# Pile Burning During Fire Danger Period

The Fire Danger Period begins October 1st, this means if you are planning to light a fire in the open during this time, you will need a Fire Permit. To get a fire permit you can apply online at www.rfs.nsw.gov.au or contact your local fire control or local fire Brigade.

## To be issued a permit there are a few rules that you need to follow:

- Only one pile may be burnt at any one time. Vegetation may be added as the pile burns down.
- Ensure it contains only natural vegetation, permits will not be approved for piles containing toxic materials, such as tyres, plastics, pallets, paint, etc.
- Pile size may be up to 2 metres in diameter and a maximum height of 1.5 metres.
- Vegetation must be of a diameter of 150mm or less.
- A pile burn fire must be at least 20 metres from any dwelling structure, building, or unmanaged vegetation.

#### Once you have a permit:

- 24 hrs notice must be given PRIOR to lighting, to adjacent property occupiers, either in writing or verbally.
- You must also check whether a No Burn day or Total Fire Ban has been declared.
- Check the expected weather conditions for the time of the burn

and into the coming days.

#### **During the burn**

- The fire must be always supervised by a responsible adult.
- Watch for unpredicted changes in weather and extinguish if the weather becomes unsuitable.
- Burning should not cause a nuisance to neighbours or smoke hazard to traffic, if this occurs extinguish immediately.
- Adequate water supplies and/ or tested firefighting equipment must be immediately on hand to extinguish the fire if required.
- If at any point you lose control of your pile call 000.

For more information you can find the Central Coast Council Open Burn Policy on the Central Coast Council Website. Don't forget that even though you may have been granted a Fire Permit, you still need to complete the Burn Notification and advise neighbours at least 24 hours ahead of your burn date and time.

By following these rules you will help reduce unnecessary 000 calls.

# Residents urged to prepare for storm season

Residents on the Central Coast are urged to prepare for the increased risk of storms as the 2024/25 storm season officially begins, and the NSW State Emergency Service (NSW SES) continues to clean up from the wild winds that lashed parts of the state over recent weeks.

Storm season traditionally occurs from September to April each year, when storms, strong winds and heavy rain tend to be more frequent.

Over recent weeks NSW has been battered by windy conditions, with 1200 volunteers responding to more than 2000 events.

The Bureau of Meteorology has indicated the risk of extreme storms is increased, for at least the start of the season.

The NSW SES has responded to more than 21,000 storm related incidents over the past year. Of these incidents, 1,358 occurred in the Wyong area, 1,016 in Gosford, 904 in Sutherland, 835 in Wollongong and 680 in Kuring-gai.

Storm activity can now be checked using the Hazards Near Me app, alongside existing flood, fire and tsunami alerts.

To prepare for storms, residents should follow these tips:

- Secure loose items outside, trim trees and branches away from properties, clean your gutters and move your cars from underneath trees.
- If you are caught out in a storm, seek shelter indoors. Do not shelter under trees and stay away from powerlines.
- Prepare an emergency plan for storms and floods.
- Download the Hazards Near Me app and set your watch zones.
- If you need assistance from the NSW SES, call 132 500. If it's an emergency, call Triple 0.

For more information on how to get ready ahead of this year's storm season, visit www.ses.nsw.gov.au.

Minister for Emergency Services Jihad Dib said: "As we enter storm season, I urge all communities to ensure they are aware of their risks and encourage them to prepare early.

"It is incredibly important to have your plan in place, get your home ready and be prepared for what you will do if impacted by storms."

Member for Gosford, Liesl Tesch MP said "I would like to thank our hardworking SES volunteers who have been out in force in recent weeks. We know we can count on them to support communities across NSW over the course of this storm season."

"We have seen over the past few weeks the effects of strong winds which brought down trees, damaged powerlines, lifted roofs and fanned fires across the state."

## Coping with grief in adult life

#### **Understanding Adult Grief**

The death of a loved one whether anticipated or not, is one of the most stressful experiences that we will encounter during our life. Grief is our response to this loss. It is the thoughts, feelings and reactions we experience when someone we love dies. Grief is painful and it affects every part of us, our mind, body and spirit. It is also varied and different for different people.

Our grief is impacted by our relationship to the person who has died and how they gave meaning to our life. While these experiences may be unfamiliar to you, grief is a normal, natural and healthy response to the loss of someone you loved and valued.

The purpose of this brochure is to answer some of the questions you might have about grief and to offer some insights into what you might be experiencing at this time. Suggestions have also been included which may provide some added guidance and support during this period in your

#### How long will my grief last?

It is important to understand that grief is something we experience as opposed to something we must overcome. Every individual reacts to grief and loss differently and in the same way, the length of the healing process is unique to each of us. The grieving process does not fit into a precise timetable or follow a set pattern however over time the pain and distress may decrease.

necessary) professional counsellors, we can gradually learn to adjust, recover from our loss and find new ways to live. Grief is by nature unpredictable and may resurface at any stage of your life triggered by an experience that sparks a memory of the person who has died. This too is normal and natural. With time, support and healing, most people find that they become more in control of their grief rather than their grief being in control of them.

## What can happen during the grieving process?

The changes that are associated with the death of someone we love can leave us confused, fearful and uncertain. Our initial response to such a loss is often shock, numbness, denial and disbelief.

This is nature's way of temporarily protecting us from the full reality of what we have lost. Feeling childlike, helpless and vulnerable on the inside is another common response to the crisis that accompanies loss.

Although your experience of grief is unique, there are some responses to loss that we all share. Some of these you may experience, while others you will not.

## What can I do to help and support myself?

As the experience of grief is unique to each individual, the strategies that may help during this time will also differ. Thinking back to any past periods of stress and emotional upheaval in your

life and the things that helped you at those times can give you an idea of the strategies that work best for you.

## The following is a list of suggestions that others have found useful

- Allow yourself to cry
- Look after yourself get plenty of rest and try to eat small, easily digestible meals
- Limit alcohol, tranquillisers, analgesics, sleeping tablets and other mood altering drugs
- Participate in regular gentle exercise
- Ask for help and support from others who care about you
- Share stories, thoughts and feelings about your loved one with family and friends
- Express your grief outwardly. Using a diary or journal to write, draw, paint or scrapbook also helps to express your feelings and tell the story of your loss
- Create a memorial to honour your loved one
- Use rituals and customs that are meaningful to you – for example visit your loved ones resting place, continue to celebrate special days such as anniversaries and birthdays
- Draw on religious and spiritual beliefs if this is helpful to you
- Take time out to do the things you would normally enjoy and things that are relaxing and soothing

What do I do if I feel I am not coping?

Don't expect too much from yourself too soon. However, if you or anyone close to you is concerned about any of the responses that you are experiencing, it is a good idea to seek medical advice from your GP. Grief shares many of the same symptoms as depression. Talk to your GP if you are unsure whether you are experiencing normal grief or depression.

Usually painful feelings diminish with time however professional help may be required if your feelings remain at an intense level for a prolonged period. Talking to a trained counsellor can provide support and comfort and help you to find other ways to manage, especially if you are having trouble resolving the thoughts, feelings or behaviours connected with your loss.

Most of us learn to live with our loss with the support of family, friends and our own resources.

If your life or your grief seems particularly complicated and difficult, it is a good idea to seek professional help.

out to see live music, to a show, or even to the pub may be a little overwhelming or difficult. Having a buddy along as a support person can make things so much easier, and more fun."

Buddies can include the Gig Buddies program within their NDIS plans. For those without an NDIS plan, buddies can opt for a 'fee for service' option, paying the same amount but from their own personal account.

Gig Buddies Central Coast coordinator, Matthew Collins said Gig Buddies was about expanding peoples' social circles.

"We're all about helping people with learning disabilities get out of the house and having fun, in whatever form that takes - staying up late, meeting new people, going to see bands, clubbing, or seeing friends. These kinds of activities are part of everyday life for many people, however if you have a learning disability, you may need support to do this.

#### Careful vetting and pairing

Gig Buddies strives to find volunteers and buddies that share each other's interests, also taking into consideration age, gender, and location preferences.

Strict vetting processes for both buddies and volunteers underpin the Gig Buddies experience. Volunteers are fully vetted in line with NDIS guidelines, and volunteers must submit an NDIS Worker Check and the NDIS Orientation Module. Volunteers also supply two character references and attend volunteer training.

Central Coast volunteer Jack and buddy Kade are one of numerous examples of positive pairings that are reaping rewards.

Says Jack: "Gig Buddies is an uncomplicated way to do something good in the world. When I started, I was worried that the things I was interested in would be too boring for Kade (he likes to hit the clubs, whereas I am a homebody!). But at the end of the day, it's about spending quality time with a new friend.

Gig Buddies is always on the hunt for more buddies and volunteers.

# Review: Scouts Trip to Korea

youth from every country imaginable. We were part of the largest team of Australians ever to attend a world Jamboree overseas, and we were completely honoured to be part of the team.

The Jamboree was hampered by some extreme weather, but nothing us mountain folk could not handle, high 30's temp wise, with high humidity and the odd monsoon just to cap it off. A highlight of the Jamboree was the swapping of badges, scarves and uniforms, with the most prized and sought after being the Mexican, Dutch and Taiwanese contingent shirts.

Again we would like to acknowledge the Mangrove Mountain Community fair for their generous funding, to be able to share the world with these amazing young mountain youth is a true blessing and such an honour. To see the appreciation and sense of accomplishment in these youth, to be part of their journey of becoming responsible adults and ambassadors

not only for our community but for Australia makes it all very worthwhile.

If you would like to see your children be part of something great, consider scouting, we meet every week during the school terms and cater for all ages from 8 years to adulthood. Most weekends we will either be hiking, camping, fundraising, training or developing new skills, testing ourselves against the environment or doing our best to preserve and protect it






