Hidden Treasure in Dubbo Gully

The tragic story of Hughie Cameron and his hoard of gold coins was rediscovered only recently.

When St. Thomas' cemetery at Dubbo Gully was restored in 1985, little was known about Hughie Cameron. The inscription on the wooden cross that marks his grave simply reads: "In Memory of Hughie Cameron, died in Ten Mile Hollow." Not even the year of his death is recorded. Hughie's story is both tragic and intriguing...

Hugh Cameron was born around 1843 and orphaned when he was 7 years old. Hughie lived for most of his life around Mangrove Creek and Wollombi, with an occasional break of a few months at Yarramalong. He also worked for a year or so in Gosford as the servant of the Anglican Rev. J. King-Brown.

Hughie was well liked in the district, although he generally lived a life of solitude and was 'somewhat eccentric in his manners'. He was also well known for his fascination with gold sovereigns. It was said that he had accumulated a substantial hoard of gold coins over the years.

In early August 1907, now in his 60's



and suffering from influenza, Hughie came to visit Matthew Pemberton at Mangrove. He left there on 12th August without indicating where he was planning to go. In fact, he made his way to Alfred Andrews' place, where he often stayed for a few days. Alfred Andrews farmed upstream at Dubbo Gully. Located close to the school, church and cemetery, The Andrews homestead played a central role in the life of the Mangrove Creek community.

On the 14th August, Hughie rose very early, as was his custom, and departed. However, when he did not turn up at any of his usual visiting places after a few days, a search was made, which eventually also involved the police. Locals were concerned as

he had recently remarked to some of his closer acquaintances that "no one should see me die".

After several days' searching in the surrounding rugged country, Hughie's body was found on Thursday 22nd Aug 1907 at the bottom of a waterfall in a deep gorge off Simpson's track near Ten Mile Hollow. The inquest held at Mangrove Creek on 24th Aug recorded that he died from the 'Effect of injuries received through falling down a precipice, and that such fall was the result of his own act'.

His hoard of gold sovereigns was never found.



Hughie Cameron was buried at St. Thomas' Cemetery, a few hundred metres from Fairview Homestead, Alfred and Amanda Andrews' home and the other Hidden Treasure in Dubbo Gully.

Stories like that of Hughie Cameron can be re-discovered and re-told. Sadly, once heritage-listed buildings have been lost to neglect or bushfire, they are lost forever.

Shocking State of Public Toilets at Mangrove Mountain

For a few years now the public toilets at Mangrove Mountain have been plagued by persistent leaks which cause effluent to pool beside the toilet structure, forming stagnant, smelly patches that are both unsightly and hygienically concerning.

Over time, this pooled effluent can leach downhill, contaminating the surrounding soil and water sources.

The environmental repercussions of these leaks are serious. When it rains, the effluent that pools beside the toilets can be washed down the slope into the nearby play area, the reserve, and adjacent properties. This contamination poses serious health risks, especially to children playing in the area or people using the reserve for recreation.

The prospect of raw sewage reaching public spaces raises questions about the long-term safety and cleanliness of the community environment. Furthermore, the leaks attract pests and vermin, further complicating hygiene issues and diminishing the community's quality of life. The current state of these toilets is not just a matter of inconvenience but is a public health concern.

The Mangrove Mountain public toilets are located beside the Mangrove Mountain Computer club building and the Public Hall and across the road from the Mangrove Village Shops. They serve as a critical amenity for both local residents and visitors. Their proximity to community facilities and shops ensures constant use, while large gatherings such as markets and festivals put additional pressure on already inadequate infrastructure.

The lack of alternative facilities within an almost 20-kilometre radius makes this toilet block indispensable, particularly for individuals who may have urgent needs, such as persons with incontinence, parents with young children, and people with disabilities.

Poorlymaintainedtoiletscanseverely limit the mobility and participation of these groups in community life, affecting social inclusion and quality of life (see <u>https://www.centralcoast.</u> <u>nsw.gov.au/residents/accessibilityand-inclusion/accessible-publicfacilities.</u>)

- It can be smelt from many metres away!!
- It is a health hazard!!!

Mangrove Mountain sits on a main thoroughfare and tourist route, making its public toilet facilities an important factor in the visitor experience.

The recent Harvest Festival and other events draw tourists to the region, yet the state of the public toilets risks turning a necessity into an unintended, off-putting sideshow. Negative experiences with public amenities can deter repeat visits and damage the reputation of the area.

Research on tourism infrastructure shows that inadequate or poorly maintained public facilities can discourage tourism, reduce economic benefits, and strain relations between visitors and locals (see <u>https://www. bunniktours.com.au/sustainabletourism/impacts</u> and <u>https://www. coastalwiki.org/wiki/Impact_of_</u> tourism_in_coastal_areas:_Need_of_ sustainable_tourism_strategy)

Recognizing the gravity of the situation, the Central Coast Council has included the Mangrove Mountain toilets in its public toilet strategy, with plans to install a septic system to replace the drop toilets and include the provision of hand washing facilities.

However the community and Council would be better served if the existing building was demolished and replaced with a modern facility built to "regional standard" in line with the fantastic new standard Council toilet designs, including as a suggested minimum, two accessible units with baby change facilities, facilities for people with health issues, incontinence, incontinence, disabilities, gender-diverse individuals, female hygiene facilities and a wash basin. Plus two single ambulant toilets and an external wash basin (see https://engagement. vourvoiceourcoast.com/sites/default/ files/2024-09/ccc-public_amenities_ strategy community report.pdf).

Implementing This option would ensure lower main maintenance costs and capital expense for the next 20 years as the existing structure is old and has a much more limited practical lifespan. The Council Public Toilet Strategy originally identified 79 public toilets in need of renewal across the region and allocated significant investment for upgrades over the next two decades.

Whilst everyone awaits (with necessarily baited breath) the unveiling of improved toilet facilities, until this actually occurs, the community must remain vigilant.

RODGER WILSON 30/3/42 - 19/6/25

Rodger Wilson grew up on a sheep and cattle farm at Parakao, a small village between the Tasman Sea and Pacific Ocean north of Auckland.

His childhood was spent riding his horse to and from school, helping out on the farm and beginning his lifelong passion for anything on wheels including picking up the shearing team in his father's car long before he had a licence.

When he was 14 he left the farm and the small Parakao School to attend Sacred Heart College in Auckland. His love for woodwork and building evolved from helping build the pews for the school Chapel. He played football and made lifelong friends, some of whom he formed a band with. They were good enough to play for family events outside school. Rodger was the drummer.

He decided to spend a gap year visiting his aunt and uncle, Bill and Molly Tapper in Australia, arriving in Sydney with his mate John, on a one way ticket with not enough money to return to NZ. Bill managed the Peats Ridge Quarry so he and John quickly found jobs.

Rodger met Lorraine Walpole at a party to celebrate his 20th birthday in the Peats Ridge Community Hall. Little did they realise that three years later, after a lot of letters and a few more trips across the Tasman they would marry on March 6, 1965 in Christ Church, Gosford. Lorraine's parents, Joan and Ray Walpole were married in the adjacent St Mary's 22 years previously.

Although they had planned a future life together in NZ a shortage of farm workers on the mountain caused Ray to ask if a job on the farm at Kulnura would be of interest. They were both ready to go farming again.

Rodger fitted into life in Kulnura very quickly becoming one of another large extended family. He and Ray became great mates even if their ideas for the farm sometimes differed and Joan became a second mother. More land was purchased and more citrus trees planted.

The building skills Rodger learnt at Sacred Heart, and which he would put to good use for the rest of his life, were put to good use in the small house into which



they moved.

Rodger's volunteering life began initially with Ray's encouragement, to assist local farmers fight bush fires with only farm equipment. By the time Kulnura had a fully equipped RFS station he was a fully fledged member almost always ready for call outs. When he decided that he was past carrying a water hose, especially up steep slopes, he trained to do the driving. With his love of driving he gained a reputation for getting a fire truck in and out of tight situations. He remained an active RFS volunteer until he decided not to renew his heavy duty licence three years ago when he turned 80. It was a particularly difficult decision.

Two children, Deb and Greg, came along so more varied volunteer work happened very organically – finding just the right Christmas tree for the annual Childrens' Christmas party at the Kulnura Hall needed lots of hands for example.



He built one of the first jet boats on the Central Coast and had enormous fun skimming across the shallow parts of Brisbane Water much to the amazement of people standing knee deep digging for bait.

Aside from renovations to the house and the boat Rodger solved a lot of labour issues on the farm with his inventions – like the spray vat with two arms which he developed and built with local engineer, Ken West. That machine cut the time needed to spray the orchard in half and the design was appropriated by others. After putting in a complete irrigation system he designed and built two sand filters which again were copied for use in the US. He spent a lot of time mending and adapting machinery, building a cool room for the truck to transport eggs. He loved his '79 International and spent a lot of time looking after it.

Even a family trip to Central Australia was an excuse to build and invent. A second hand Kombi was adapted for the trip including a fridge, roll out annex, a bed and as many jerry can fuel and water holders as could be fitted especially for the challenging 800km Plenty Hwy stretch of the trip arriving in The Alice with just half a litre of fuel.

When children began school most parents would join the P & C. Rodger was President for a number of years including for the 50th Anniversary celebrations. Kulnura PS often reminded him of his old school at Parakao in NZ

He went on to project manage the Kooree Guide Cabin construction with a builder mate. It was a huge job co-ordinating lots of working bees and a team of tech college building apprentices. Lorraine was the Guide Leader at the time and Deb a Girl Guide. It was opened in September 1984 and has since been used by thousands of Guides and other youth groups for weekend bush camps.

A number of Girl Guide Region camps were held on the farm. Rodger would prepare the site, usually for more than 300 Guides, plus Leaders, and all their activities. He even provided running water for each site.

When Lorraine was appointed PR Adviser for Guides NSW he was right beside her with all the activities - stayed awake with her to manage the Taronga Zoo Winter sleep outs (Guides were the first to sleep at the zoo) making sure the 1500 Guides and Leaders were safe and sound.

Backing up on the same weekend, with more eager Guides and Leaders helping gather upwards of 5 tonnes of clothing the runners had stripped off just before the start of the City to Surf. This clothing which had previously ended up in land fill, became an annual resource for the Smith Family.

Rodger was in charge of the Sydney NYE Picnic in the Park barbecues for disabled children and their families held adjacent to Government House. Keeping 15-20 barbecues going was quite an effort, there was always something that needed to be fixed.

The next community project was building a sports field complex on an old quarry site, again with a couple of friends, Eddie Grant and Reg Bennett and again lots of working bees. The Council Engineer at the time commented that three farmers couldn't possibly build sport fields! How wrong he was! Bloodtree Sports Complex was opened in August 1986 and remains one of the best fields on the Central Coast today.

Rodger was an inaugural member of the PMK (now Mountains) Football Committee, coached and managed soccer teams for many years. Four of his five grandchildren play on those same fields along with many thousands of children over the ensuing years – a legacy to be very proud of.

He was an inaugural member of the Central Coast Plateau Chamber of Commerce and an active member of the NSW Farmers Central Coast Horticultural Committee holding executive positions in both for some time. Until his health made it too difficult he could always be found helping set up for the Country Fair and cleaning up afterwards.

Rodger joined the Rotary Club of Kariong Somersby and quickly became involved with the Rotary Exchange Student program. He and Lorraine hosted many teenagers from every continent and also adults on exchange. He was Youth Director for many years and President for two years, the first while the club refurbished a vandalised building, Phillip House, in Mount Penang Parklands precinct.

He instigated the Kariong Somersby Rotary Club Citizenship Awards for every Primary School on the mountain while Youth Director which will now include his name.

Kariong Somersby Rotary Club are renowned for their barbecue efforts. The often admired barbecue trailer was designed and made by Rodger. He also loved welding.

Rodger experienced so much achievement, fun and friendship during the sixty years he has lived in this community. Often asked for and happily provided his advice and practical help.

Lorraine, Deb and Michelle, Greg and Kate, Abby, Damon, Casey, Zoe and Megan have been overwhelmed by the support they have received and would like to thank all those who were able to attend the Celebration Service for Rodger, sent flowers and cards, telephoned or visited. Special thanks to Kariong Somersby Rotary Club for providing the post service wake at Phillip House.
