New Hope for Fairview Homestead

Fairview is heritage-listed traditional homestead on Ten Mile Hollow Road at Mangrove Creek. Built over 100 years ago, it is a historically significant landmark and one of the last remaining examples of the settlements and farms along Mangrove Creek.

Fairview has an amazing history. Located at the heart of Mangrove Creek, it was the closest homestead to the old St Thomas' church and school. Fairview was the focus of activity for the local community: Sunday races, tennis, picnics. Local teachers boarded there and some children from other parts of the valley would stay at Fairview during the week to go to school and go home at the weekend. However, Fairview wasn't just important to the local community. Before 1930, the only way to drive from Sydney to Gosford was via Ten Mile Hollow and up Mangrove creek to Fairview. At Mead's Bridge just before reaching Fairview, the road crossed the creek before making its way south again and onto Gosford. It was a long and uncomfortable journey



and often drivers would stop overnight at Fairview before tackling the perilous ascent out of the valley at Mangrove.

Fairview has been owned by Council since 1973 and was home to two award-winning landscape painters and their families until 2002. Only four years later the first proposal to demolish Fairview was put to Council. Since then, the Friends of Fairview and the Fairview Homestead Association have been fighting to save Fairview and to protect the heritage and history of Mangrove Creek.

The Fairview Homestead Association has just held its 11th Annual General Meeting and there has been a generational change in the committee. The new team is eager to take on the challenge to ensure that Fairview is preserved and can serve as a lasting memorial of the amazing

history of the valley and its people.

With a new Council in place, we look forward to renewing our drive to ensure that the homestead can again be a resource to the community of the Central Coast.







Government through the Black Summer Bushfire Resilience Grants program. The network includes the rural areas west of the M1 from Mt White through to Wollombi and reaches out west past Gunderman.

Having a network of radios increases the chance that there will be a point of contact during an emergency situation and is a way to communicate and relay critical information.


Use of the 200 odd radios already deployed has proven that the system functions well, even in some of the most radio unfriendly terrain in the region.

There are however certain areas where more radio sites are required to provide improved coverage and better links between existing areas. These include Yarramalong, Dooralong, the northern part of Kulnura, Calga and Somersby.

The project is overseen by the Mangrove Emergency Planning and Communications Committee Inc. (MEPCC) and is being managed by a project team made up of volunteers from the areas where the system is being deployed.

Submissions record broken on Regional Telecommunications Review as independent Committee outlines next steps

The views of regional, rural and remote Australians experiencing connectivity issues have been heard loud and clear with a record-breaking number of submissions received on the Australian Government's Regional Telecommunications Review.

The Regional Telecommunications Independent Review Committee has published all non-confidential submissions today, which the Committee is currently working through to deliver on its recommendations to Government.

The Review – held once every three years – plays a key role in reducing the digital divide between cities and regional Australia, with feedback from the public in previous Reviews leading to policy initiatives and programs such as the Mobile Black Spot Program and the National Audit of Mobile Coverage.

The Review received a total of 3404 submissions, including 306 written submissions – an increase of more than 400 per cent compared to 2021 – before submissions closed 31 July 2024. The easily accessible online survey option – utilised for the first time in a Review – drove most of the

submissions received, with a total of 3098 responses.

Chaired by the Hon Alannah MacTiernan, the Committee has in recent months been undertaking face-to-face consultations and reviewing these submissions as it looks to deliver the report and recommendations to the Minister for Communications, the Hon Michelle Rowland MP, who set the Terms of Reference of the Review in January 2024. The remaining Committee members are Mr Ian Kelly, the Hon Fiona Nash, Dr Jessa Rogers and Ms Kristy Sparrow.

The Committee is now preparing its advice to the government, including recommendations that clearly reflect the needs of regional, rural and remote communities across Australia. These actions will include measures to reduce the digital divide, improve literacy, connect communities during emergencies and disaster responses and action to meet the unique needs of First Nations communities, ahead of delivering a report and recommendations to the Australian Government by 31 December 2024.

The Hon Alannah MacTiernan said "We are paying great attention to these submissions and to the feedback we have received in our community consultations across the country. Together they are guiding the development of our recommendations to the Minister on how we believe we can improve telecommunication services in the bush, improving regional life and fostering regional development.

"On behalf of the Committee I'd like to thank everyone who has taken the time to have their say – your input will help us shape the report and recommendations to the Australian Government going forward.

Previous Reviews have helped shape important policy changes and we look forward to our report assisting the Minster forge new paths for regional telecommunications policy in a time of rapid change and increased complexity."

APVMA immediately bans herbicides with chlorthal dimethyl

The Australian Pesticides and Veterinary Medicines Authority (APVMA) has cancelled all 12 products containing the herbicide chlorthal dimethyl. This follows the recent United States Environmental Protection Agency (US EPA) emergency order to stop use of chlorthal dimethyl (DCPA), also known as Dacthal, in the US.

Chlorthal dimethyl is a herbicide used in vegetable crops, lawns and cotton that is currently in 12 products available in Australia.

APVMA Chief Executive Officer, Mr Scott Hansen, said the APVMA identified an immediate risk of serious injury or serious illness which could result from use of these products.

"The APVMA has the power to act swiftly where we identify an imminent risk to human health and we are exercising that authority today with the cancellation of all products containing chlorthal dimethyl," said Mr Hansen.

"We haven't taken this decision lightly and are exercising a high degree of caution in cancelling these products and ask those who hold them to cease use immediately. We will issue information on the product recall requirements shortly."

Mr Hansen said this decision brings Australia into alignment with international counterparts and reiterated that there is no phase out period for the products due to the risk to human health.

"The APVMA considers the risk of continued use to be unacceptable as the risk of exposure cannot be effectively mitigated.

"The primary risk is to pregnant people's unborn babies, particularly where those people have handled the chemical or re-entered areas where the product has been used within the last 5 days.

"We understand the impact that this regulatory decision will have on industry, but the safety of people is of paramount importance."

Farmers and retailers may continue to hold product until further notice, but must not use it. The use of chlorthal

Central Coast Council Director Environment and Planning, Jamie Loader said Central Coast Council and five neighbouring Councils (including Hornsby Shire, Hawkesbury City, The Hills Shire, Ku-ring-gai, and Northern Beaches) are developing a coordinated estuary wide Coastal Management Plan for the Hawkesbury-Nepean River, in conjunction with the support from the NSW Government.


