### Meeting to discuss issues around Ageing in Rural Areas - a Report

Dear People,

The meeting considering older people in our community looked at a number of issues.

The primary one was the fact that removing older people from their known surroundings is known to cause damage to their well-being and can trigger the onset of dementia.

If it is unwise or impossible to remain in their own home, then remaining in their community is important.

None of the local councillors or politicians (State or Federal) were present even though they had been invited

However, Fiona Morrison, the community engagement officer for ALICE and Breanna Pollock from Central Coast Council both spoke to the meeting answering many questions.

Keith and Brynnie Goodwill from the Wollombi-Laguna resilience network and Alan and Judy Smedley from Ravensdale were present representing their communities.

The need for a multi-purpose aged care facility to cover permanent care, convalescent care, respite and day care needs to be considered further as well as "Composite homes" scattered round the community.

The need for affordable transport, in-home carers from the local area, a 'community nurse' etc needs to be further considered.

A co-ordinator to help rural people access what services there are would be very beneficial.

The next meeting will consider if we wish to become part of ALICE as well as where, when and how often we should meet etc.

#### All Inclusive Care for **Older People (ALICE)**

The Central Coast is home to the largest and fastest growing number of elderly and frail patients in New South Wales. By 2031, more than 22% of older people on the Coast will be aged 70 or over (some 80,000 people). The elderly and frail cohort (>70yrs or >50yrs Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people) are at the highest risk of adverse outcomes such as falls, disability, unscheduled hospital admissions, longer stays in hospital, uncontrolled polypharmacy, and greater difficulty recovering from illness and surgery.





To address such problems, the elderly and frail cohort requires multimodal care due that enable them to better engage in prevention and health promotion activities that support them to live as well as possible with their multiple and long-term conditions in the home environment and address key issues related to declining functional capacity and mental health. However, the lack of coordinated access to and community-based primary services (some 35% of people do not have access to a GP on the Coast) as well as community aged care support, combined with increasing numbers of older people living in social isolation and disconnected from the communities in which they live, means that care outcomes for older people are not as good as they should be.

To address this, the ALICE (All Inclusive Care for Older People) project, aims to support people to remain independent and well, and to avoid the need for hospital visits or residential care. We will be working with local communities to create local models of services and community connections that allow older people and their carers to receive support and best-practice care in the community and at home.

The purpose of ALICE is to improve care experience and outcomes for older people living with complex health and social care needs in our Central Coast communities, supporting them to remain independent and well, and delaying or avoiding the use of institutional care. ALICE is designed to build on the Central Coast's Elderly and Frail Connected Care Pathway approach to create an evidence-based neighbourhood model for integrated community care.



# YOUTH EMPOWERMENT GRANTS TO STRENGTHEN COMMUNITY SAFETY





### Swings, Slides, and Safety: Cheero Point playspace gets much needed upgrade




