# Community Transport & Health Connections Update

We had a good ALICE community meeting last Thursday with Community Transport which was attended by the current General Manger of Central Coast Community Transport, Helen Crouch, and the upcoming General Manager Tara Russell.

Helen and Tara explained how Hornsby Kuringai Community Transport have taken over the management of Central Coast Community Transport and shared with us their services and the planned activities they have for the Mangrove Mountain region.

We had an interested and vocal representation of community issues with residents from Spencer, Kulnura, Bucketty, Peats Ridge and Yarramalong attending. Issues raised included the scarcity of public transport, the cost and availability of community transport options, and that these require people to be receiving Commonwealth Home Support Services (CHSP), the need for a regular shopping bus, and one for social outings.

Helen explained that there is currently a shopping bus that takes Spencer residents to Erina Fair twice each month, discussion was had to see if this bus could also stop off at central points along the way e.g. Mangrove Mountain Store, Central Mangrove and Somersby school to pick up other eligible residents.

Community Transport has also begun their social outings program that will be able to pick up eligible residents in the region and take them to social activities across the Central Coast on a monthly basis. We also asked if this could occur on the plateau for special events such as the County Fair, and Tara will be working with Fiona and the community to make this happen.



# Safety on School Buses

After some incidents on local school buses that led to children being injured, in 2024 I and other parents contacted our local MP's to ask that buses on school runs be fitted with seat belts.

Both Liesl Tesch, Member for Gosford and Gordon Reid, Member for Robertson, referred the issue to Jenny Aitchison, the NSW Minister for Roads and Regional Transport.

To paraphrase the response:

 Disability Standards for Accessible Public Transport 2002 require all regular route services to be timetabled as accessible services.  Vehicle standards introduced after the 2023 Hunter Valley bus crash will require seatbelts in all models by 2027, but key exemptions remain.

Now Queensland parents are pushing for compulsory school bus seatbelts and one Queensland mum pointed out: "You can get into so much trouble with a kid not having a seatbelt in your car," Ms Crocker said.

"Even a dog on the back of a ute has to be restrained, but we're putting kids on buses that are travelling on the same road as big road trains."

- Seat belts are not compatible with the needs of passengers who require the amenity of flip-down seats to accommodate trolleys, mobility aids, prams, and back rests for wheelchair users.
- Local bus services did not pass the Transport for NSW risk-based assessments.
- Even if the risk threshold was exceeded only dedicated school buses would be fitted with seat belts An investigation by By Brandon Long and Liam McNally of the ABC found:
- WA mandated seatbelts on all school buses 20 years ago, but the rest of the country still allows children to travel unrestrained.
- Various governments have cited high costs and logistical challenges as a barrier.

buses in outer metropolitan areas being retrofitted with seat belts.

Let's face it, the real reasons for not having seat belts fitted to all school run buses are cost and increased difficulty in co-ordinating bus operations.

All users need seatbelts and large items should be restrained when buses travel on rural roads,.

In taxis, wheelchairs are extremely well secured.

Kids are used to wearing seat belts, they have been using them all their lives. If I'm slow in buckling up, my kids are quick to remind me.

A risk-based approach just means that the Government is willing to accept a "small" number of kids being maimed or killed in exchange for savings in the budget.





# Repurposing Gosford Library

overarching Government Architect of NSW (GANSW) directive to repurpose Gosford Library within the Gosford Urban Design Framework (UDF) supports the ongoing CBD revitalisation, population growth, future needs of greenspace, open space and quality standalone community infrastructure for Kibble Park. During public consultation, the Central Coast Council promoted the UDF design principles for Kibble Park as guiding the park's revitalisation, highlighting 'especially' to repurpose Gosford Library. The Council's UDF deviation to demolish the modernist, National Trust registered, Gosford Library to create a pavement and steps removes the GANSW's optimal greenspace for Kibble Park. Council's switch to repurpose the Parkhouse entails major investment for significant structural upgrades, improvements and ongoing maintenance. Historian, Merril Jackson states this deviation is 'unacceptable, as it undermines the GANSW's authority, and the Council's responsibility to protect and preserve local heritage'. Previously commissioned heritage assessment reports affirming Gosford Library's significance and heritage value have been publicly withheld by the Council. Gosford Library's history and heritage reveals the prominent Sydney architect, Alan Williams designed a bespoke non-institutionalised literary space, the building's quality and built-to-last longevity is accredited to internationally renowned structural engineers of Sydney Opera House, Ove Arup.

The Gosford Library, as Jackson emphasises, is identified within the UDF as a built heritage asset, and registered significant 20th mid-century architecture by the Australian Institute of Architects.

The library's construction involved Sydney and Canberra based midcentury architectural trailblazers, and groundbreaking usage of technically advanced architectural and construction firsts in NSW, including and not limited to, the CSIRO scientifically developed structural timber laminates.

Other mid-century collaborators included mechanical/electrical engineers, D. S. Thomas & Partners. building company, notable Edwards, timber carpentry craftsmanship Hardys Joinery and Bros (Canberra), Hancock pioneering mid-century concrete artisan, Rinaldo Umberto Fabbro.

Special associations to Gosford Library include iconic Australian structures, such as, The National Carillon, Australia Square, Sydney Law Courts Building Queen's Square, Sydney MLC Building Podium & The Commercial Travellers' Association

Club (Mushroom), Academy of Science, National Library of Australia, and the Australian War Memorial.

Reinstating the GANSW endorsed design principle, 'Re-purpose library' ensures the qualified urban planned UDF delivers the prime city 'green room' for Kibble Park and is inclusive of the quality greenspace urban landscape infrastructure as authorised by the GANSW. Championed under the Liberal Government and supported by Central Coast Regional Development, the UDF provides a strategic urban planned vision to increase greenspace, provide community infrastructure to support population growth into the future. Jackson urges people to breakthrough the myth-making claims, as they bear no substance to the truth, 'The GANSW carefully stating, selected the architecturally significant building to repurpose in Kibble Park, not the Parkhouse. Building inspections from 2022 and 2024 confirm the good condition of the Gosford Library building. The GANSW duly considered the current and longtime future needs of greenspace, open space, and the population growth of Gosford City, and emphasised it important to retain GOSFORD LIBRARY'. An abandoned ex-bank shell is being reborn into a permanent, community Arts & Culture Centre in the beating heart of the upcoming Gosford Entertainment Precinct on Mann Street through the passionate & strategic volunteer work of residents, neighbours, artists, businesses and allies determined to ensure Gosford's lift out of the 40 year slump and status as the number 1 city in Australia for business failure.

The trailblazing arts organisation, Funhaus Factory behind more than 500 vibrant activations across the Central Coast which have attracted 50,000+ participants, created over \$600,000+ in paid Artist opportunities, across 1,100+ artist engagements as well as an additional half a million dollars in paid jobs across Arts Administration, Marketing, Operations, Food & Beverage jobs has today launched a 30-day crowdfunding drive to raise the final \$77,240 needed to open the doors and pass compliance.

For six years, Funhaus has enriched the region with new possibilities, delivering unprecedented vibrancy, cohesion and positive recognition for the region with multiple awards including the NSW STATE WINNER Origami "Folding light and Sound" as the first time the region has ever received a state award for Arts, Culture and collaboration & National winners of the ABC Heywire awards for the YAAS youth program as one of the most innovative in the country, saving lives and building resilience.

"We have been working towards this ambitious project for six years; it's the hardest thing we have ever attempted" says Acting GM Juan Iocco and "every cent is a key that unlocks community potential."



Unsuccessful in their state infrastructure funding bids, the self-funded community project has been achieved through the determination of the 300 strong volunteers and committee, working up to 18-hour days sacrificing the organisations 6yr savings pool, previously earmarked for 25/26 Arts Programming.

Creative Director Glitta Supernova stated "Independent Cultural spaces are so important for community & CBD building—it's where we share stories, exchange ideas, and build connections. Alongside all the cranes in the air we are the cranes on the ground, accelerating our society and changing culture.

Costs from floor grinding for accessibility to mandatory fire safety upgrades are urgent, practical needs. None are luxuries and each unlocks a vital possibility."

# Do you know your General Biosecurity Duty?

Biosecurity is the protection of the economy, environment and community from the negative impacts of pests and diseases, weeds and contaminants.

We can only successfully manage biosecurity when every person plays a part. The idea that biosecurity is a shared responsibility means we all need to do our bit to protect the economy, environment and community from biosecurity threats.

Being biosecure will help:

- Keep your animals safe from disease
- You to grow more produce and reduce impacts of weeds and pests
- Help our primary producers gain better yields at lower costs, whilst maintaining access to interstate and international markets
- Reduce stock losses and infrastructure damage by pest animals.

Everyone has a role to play in protecting against biosecurity risks. Do you know yours? This responsibility is known as your General Biosecurity Duty (GBD) and your role under the Biosecurity Act 2015 is to prevent, eliminate or minimise pest animals, weeds and their impacts.



Pest animals and weeds cause significant damage to our environment, agriculture and communities. If you own, occupy or manage land in NSW, you have a responsibility to be aware of pest animals and weeds on your land and take action to effectively manage them.

How to meet your General Biosecurity Duty for managing pests and weeds:

- take action to prevent, eliminate or minimise pests and weeds
- participate in control programs with

your neighbours

• report pest and weed sightings

There is no 'one-size-fits-all' approach and you are not expected to know everything. The good news is support is available to suit your situation.




## What are employment lands?

As defined by the Department of Planning, Housing and Infrastructure's (DPHI) Employment Lands Development Monitor (ELDM), employment lands are defined as:

"land zoned for industrial or similar purposes in planning instruments. They are generally lower density

employment areas containing concentrations of businesses involved in: manufacturing; transport and warehousing; service and repair trades and industries; integrated enterprises with a mix of administration, production, warehousing, research and development; and urban services and utilities."

Employment land is vital to the functioning of urban areas, providing space for:

- Essential services such as waste and water management, repair trades and construction services.
- Warehousing, logistics and distribution centres.
- Areas for businesses that design, manufacture and produce goods and services.
- Employment lands primarily encompass land zoned as E3 Productivity Support; E4 General Industrial; W4 Working Waterfront; and SP4 Enterprise.

While this strategy focuses on employment precincts, it is acknowledged that employment is also generated within other zones including special purpose zones, residential zones, centre zones and rural land zones.

Mayor Lawrie McKinna said the Leisure and Aquatic Strategy 2025-2035 is an important step in planning for a healthy, connected and active community.

"Our leisure and aquatic facilities are part of everyday life for so many people in the region, whether it's learning to swim, shooting hoops, joining a local club or catching up with friends," Mayor McKinna said.

"We want to make sure our facilities continue to meet community needs and aspirations. This is your chance to help shape what these spaces look like now and into the future."


