LOCAL MEN'S SHED NEWS

A BBQ and information and discussion session was held on Jan 21 at the grounds and hall of the MMUC, following three previous meetings.

Two organisers of the Australian Mens Shed Association were in attendance (The President of the NSW Branch and the Zone14 Representative, Central Coast, both volunteer positions).

The AMSA representatives gave a great summary of the main issues that Men's Sheds address.

Many men, especially after retirement, find themselves alone, often living in isolation and needing to connect with their community and find new purpose but aren't sure how.

Living in a rural area can add to the feeling of isolation. Others just want to learn a new skill or revisit old ones. Meeting with others provides an environment to address mental health and disconnectedness.

It's important to note that men's sheds aren't only for a bunch of old men, the doors are also open to younger members of the community.

Helping out with farm maintenance and disseminating knowledge and experience on farming, trades and other vocations are other aspects of men's sheds.

There was a discussion on what actions were to be taken, the timing of actions and priorities. As advised at the BBQ session, establishing a committee, forming an association, adopting a constitution, deciding on a name and registering with the Australian Men's Shed Association are some of the things that need to be done.

An interim committee was set up to take the next steps and organise regular meetings and get-togethers.

It's just not Cricket!

Nothing says summer more than cricket and tennis – and cicadas! Cricket fans enjoy test matches, ODIs and T20s, and for tennis fans the Australian Open brings the world's best players down under for the 'Happy Slam'.

All this activity has many of us keen to get out and try our hand. In Kulnura we are especially lucky to have facilities for both these sports to scratch that itch: two synthetic grass tennis courts, and just a few metres away on the other side of the hall the oval has an all weather surface cricket pitch.

Unfortunately, over the Christmas period some keen cricketers have used one of the tennis courts for batting practice rather than the nearby cricket pitch. The net was taken down, with some damage in the process, and the court surface has been torn at what seems to have been the batsman's crease.

The net damage has been repaired, thanks to a Central Coast Council maintenance crew who had pulled over nearby, however the tear in court surface is irreparable. As the Council has indicated there are no funds to address some other outstanding maintenance issues on the courts, it is unlikely they will consider replacing the damaged surface in the foreseeable future.

With the net fixed the second court is functioning again, although with the damaged surface. It is disheartening to see these well-used and relatively good facilities damaged. It was not done through malice, but without thinking of the consequences.



It is wonderful to see locals out playing sports and enjoying some time with family and friends. As in all we do, please consider the impact of your actions, respect our shared facilities and only use them for their intended purpose.





Troublesome Nails

CEN has put the NSW Government on notice that it must adopt a 'nature first' approach to developing a Strategic Conservation Plan for any areas of the Central Coast.

In its response to the exhibition of Terms of Reference for a Central Coast Strategic Conservation Plan, CEN said the NSW Government must consider the region's vulnerability to climate change, our unique biodiversity attributes and the clear threat of regional extinctions of flora and fauna by 2070.

"Protecting and enhancing bushland and biodiversity and protecting and enhancing scenic and cultural landscapes must be the two key objectives of any strategic conservation plan proposed for the Central Coast," said CEN Chair, Gary Chestnut.

"NSW Environment Minister, Penny Sharpe, stood in the CEN office during the 2023 election campaign and told us the recommendations of the Henry Review of the 2016 NSW Biodiversity Conservation Act would be fully adopted by a NSW Labor Government if elected," Mr Chestnut said.

"Well Labor was elected but the Henry Review has not been fully implemented and we are left with a Biodiversity Conservation Act that is not fit for purpose and an offset scheme that continues to result in the net loss of biodiversity across NSW," he said.

"That's not good enough and using the excuse of the housing crisis to destroy more and more habitat is not good enough either, which is why we are sending a clear and loud message to the NSW Government at the outset of the consultation process for the Strategic Conservation Plan."

"Is the underlying philosophy of the Central Coast Strategic Conservation Plan to be overdevelopment at the expense of liveability and biodiversity?" The CEN submission

"Whilst we understand that we are commenting on the draft terms of reference and not the actual plan, we were hopeful that the stated objectives would be more in favour of the region's biodiversity than: ... 'a plan for the Central Coast that creates more land



for jobs and homes while protecting important plants and animals.'

"Where is the vision or are the current residents and ratepayers of the Central Coast to simply accept we are about to become nothing more than an under-resourced, over-developed giant sleeper suburb for Newcastle and Sydney?

"Our submission recommends the inclusion of detailed commitments on matters unique to this region, such as the Coastal Open Space System (COSS), the potential for regional extinctions of native plants and animals within the next 50 years and this community's substantial vulnerability to the impacts of climate change, that may be impacted directly, indirectly and/or cumulatively by actions proposed to be taken under the Strategic Conservation Plan," Mr Chestnut said.

PEP-11 Refused

The Hon Ed Husic MP, Minister for Industry and Science said in a statement "On 16 January 2025, the Commonwealth-New South Wales Offshore Petroleum Joint Authority (Joint Authority) made the decision to refuse both the PEP-11 applications.

The Joint Authority refused the applications for reasons of public interest, concerns about the applicants' estimate of the cost of works and their ability to raise the necessary capital to fund the proposed works.

In making this decision, I have carefully considered all relevant materials, including those submitted by Asset Energy Pty Ltd, and the requirements set out under the Offshore Petroleum and Greenhouse Gas Storage Act 2006.

As part of the decision-making process, Asset Energy Pty Ltd was given an opportunity to respond to the concerns that I raised in forming my preliminary view that the Joint Authority should refuse the applications. Asset Energy's response was considered before reaching this decision.





PFAS detected in Ourimbah Creek **Catchment**

part of Central As Coast Council's overall water security and environmental management, Council proactively tests its water catchments and estuaries to ensure water quality is safe for community use.

As reported last year, Council has an ongoing water monitoring program which from August 2024, has included regular analysis of water catchments and drinking water for Perfluoroalkyl Polyfluoroalkyl Substances (PFAS). Monitoring results confirm Central Coast drinking water is safe and meets current and proposed Australian Drinking Water Guidelines

However, a recent sample of raw (untreated) water from the upper reaches of the Ourimbah Creek catchment returned a detection of PFAS. This water is currently not being supplied through Council's town water system.

Council has informed the NSW Environment Protection Authority (EPA) and NSW Health of the results. Council is working with the NSW EPA and NSW Health on possible sources.

Further investigation and sampling is underway, and updates will be provided to the community as they become available.

NSW EPA advises that it is important


to note that the presence of PFAS in the environment does not necessarily mean there is a risk to human health or the environment.

Australian water utilities have been active in understanding and managing the risks that PFAS contamination represents to its drinking water customers. This includes working with Australian and NSW government agencies to ensure that water catchment management practices and water quality standards adopted eliminate the risk of PFAS exposure in drinking water supplied to customers.

Change to Number of DA Objections for LPP reference Contravenes Ministerial Direction

The Community Environment Network (CEN) has called for an urgent intervention from Minister for the Central Coast, Hon David Harris MP, to correct an embarrassing bungle made by eight of the newly elected Central Coast councillors at their November meeting.

"Deputy Mayor Doug Eaton put forward a motion to double the number of submissions objecting to a development application needed for the DA to be referred to the Central Coast Local Planning Panel (CCLPP)," said CEN Chair, Mr Gary Chestnut.

"Eight councillors supported the motion, so it became a resolution of the council – but it was a sloppy mistake that needs to be fixed," Mr Chestnut said. "The council business papers show that councillors were briefed by the director before voting, but they went ahead and did it anyway.

"That's why we have written directly to the Minister for the Central Coast – we don't see the point in asking for council's CEO or Mayor to clean this up when they made the decision."

According to CEN, the operation of the CCLPP is determined by NSW Government Regulation. In May 2024, Minister for Planning, the Hon Paul Scully MP, signed off on a Local Planning Panels Direction (attached) – Development Applications and

Applications to Modify Development Consents.

"The Ministerial Direction said council must either follow its existing Submissions Policy to decide what to refer to the CCLPP, or refer applications being "the subject of 10 or more unique submissions by way of objection".

CEN has reviewed council's policies and there doesn't appear to be an existing Submissions Policy.

"We did find an Assessment of Development Applications Policy (Policy No. CCC108), which said it was prepared according to the NSW Government's Development Assessment Best Practice Guide 2017 (DABPG 2017) which says a DA with more than 10 objections "by way of individual submissions from different households..." must go to the Local Planning Panel.

"Central Coast Council is not empowered to amend or override a Ministerial Direction to suit its own preferences. If Council wants to change how it deals with contentious development applications, it must:

- Formulate and publicly exhibit an amendment to Policy No. CCC108 to explicitly address how such applications will be managed; or
- Formulate and publicly exhibit a specific Submissions Policy; or
- Adhere to the Ministerial Direction and the definition of contentious applications as set out in the DABPG 2017 which requires applications that receive 10 or more unique objections to be referred to the Local Planning Panel (LPP).

"Central Coast Council cannot resolve to increase the threshold of submissions required for referral to the CCLPP without following proper procedural requirements.

"The November resolution said the proposed change would be sent to Minister Scully for approval. CEN wonders what happened to the legal requirement to put new or amended policies on public exhibition.


