

ONLINE APPOINTMENT BOOKINGS FOR SERVICES AUSTRALIA

Minister for Government Services and the National Disability Insurance Scheme Bill Shorten MP is urging Australians to skip the queues in Services Australia service centres and use the new national online booking system.

"At last, you can book appointments to see Services Australia online, not just turn up and be kept waiting," Minister Shorten said.

"After a successful pilot in Hobart earlier this year, Australians can now use the new online booking capability to make appointments in more than 300 service centres nationally.

"The online appointment booking option will be particularly helpful to older and younger Australians, people with disability, parents with young children and carers, who are part of the cohort this new system was designed to assist now."

Since recently launching, already more than 81,700 appointments have been booked online.

Centrelink customers can book a 15-minute phone appointment or 30-minute face to face appointment with a staff member at their local Services Australia service centre.

Customers can book, reschedule or cancel some appointments using their Centrelink online account through myGov or the Centrelink Express Plus mobile app.

The range of appointments that can be booked include:

- ABSTUDY
- Age Pension
- Carer Payment
- Digital Coaching
- Disability Support Pension
- JobSeeker Payment
- Parenting Payment partnered
- Parenting Payment single
- Youth Allowance
- My Aged Care general face to face appointments

Minister Shorten said the new appointment booking option was proving very popular, as people value the ability to book, reschedule or cancel an appointment online so they don't have to spend time in a queue.

"We know people want the convenience online services provide, but sometimes they need to talk to someone. This new service offers the best of both worlds for people who want or need to visit their local service centre," Minister Shorten said.

"People can go online and choose a time that suits them for an appointment, either on the phone or at their chosen service centre, and they don't have to spend time in a queue." Minister Shorten said ongoing improvements mean more Australians are getting the assistance they need, when they need it.

"The recent onboarding of an additional 3000 staff has already reduced claims backlogs and phone wait times. The online appointment booking capability is another step in the right direction toward improving access to services," Minister Shorten said.

Federal Member for Robertson, Dr Gordon Reid MP has welcomed the new online booking system.

"The Federal Labor Government is improving accessibility to Services Australia for everyone in our community.

"I welcome this improvement and encourage the community to skip the queues and book your next Services Australia appointment online", Dr Reid said.

Notice of 1080 Baiting

NSW National Parks and Wildlife Service (NPWS) is conducting an aerial baiting program in Popran, Brisbane Water and Watagans National Park.

Aerial baiting is scheduled for 14th October 2024 to 18th October 2024.

The operation will use 1080 (sodium fluoroacetate) poison for the control of wild dogs and foxes.

The program is designed to minimise predator impacts on wildlife, especially threatened species, and to minimise the impact of wild dogs on neighbouring stock. Signs will be placed at the entry to the baiting location.



Domestic pets are not permitted in National Parks and Wildlife managed lands. Pets and working dogs may be affected (1080 is lethal to cats and dogs). Pets and working dogs must be restrained or muzzled in the vicinity and

must not enter the baiting location. In the event of accidental poisoning seek immediate veterinary assistance.

Landlords, please notify tenants or visitors to your property of the proposed operation.

Pile Burning

- > Burning of cut & stacked vegetation is referred to as a pile burn
- Pile burns can be a useful method for reducing bush fire fuels, bush regeneration, property maintenance & 5 agricultural activities.



BEFORE YOU LIGHT THAT FIRE:

There are four simple steps;

- STEP 1 Seek environmental approval (if required)
- STEP 2 Obtain a Fire Permit (if required)
- **STEP 3** Provide notifications
- STEP 4 Check if it's a Total Fire Ban Day



Key things you will need to consider prior to lighting the pile burn:

- Pile size may be up to **2 m** in diameter & a maximum height of **1.5 m**
- Vegetation must be of a diameter of 150 mm or less
- Dry & dead vegetation generated on the premises only
- The burning of non-vegetative waste is not permitted. Building materials (treated pine, gyprock, asbestos) plastics, furniture & tyres are prohibited
- Notify the NSW RFS & adjoining neighbours 24 hours prior.

- The statutory Bush Fire Danger Period runs from 1st October to 31st March, however it may vary due to local conditions. If you are planning to light a fire in the open

during this time, you will need a Fire Permit.



Council unveils draft Public Toilet Strategy

Central Coast Council is inviting the community to help shape the future of its public toilet network. A draft Public Toilet Strategy (Strategy) is now open for public comment on Your Voice Our Coast (YVOC).

Council Director Infrastructure Services, Boris Bolgoff said the draft Strategy outlines Council's vision for a comprehensive network of public toilets across the Central Coast that meets the needs of residents and visitors.

"This Strategy is an important document that will guide Council's investment in public toilet infrastructure for the next 22 years," Mr Bolgoff said.

"It outlines a long-term plan for renewals, new builds and demolitions/ rationalisations, ensuring our network of 212 public toilets meets the evolving needs of the community and reflects best practices in the industry."

The Strategy identifies 79 public toilets in need of renewal, with an estimated investment of \$27.5million over the next two decades. Additionally, it proposes the construction of 27 new public toilets at an estimated cost of

\$9.2million in areas experiencing population growth or gaps in existing coverage. It also includes plans for demolishing/rationalising 11 existing facilities, primarily due to redundancy or proximity to new builds. In essence, it is proposed to increase the total facilities by 16.

Key considerations in the draft Strategy include:

- Prioritisation of public safety through 'Safer by Design' principles.
- Implementation of S.M.A.R.T. principles to optimise designs, construction, maintenance, operation, usability and use of technology.
- Development of a standardised public toilet design for ease of maintenance, construction and identification.
- Alignment with Council's Long-Term Financial Plan and commitment to responsible resource management.

Council Administrator, Rik Hart said community input was important in shaping the final strategy.

"The draft Public Toilet Strategy has been informed by extensive consultation with community groups, sporting organisations, disability advocates and tourism representatives," Mr Hart said.

"We value the community's perspective and encourage everyone to have their say on the draft Strategy to ensure our public toilet network serves



Road To Recovery And Resilience: Wisemans Ferry Road Remediation Work Forging Ahead

Repairs and betterment works are now underway for more than 40 landslip sites on Wisemans Ferry Road in Spencer and Gunderman on the Central Coast, thanks to \$28.3 million from Albanese and Minns Government's Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements.

Wisemans Ferry Road experienced widespread damage including embankments with landslides and rockfalls at multiple locations, after major flooding and storms in 2022.

The road will be restored to its pre-disaster function and become more resilient to future natural disasters, as part of Essential Public Asset Reconstruction and Regional Roads Transport Recovery Package initiatives.

These initiatives help local councils in NSW rebuild road and transport infrastructure projects in disasterimpacted communities. Alongside current road pavement rehabilitation, over the coming months Wisemans Ferry Road will see works across four interconnected segments to rectify several critical landslide and embankment erosion issues. Completion of the Wisemans Ferry Road project is anticipated in June 2026, weather depending.

Court decision supports **Council's** prosecution of illegal tree clearing

Coast Council Central has successfully prosecuted a landowner in the Mangrove Mountain area for unlawfully clearing vegetation without approval.

The unlawful clearing related to the removal of approximately three hectares of native vegetation, equating to about 240 Olympic sized swimming The vegetation removed pools. included Red Gums, Turpentines, Forest Oak and Tea Trees which were likely habit for native wildlife. Ground cover was also removed, and most tree stumps had been destroyed by heavy machinery.

The magistrate convicted the landowner of the illegal act, issuing a penalty of \$55,000 and awarding over \$5,000 to Council in court related costs

Council Director Environment and Planning, Jamie Loader said Council is pleased with the outcome given the nature and scale of the clearing, and is now also considering further action to have the vegetation reinstated and rehabilitated to ensure people do not profit from illegal action.

"This decision by the Local Court should send a warning to other landowners who disregard the law around illegal land clearing," Mr Loader said.

Council Administrator Rik Hart said the decision is a significant result and Council will continue to prioritise action to address unlawful activity across the local government area.

"Council will continue to position itself as a firm but fair regulator in accordance with our Regulatory Policy and will continue to drive improved compliance with legislation, particularly where there is serious harm to the environment," Mr Hart said.




