

We held our first meeting for the year on Thursday, 6th February.

Seven of us, including a new member, met to discuss matters affecting our community.

First, we discussed housekeeping matters such as banking issues and hall maintenance. A federal grant for Community Building Partnerships is now open and we will be applying to paint the outside of the hall. We would really like this done as the Mangrove Mountain Hall's 100th birthday is in April 2027. We think she deserves to look her best for the Centenary celebrations!!

The local monthly markets are growing and attracting visitors from near and far. Stall holders and visitors alike comment on the positive ambience. I'm sure the beautiful bush surroundings as well as great stalls, music and old-fashioned games like skittles help create the atmosphere. The next markets to be held on 2nd March will be our first birthday!

We agreed that our group has to work together with CEN (Community

Environment Network) to ensure that the NSW government does the right thing when developing a Strategic Conservation Plan for the Central Coast. We have written to politicians and councillors as well as council staff about the draft terms of reference for the Community Engagement Strategy...our voices must be heard!

We have great concerns that Council has reported that PFAS has been detected in the Ourimbah Creek catchment. Could the source be the Mangrove Mountain Landfill? Previous attempts to obtain monitoring data from EPA have proven very difficult. We need to follow this up by making further enquiries.

We were very disappointed not to receive a grant to make the Hall the "Safer Place" that is deemed to be for bushfire evacuation. We agree that this is of utmost importance so we will be applying again in the upcoming "Bushfire Preparedness Grant" from the Federal government.

A used vape was found on the street and this led to discussing how to dispose of them. As they contain batteries, they cannot be places in household garbage. We will be contacting Council to ask if they can provide a container where residents can place their used vapes so they can be safely disposed of.

We will be holding a working bee on Saturday, 22nd February starting 9am. The main job this time will be to oil the floor of the hall. There is always

A Piece Of The Central Coast In Our Nation's Capital

The Australian Government's \$550 million upgrade to the Australian War Memorial is taking shape with sandstone from Gosford Quarry sourced to help build new additions to the memorial.

The Australian War Memorial's new main entrance required 380m3 or around 800t of Wondabyne Sandstone from the Gosford Quarry.

The quarry re-opened the same face that had been used to build the memorial in the 1930's and '40's so that builders could get a perfect match of new stone to the existing stone.

Stone was also processed at the quarry using a variety of tools including a robotic chisel.

The existing Wondabyne sandstone stairs and bastions at the memorial had

much to do including cleaning and gardening.

to be carefully removed, stored and reinstated to allow builders to connect the new main entrance to the existing heritage listed main building.

Wondabyne Sandstone is also being used in the still under construction Anzac Hall.

The Wondabyne Quarry is typically only accessible three times a year when the adjacent rail line is closed for maintenance; the extracted stone needs to be hauled across water via a barge, and then onto Canberra.

Dr Gordon Reid MP Federal Member for Robertson, said "It is tremendous that sandstone from Gosford Quarry on the Central Coast has been used to help build the new main entrance to the Australian War Memorial.

"Our Central Coast community will be proud to know that a part of our region will forever help commemorate the sacrifice and service of Australian Defence Force personnel and their families at the Australian War Memorial in Canberra.

"I recently had the opportunity to be a part of the official public opening of the main entrance to the memorial, which saw the Prime Minister, Opposition Leader, and other members of the Australian Parliament attend.





Open daily from 9 am to 5 pm (excluding Christmas Day), the Visitor Centre offers picnic shelters, a children's play area, and accessible amenities. The site will close during periods of extreme or catastrophic fire danger to ensure public safety.

Fairview and the Archibald Prize

Fairview is a heritage-listed traditional homestead on Ten Mile Hollow Road at Mangrove Creek. It's well known for its magnificent setting and the central role it played in the life of the residents of Mangrove Creek for over 100 years.

What is less well known is its inspirational role in Australian landscape art. After Fairview was compulsorily acquired by Council in 1973 to clear the valley of habitation, Council nevertheless decided to rent out Fairview to tenants for another 29 years.

One of the first tenants was Brisbane-born landscape painter Neil Taylor. He and his young family lived at Fairview for 16 years from 1979 until 1995. At Mangrove Creek, Neil found inspiration for his art. The old kitchen became his workshop and apart from painting scenes on the walls of his studio, he created a series of outstanding landscape, portrait and genre paintings.

Neil was a finalist in the Art Gallery of New South Wales' Archibald, Wynne and Sulman Prizes a total of ten times and most of the paintings he exhibited were painted at Fairview.

But that is not where Fairview's link with the Archibald and Wynne Prizes ends. When Neil left Fairview in 1995, Council rented the homestead to landscape painter Peter Chapman. Peter too has been a finalist: twice for the Archibald and three times for the Wynne Prize.

Fairview was home to two exceptional artists and their families for 23 years. When Peter vacated the property in 2002, Council elected not to lease it again and has failed to

2020 World Cup season, highlighted by the first World Cup podium of her career under lights in Deer Valley, UT, USA, taking bronze in February 2020. She also finished the season ranked a personal best 7th in the world on the world cup standings.

At a 2020-2021 World Cup event in event in Yarslavl, Russia, Abbey advanced to finals in eighth place, but was unable to take part after crashing her last jump in finals training and injuring her leg. The injury required surgery, and Willcox had to return to Australia ending her season.

Abbey returned to competition



in September 2023, taking part in a Water Jump Grand Prix event at the Geoff Henke Olympic Winter Training Centre, where she placed second behind teammate Airleigh Frigo.

The 2023-2024 FIS World Cup season was exciting for Willcox, highlighted by the second podium of her career at Deer Valley, UT, USA finishing the World Cup season ranked seventh, matching her previous best.

Gosford medicare mental health centre opens

Residents of the Central Coast can access free, walk-in mental health support at the Gosford Medicare Mental Health Centre.

The centre was officially opened today by Assistant Minister for Mental Health and Suicide Prevention, Emma McBride, and Member for Robertson, Dr Gordon Reid.

Located at 69 Central Coast Highway in West Gosford, the centre is open with no appointment or referral needed to access services.

Staffed by qualified mental health professionals including psychologists, social workers and counsellors, the centre can provide immediate help for people in distress as well as ongoing care for those with more complex mental health needs.

To boost access to specialist care, the government is investing an additional \$29.9 million to provide access to psychologists and psychiatrists through every centre.

Centres can also provide support for carers and families of people experiencing mental health distress and connect people with other services, from health to housing and employment. The Albanese Labor Government is strengthening Medicare by establishing a national network of 61 Medicare Mental Health Centres, including 22 in New South Wales.

There are now 35 Medicare Mental Health Centres open across the country, including 13 locations in NSW.

The Albanese Labor Government is providing \$4.5 million for Medicare Mental Health Centres in Gosford, Tuggerah, Lake Macquarie and Cessnock.

The centres are commissioned by Hunter New England Central Coast Primary Health Network and operated by Beam Health.

People can also make a free call to 1800 595 212 and be connected to a trained professional for advice, information or referral to the most appropriate local mental health service to meet their individual needs.

Assistant Minister McBride said "The Albanese Labor Government is strengthening Medicare by investing in more mental health services.

FREE RSV VACCINE FOR MUMS & BUBS

Australian mums and their newborn babies now have free access to the best and most comprehensive protection against respiratory syncytial virus (RSV).

The Australian Government is investing \$174.5 million to give eligible pregnant women free access to the RSV vaccine, Abrysvo®, under the National Immunisation Program.

The free maternal RSV vaccine will be available to women who are 28 to 36 weeks pregnant, to protect their newborn babies from serious illness.

Without subsidy, Australians could expect to pay \$300 for the vaccine.

RSV is a common respiratory virus that affects the nose, throat and lungs.

A significant number of infants will be infected with RSV before the age of two, with around 12,000 babies admitted to hospital each year with severe RSV. It is a leading cause of hospitalisation of babies in Australia.

Maternal immunisation reduces the risk of severe RSV disease in infants under 6 months of age by about 70 per cent.

Pregnant women can safely receive the RSV vaccine at the same time as other free and recommended maternal vaccines, influenza and whooping cough, which are already free.


