


History Excursions to Fairview Homestead in 2025





CHANGES TO FOOD STANDARDS FROM 8TH DECEMBER 2024

Recent changes to the Food Standards Code have introduced new requirements for all businesses that prepare and serve food in NSW. The changes will take effect from 8th December. The changes affect most retail and hospitality food businesses, charities and not-for-profits that regularly sell food, delis, supermarkets, coffee vendors and correctional centres.

Standard 3.2.2A aims to improve food safety by introducing 3 tools:

- Food Safety Supervisor (FSS)
- food handler training
- showing food is safe.

If you already have a current FSS, you will only need to ensure other staff who handle unpackaged, potentially hazardous food have appropriate skills and knowledge in food safety and hygiene. Higher-risk businesses must also be able to show they are managing key food safety risks.

For other businesses, all the requirements are new, such as for children's services that supply food, school canteens, supermarkets, greengrocers, delis, coffee vendors that sell food, correctional centres and boarding schools.

Compliance with New Requirements:

Girls in the Game program to empower women and girls in sport

Central Coast Council is thrilled to announce the launch of the Girls in the Game program, a multi-year initiative to enhance the participation and retention of women and girls in sports and physical activities across the region. Funded under the Federal Government's Play Our Way grant, the program will officially kick off in 2025.

The Girls in the Game program is

December 2024 to comply.

Exemptions:

- The handling or sale of food for the purpose of raising funds solely for community or charitable causes, and providing food free to the community.
- Businesses licensed with the NSW Food Authority.
- Businesses that only manufacture or wholesale food (for example a manufacturer of bulk ham that is sold packaged to supermarkets) with no direct sale to consumers. Other food safety requirements will apply to these businesses.
- Other food businesses that are not serving or retailing unpackaged food that is potentially hazardous and ready to eat (for example service stations selling food that remains in its original sealed packaging, coffee van that only sells food that is not potentially hazardous).

Council Mayor Lawrie McKinna said that sport has always been a huge part of his life and praised the Girls in the Game program.

"The Girls in the Game program is about more than just sport - it's about building confidence, leadership, and a strong sense of community for females of all ages on the Central Coast.

"We all need to continue to work together to build awareness of domestic and family violence and teach our




children about healthy relationships.



Council launches its Key Enabling Projects Plan

Central Coast Council has launched its Key Enabling Projects 2025: Central Coast Region document, which identifies priority infrastructure and investment projects aimed to benefit residents, businesses and visitor across the region.

A key purpose of the document is to highlight projects that are funding ready and which will make a difference to the region by providing opportunities for improved sustainability, liveability and economic growth.

The document outlines the make-up of the Central Coast, its population, employment levels, number of dwellings, language spoken in households, numbers of families, where people work, and how they get to work.

It also identifies key growth areas being Gosford, Greater Warnervale, the Woy Woy Peninsula and Greater Lake Munmorah, with some key enabling projects in each of those areas.

Community priorities are also identified, noting the Central Coast population is expected to grow by nearly 14% over the next 20 years (351,954 in 2023 to a projected 400,878 in 2041). Advocacy for affordable housing is prominent in the document.

The cost of many of the Key Enabling projects are also laid out in the document including:

• \$35 million for the development of a Food Organics and Garden Organics services and associated infrastructure.

• \$155 million for sewage treatment plant major works across the Coast

• \$2.5 million for the Warnervale Business Precinct

"Council must continue to partner with government and other organisations to address key priorities to support our communities and create positive change," Mayor McKinna said.

Council will now present the document to government and industry groups to progress the identified projects and partnerships.

Skin Checkin: - Melanoma hotspot map

Revelations that the Central Coast is at no. 23 of a newly-released melanoma hotspot map from the Cancer Institute NSW is a timely reminder for Coasties to protect their skin while outdoors.

Member for Gosford Liesl Tesch MP cited the sobering reality that Australia has one of the highest skin cancer rates in the world.

"Two out of three Australians will be treated for skin cancer in their lifetime which is why protecting our skin from the sun from a very young age, and into adulthood, is key to reducing our risk of this devastating disease.

"Here on the Central Coast, we love being outdoors enjoying the natural environment or being active. This is healthy, but only if you're being sun smart. Otherwise, it can be deadly.

"Whether you're heading to the beach, hanging the washing, or walking to the shops or train station, I urge everyone to do the simple things like seeking shade when outdoors, wearing sunscreen, putting on a hat, sunglasses and protective clothing to safeguard themselves from harmful UV radiation from the sun."

Melanoma is one of the most common cancers among young Australians, and

the third most diagnosed cancer in NSW, with more than 5,000 people expected to be diagnosed in the state in 2024.

As the most serious form of skin cancer, melanoma can be deadly and is projected to take the lives of close to 500 people across NSW this year. Ninety-five per cent of melanoma and 99 per cent of non-melanoma skin cancers are caused by overexposure to UV radiation from the sun and can be prevented with proper sun protection.

The summer relaunch of its 'If You Could See UV' campaign forms part of a suite of initiatives underway at The Cancer Institute NSW to help reduce the impact of skin cancer in NSW.

The most effective defence against UV radiation is to follow these five key steps before leaving the house include:

- 1) Slip on protective clothing.
- Slop on SPF50+ sunscreen. Sunscreen should always be applied 20 minutes before heading outdoors and re-applied every two hours.
- 3) Slap on a wide brimmed hat.
- 4) Seek shade; and
- 5) Slide on sunglasses.

Ballina, Lismore, Byron, Clarence Valley and Coffs Harbour local government areas (LGAs) have the state's highest rates of melanoma, with almost 350 cases projected to be diagnosed in those areas in 2024.




