Conservation Land Under Threat

A letter to the Minister for Planning 17th July 2024

To: The Hon Paul Scully MP NSW Minister for Planning Dear Mr Scully,

We are gravely concerned about a planning proposal by the Central Coast Council that could see thousands of hectares of Conservation Land on the NSW Central Coast needlessly

downgraded and destroyed. Thanks to the foresight of the Gosford City Council, way back in the 1970s, a network of natural bushland reserves was created, to be kept as community land in council ownership for passive recreation and conservation.

Coastal Open Space System or COSS is the reason why the former Gosford City local government area, now the southern half of the Central Coast LGA, has green escarpment as far as the eye can see, and unique reserves including Rumbalara, Katandra, Kincumba Mountain, Captain Cook Memorial Park and Winney Bay Reserve - loved and enjoyed by residents and visitors. The Central Coast Council Administrator, Rik Hart, has pushed through a proposal that will downgrade deferred lands to the C3 and C4 zones which will open them up to unnecessary and inappropriate clearing and development. THIS IS NOT LIKE FOR LIKE and it will take a wrecking ball to our COSS lands strategy.

The Biodiversity Conservation and Science Directorate (BCS) within the Environment and Heritage Group in the Department of Climate Change, Environment, Energy and Water (DCCEEW) has advised against this. This is native species habitat - essential for the protection of biodiversity on the Central Coast now and for all future generations.

BCS said all deferred matters land zoned 7(a) should be zoned C2 (Conservation). This is LIKE FOR LIKE and the only way to protect this land from development.

We urge Minister Scully to take the advice of his government's Biodiversity Conservation and Science Group. Refuse Council's recommendation and adopt the recommendation of the Biodiversity Conservation and Science Group from DCCEEW.

While an Australian native plant is any species indigenous to Australia, provenance plants have a more specific definition.

Australian Native plants include any species in the Australian Plant Census along with hybrids and cultivars with native parents.

Local provenance is a term used to describe native plant populations that occur in a given area.

Many native species can be found across a broad area. For example, the Hairpin Banksia (Banksia Spinulosa) are endemic in three states from coastal Victoria to Cairns in Queensland but a Hairpin Banksia from southern Victoria will have a very different genetic composition to its Cairns cousin.

Growing endemic plants from seeds collected in the same area has many advantages including: the plant will have adapted to the local conditions over a long period of time. You will protect the area's biodiversity and combat threats to it. You have a higher likelihood of success because

Bernadette Heritage Ventures the weather conditions, soil types and climate will be appropriate. You will help provide habitat for endemic fauna species and will have a higher likelihood of creating refuge in your garden for threatened and endangered species.

Plants sourced from other areas can jeopardise the genetic integrity of the same endemic species.

Jackie said the CEN Wildplant nursery at Ourimbah (behind the facilities management building on the Ourimbah Campus of Newcastle University) opened every Thursday and on the first Saturday morning of each month. Volunteers are welcome.

CEN also has volunteers at its Tacoma nursery on Friday's to help with seed propagation and other activities.

She also spoke about the programs and projects CEN is currently working on and put a callout to local landholders to assist with CEN's Platypus Watch project (see notice on page 13).

Tickets cost \$40 (Adult) \$20 (Youth 12-16yrs), children under 12 years of age accompanied by a paying adult, free.


