# Updated Guidelines for Safe Pile Burning Outside the Fire Danger Period

Some of the information shared in our previous article is now outdated, so we'd like to provide you with the current requirements and reminders for conducting a safe pile burn outside of the official Fire Danger Period.

If you're planning to burn, it's important to notify the RFS ahead of time. The easiest way to do this is by searching "Notify to Burn" online or scanning the QR code included with this article.



You'll be directed to the appropriate online form. In addition to notifying the RFS, you must also inform your neighbours at least 24 hours before lighting your fire.

Before you begin, check local weather conditions. Be aware of the Fire Danger Rating for the day, and take into account wind speeds and temperature, as these can affect how your fire behaves. It's also essential to clear the area around your burn pile of any flammable material and keep firefighting equipment close by. Fires must be carefully monitored at all times, and if anything gets out of control, you should call Triple Zero (000) immediately.

As we near the start of the next Fire Danger Period on 1 October 2025, it's also important to stay alert for any Total Fire Ban days. On these days, burning is strictly prohibited—regardless of whether you've notified—because it simply isn't safe.

There are also a few important

restrictions to keep in mind when burning. You are not permitted to burn rubbish or building materials, as these can create toxic smoke and pose additional hazards. And finally, never leave a burn unattended. Many emergency callouts are the result of small, manageable fires being left on their own and quickly escalating.

Council Mayor, Lawrie McKinna said proper disposal of household

chemicals is essential for community safety and environmental protection.

"Keeping old chemicals in the home can increase the risk of poisoning, while improper disposal – such as pouring them down the drain or placing them in the bin – is illegal and can harm the environment," Mayor McKinna said.

"These free Chemical CleanOut events are a great opportunity to safely and conveniently dispose of hazardous items – mark your calendar!"

Council Acting Director Infrastructure Services, Andrew Pearce said a wide range of items will be accepted.

"Residents can bring paints, pesticides, gas bottles, fire extinguishers, fluorescent globes and tubes – even unknown or unlabelled chemicals can be dropped-off," Mr Pearce said.

"Please note only household quantities are accepted. A limit of 20 litre or 20 kilogram applies per item, except for paint, which is accepted up to 100 litres in containers of 20 litres or less."

# **Mangrove** Mountain **Public Toilets** Upgrade up to 2 years away

The 2024 Public Toilet Strategy exhibited by the Central Coast Council did not include the public toilets at Mangrove Mountain.

The Strategy followed on from an extensive consultant's report by Conybeare Morrison International Pty Ltd (CM+) that looked at all toilets available to the public, including those at railway stations, shopping centres and other public spaces.

CM+ identified that the Mangrove Mountain toilets do not meet the guidelines of the Disability Discrimination Act (DDA).

The toilets, identified in the Council documents as "BL-0732 Waratah Road Public Toilet", are classified as "General public toilets in remote areas" with no recognition of how frequently they are used.

The toilets continue to emit a foul persistent odour and leak effluent which stagnates in pools beside the facility. Such leaks not only breach basic hygiene standards but also pose significant public health risks, echoing concerns raised across Australia about the management of public sanitary infrastructure (NSW Health, 2022).

This is a raw sewage leak!

The approval and regulation of Onsite Wastewater Management Systems (OWMS) on land owned by the state or federal governments is managed by the relevant department and Minister (Minister for Local Government / Minister for Better Regulation and Fair Trading / Minister for Planning and Public Spaces) so perhaps we can call on our State Government MP's and Ministers to look into this issue.

There are several pieces of legislation and government guidelines that apply to this problem.

## Excerpts from the NSW Government Easy Septic Guide:

HIGH RISK AREAS

These are highly vulnerable and sensitive environments like villages and areas close to drinking water sources, oyster leases, rivers and wetlands where the release of sewage pollution can cause a lot of harm.

If your septic system is in a HIGH risk area, the council will arrange to have regular checks made for the assurance of safety and good practice.

As a septic system owner, you are

#### responsible for -

- ensuring the house drains and tank don't leak
- getting things fixed if they are not working properly
- keeping the system well maintained
- ensuring the system is checked regularly
- getting the tank pumped (desludged)when it becomes too full to process the flow going into it
- maintaining and protecting the absorption field
- complying with the council's requirements for installation, maintenance service and operation and paying fees for inspections or maintenance.

# Meanwhile, the council is responsible for -

- providing general services for the protection of the environment, public health and safety
- helping people keep their septic systems working well
- providing a scheme of systematic management for all of the septic systems in the council area, including environmental monitoring and technical advice.
- providing advice and contact information when people need professional services to design or maintain septic systems
- regulating the installation, operation and maintenance of septic systems, conducting audits and inspections and keeping a register of systems in

# NSW Local Government (General) Regulation 2021:

The performance standards for the operation of a "system of sewage management" underpin this Guideline and set the requirements for installation, construction and alteration and operation of OWMS. In particular, section 44 of the LG Regulation states:

- A system of sewage management must be operated in a manner that achieves the following performance standards:
- a. the prevention of the spread of disease by microorganisms
- b. the prevention of the spread of foul odours
- c. the prevention of contamination of water
- d. the prevention of degradation of soil

- and vegetation
- e. the discouragement of insects and vermin
- f. ensuring that persons do not come into contact with untreated sewage or effluent (whether treated or not) in their ordinary activities on the premises concerned
- g. the minimisation of any adverse impacts on the amenity of the premises and surrounding lands
- h. if appropriate, provision for the reuse of resources (including nutrients, organic matter and water)

#### Performance standards:

Existing OWMS should comply with the performance standards in LG Regulation section 44 and any installation approval still in force for the system. Existing systems are not required to meet current design standards unless there is a failure of the system, an alteration to the buildings associated with the system or an alternation to the OWMS, including the buffers to its EAA.

Department of Planning, Housing and Infrastructure, Office of Local Government, Onsite Wastewater Management Guidelines

## <u>A2.1.5 Waterless composting toilet</u> <u>system conditions</u>

- 43. The installation of the Waterless Composting Toilet System (WCTS) should be inspected and checked by the manufacturer or the manufacturer's agent. The manufacturer or their agent is to certify that they system has been installed and commissioned in accordance with its design, conditions of accreditation and any additional requirements of Council.
- 44. Maintenance of the WCTS is to be completed in accordance with the manufacturer's operation manual. The owner/ operator of the system is to obtain an operation and maintenance manual from the manufacturer.

Reason: To ensure the owner/operator has the necessary information to carry out basic maintenance.

45. Composted waste material from the WCTS is to be disposed of



by burial within the confines of the premises in soil, which is not intended to be used for at least three (3) months for the cultivation of food for human consumption. The minimum cover of soil over the deposited compost must be 100mm.

- 46. A permanent notice with basic instructions must be fixed to the facility in a prominent position. The permanent notice must include provisions for recording the date of commissioning and the last time compost waste was removed.
- 47. The fan fitted to the air vent must be installed in such a manner that it operates continuously, with easy access being supplied for repairs or replacement of the fan.

Reason: To keep the drainage bed and compost pile aerated.

- 48. No kitchen sullage or greywater is to be disposed of through the WCTS.
- 49. Liquid from the WCTS is to be directed to the approved EAA

These standards and guidelines are applicable to all properties and toilet installations and Council is urged to consult the Community and replace the Mangrove Mountain Public toilets without delay.


#### The Old Fireshed Gallery

# The Benefits of an Anti-Inflammatory Diet

Chronic, systemic inflammation is a serious health concern that can be made worse — or better — with diet.

Here's what chronic inflammation is, and how what you eat can keep you safer from the chronic diseases inflammation can cause.

If you've ever cut your finger, bruised a toe or had a throat infection, you have likely experienced the 4 signs of inflammation: redness, swelling, pain and heat. Acute inflammation is your body's natural response to illness, injury or infection.

Systemic inflammation however affects the whole body, and can become chronic, persisting for months, or even years.

Chronic, systemic inflammation is a factor in diseases such as metabolic syndrome, obesity, pre-diabetes and diabetes, heart disease, arthritis, Alzheimer's, and inflammatory bowel diseases like Crohn's. It is also implicated in some forms of cancer.

#### **Inflammatory Foods**

What you eat contributes to chronic inflammation.

Foods that cause / exacerbate inflammation include:

- Red meat and processed meat
- Commercial baked goods
- Bread and pasta made with white flour
- Deep fried items (eg: fries, fried chicken, donuts)
- Foods high in added sugar (eg: lollies, chocolate bars, sauces)
- Sugar-sweetened beverages
- Trans fats found in margarine, and most processed and ultra-processed foods (often listed as partially hydrogenated oil).

While there isn't one specific antiinflammatory diet, experts say overall healthy eating patterns can help you get rid of inflammation and stay healthier. In particular, they recommend some food types that can help bring inflammation down.

# Anti-Inflammatory Foods 1. Omega-3 Fatty Acids

Found in fatty fish such as salmon, herring, mackerel, sardines, tuna, and anchovies.

If you don't eat 2-3 servings per week of these another option is a high quality fish oil supplement.

Plant-based sources include chia seeds, walnuts, and kelp, although they are not as absorbable as the type

found in fatty fish.

#### 2. Vitamin C

Ascorbic acid, also known as vitamin C, is a powerful antioxidant. Antioxidants help address cellular wear and tear that can set off inflammation.

You'll find vitamin C in most fruits and vegetables. Great sources include kiwi fruit, berries, capsicum, and broccoli.

#### 3. Polyphenols

Polyphenols are naturally occurring compounds in the foods that protect the body from inflammation.

Good sources of polyphenols include coffee, tea, dark chocolate, extra virgin olive oil, berries, beans, and nuts.

#### 4. Gut-Healthy Foods

A healthy population of beneficial bacteria (flora) in your gut can help keep inflammation at bay. To cultivate healthy intestinal flora, enjoy plenty of foods rich in probiotics and prebiotics.

Probiotic foods include yoghurt, cottage cheese, kefir, and sauerkraut. Just be careful of any added sugars.


Prebiotics are a form of fibre that feed your gut bacteria. Foods high in this type of fibre include jerusalem artichokes, asparagus, bananas and any food high in inulin.

The Mediterranean diet may be the most beneficial diet in helping people control inflammation. It emphasises omega-3s, vitamin C, polyphenols, fibre-rich foods and other known inflammation fighters.


