almost 30,000 voters to each councillor.

So a reduced number of councillors would make it extremely difficult for any Central Coast resident of voting



age to be heard.

In the past Councillors have attended meetings with various community groups as well as community functions and events.

To get effective engagement, fifteen Councillors would seem to be a minimum number (the local government Act requires there to be a minimum of five and a maximum of 15 councillors with any change requiring a constitutional referendum and ministerial approval).

Costs

Regarding costs, Councillors are paid \$34,000 per annum. So for 15 councillors the total would be \$510,000 or \$306,000 for 9 councillors. The difference, \$204,000, is not really significant considering the total annual Council expenses are around \$730million (2024 FY). Also, after the administration is ended, there will be no Administrator's salary.

Constitutional Referendum

The Constitutional Referendum to determine the future number of Central Coast Councillors will be held at the same time as the local government election for Central Coast Council on 14 September 2024.

The referendum will ask Central Coast voters to determine the following question:

Do you favour a reduction in the number of Central Coast Councillors from fifteen to nine? This will result in three Wards with each Ward electing three Councillors.'

Yes to reduce to nine councillors or No to keep fifteen councillors.

Which way will you vote?

Spencer Playspace to be Upgraded

With the upgrade of the iconic Pelican Park at Woy Woy, the nearby Anderson Park will be converted back to a grassed area and the children's play equipment moved to the Spencer waterfront. The play equipment had been installed in Anderson Park about two years ago and is in excellent condition.

Central Coast Council Director of Community and Recreation Services Mel Smith said the [Spencer] playground currently features only a swing set and picnic table.

"With the upgrade, the community will be able to enjoy play equipment including a swing set, climbing and slide unit, rocker, rubber softfall and picnic table.

"Installation of the equipment will commence the end of June or early July with the aim for the works to be completed in late July (weather permitting)," Ms Smith said.

The works have been made possible thanks to a \$50,000 grant from the Australian Government's Investing in our Communities (IiOC) grant and \$45,000 from Central Coast Council.

As the Central Coast community grows, it is important that Council continues to provide young families and children with safe environments to engage in play-based learning," Mr Hart said.


"This is one of over 260 public playspaces in parks, reserves, holiday/caravan parks and community centres. "We thank the Australian Government for their support of this project."







The Importance of Exercise

Why is exercise so important to our health and wellbeing?

Let me share a short, true story with you that alerted me to why it is so important.

Many years ago I was a volunteer in the Rural Fire Service and as part of the training we received a practical lesson by an Ambulance Paramedic on how to treat snake bite in case we were bitten out in the bush while carrying out the duties of protecting the community from the effects of bush fires.

What I found fascinating was a statement that the Paramedic said that really got my attention.

He said that in most cases, when a snake bites, the venom is released into the persons Lymph system, not into the blood stream. He then said that the Lymph system is the sewerage system of the body, carrying waste products to either the skin or the other elimination organs and taken out of the body.

Then came the interesting bit. He then informed us that the lymph system only works by movement, it doesn't have a pump like the blood system.

We were then instructed on the importance of using a constricting bandage on the limbs and also most importantly to immobilise the limb so that the venom will stay where it is and not circulate through the lymph system.

That's when the light bulb went off in my head!

It told me the importance of exercise to the human body. If we don't exercise or at least walk or move our limbs regularly, the lymph system, which is "the sewerage system of the body" can't eliminate the waste products that can get clogged up in our body and start to cause many diseases.

This is especially important as we get older and start to slow down or even worse stop altogether. A sedentary lifestyle is probably one of the worst things for our health but if we get regular exercise it brings many, many benefits to our body and mind.

How long should we exercise for and what kind? Anything that increases the heart rate & respiration and for at least 20 to 30 minutes.

What happens after 20 mins? H.G.H. or Human Growth Hormone is released from the pituitary gland. H.G.H. stops burning glucose for fuel and burns fat stores, increases blood circulation to the skin and Increases your body's ability to utilise protein. After 20 mins of exercise the H.G.H. remains active for 24 hrs.

The Brain needs oxygen - through Execise, the Brain works better, receives more blood, more oxygen and more glucose.

Year three of **IPART Water Price Increases** to Take effect

Council advises "From 1 July 2024 the combined yearly bill for a typical household will increase by approximately 11.9%, or \$168.03 for water, sewerage, and stormwater services (based on 170 kilolitres of water usage per year)."

In it's 2022 report IPART commented "Last time we reviewed CCC Water's prices in 2019, we did not allow its proposed price increases.

This was, in part, because CCC Water had for several years consistently spent less on operating costs than it recovered through prices (based on our previous pricing reviews (2013 reviews for the separate Wyong and Gosford councils) and in 2019 it could not justify that it needed any more funding than what it had been spending."

However in 2022 IPART did approve price increases but a lower amount than that requested by Council.

Now two years after the IPART determination it is time to implement a key recommendation:

"We recommend the Minister gives us a referral to, in 2 years' time, investigate and report publicly on CCC Water's performance as a Water Supply Authority and progress implementing management government improvements. This investigation would look at CCC Water's performance between now and June 2024 to check whether it has:

- reported on the information that is important to the community and
- made the necessary improvements that it has committed to.

We would also look at the progress CCC Water has made in putting in place the governance, processes and systems needed to promote better services in the long-term.

The review would constructive advice to CCC Water as necessary, and inform our next pricing review, and could inform further consideration of regulatory reform going forward"

In relation to stormwater charges . IPART wrote "Stormwater prices will increase once only, ... by 20% (\$22) in 2022-23, with no further increase apart from inflation. This is substantially less than CCC Water's proposed 73% increase mainly because we have not accepted its proposal to transfer \$15.5 million in stormwater costs currently funded through local government rates to the Water Supply Authority.

We also intend this pricing review will be the last time we set stormwater prices. We consider all costs for stormwater services should be fully funded by local government rates from 1 July 2026.

In our view, these services provide benefits to the whole community – not just specific customers. CCC Water stated it has a council resolution to effect this by 2026."

With regard to performance, IPART wrote "We found that CCC Water had underdelivered on its service to customers and had failed to meet several output measures we set in our last review. Customers consider they have limited ability to influence the water services that are delivered to them and CCC Water is not sufficiently accountable for its performance. We have made several recommendations to improve CCC Water's accountability."




