TIME FOR TRUTH TELLING ON LANDFILL TRAVESTY

In May the NSW Environmental Protection Authority (EPA) issued a prevention notice to Verde Terra Pty Ltd, the operator of the Mangrove Mountain Landfill, following the detection of elevated levels of ammonia 80 metres downstream from the site and low levels of PFAS in nearby ground water monitoring bores.

Since then, CEN has been lobbying the Member for Gosford, Liesl Tesch, to assist with our long-standing calls for an independent Commission of Inquiry into the causes of the landfill travesty at the top of this region's water catchment area.

Ms Tesch helpfully passed on our request to the Minister for the Environment, Penny Sharpe MLC, who responded without addressing our call for a judicial inquiry. We've sent another letter to Ms Tesch restating our belief that until a truly independent examination of how a golf course remodelling project turned into a regional landfill was allowed to happen, the same thing could happen again, anywhere!

The presence of ammonia and PFAS around the site is clearly due to leachate - liquid that 'leaches' from landfills, a mixture of compounds, including heavy metals, pathogens, and chemicals. If not managed properly, leachate can contaminate soil and water.

We believe the whole sorry saga of the landfill represents an unacceptable approach to environmental risk management in a highly sensitive drinking water catchment.

The EPA failed to discharge its statutory responsibilities under the Protection of the Environment Operations Ac1997 (POEO Act). It failed to enforce license conditions, permitted unlawful expansion of waste operations, and ignored its obligations on no fewer than eleven (11) distinct occasions.

Equally damning was the role played by the former Gosford City Council

(GCC), which failed to enforce the original development consent and enabled the importation of 800,000m³ of waste - more than 10 times the originally approved amount.

As the leachate continues to percolate at the top of the Central Coast's water aquifer, the NSW Government keeps fobbing off the need to get to the bottom of what went wrong, let alone come up with a way forward.

No penalties have ever been issued for the multiple breaches that have occurred, but the EPA has maintained a financial interest in the landfill via the collection of waste levies. This raises serious questions about conflict of interest and whether revenue considerations compromised environmental oversight.

The legal proceedings that once precluded intervention have now concluded. There is nothing standing in the way of Liesl Tesch and Penny Sharpe standing with this community to get answers.

If the government won't act, perhaps it is time for the community to take a stand and conduct our own Citizens Inquiry to finally let some sunlight in and disinfect what is rotting at the top of the mountain.

Minister blocks drainage price plan

Residents will be consulted on a drainage price to be included in residential rates after Local Government Minister Ron Hoenig refused to allow Central Coast Council to simply transfer the charge from its water rates, no questions asked.

The drainage charge is \$130 a year for properties less than 1000m2 up to \$3,251.85 for properties more than 45,000m2 according to council's FAQ answers on its website.


The charge is worth almost \$20M each year and council says it needs it to deliver essential services to the community.

It could opt to levy a stormwater charge as some councils do but at \$25 a pop, it would not bring in as much money as the current drainage charge.

To keep the charge, Council will now have to ask the Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal (IPART) for a rate rise to take effect in 2026-27.

It is already asking IPART for a 8 per cent water rate rise to take effect from 2026-27.

Minister Hoenig said Council has been advised that its request



has been declined and advised its financial situation should continue to be managed according to the regular processes within the Local Government Act and in consultation with the local community.

Council⁵s water business was simplified in 2024 so it was no longer regulated by two different and at times conflicting pieces of legislation.

The NSW State Government passed the Water Management Amendment (Central Coast Council) Act 2024 and repealed The Central Coast Water Corporation Act 2006.

"Transitional arrangements were put in place as part of the Amendment Act to provide Council sufficient time to act under these regular processes," Mr Hoenig said.

"Further, Council has been advised that the following options are available to it in relation to the levying of a drainage charge after 30 June 2026: 1) Council can fund some stormwater drainage works by levying the Stormwater Management Services Charge under section 496A of the LG Act, without impacting the rate cap limits on General Income; and/or 2) Council can pursue a special variation to introduce a drainage charge reducing other general income."

Resident Kevin Brooks says the Minister's decision is a win for the community.

"If transfer of drainage costs requires an increase in general rates, it should also mean an equal decrease in water rates, Mr Brooks said.

"That's why public consultation is so important - so the public can gauge the combined effect across both general rates and water rates," he said.

Council has already increased its income from combined rates by about 39% in the four years up to 2024.

IPART told council in 2022 that it could no longer include a drainage charge in its water rates from 2026.

IPART said the stormwater services provide benefits to the entire community not just specific customers and therefore should be funded through local government rates like other services that benefit the whole community such as maintaining public parks, roads and bridges.

In March of this year, Councilors voted to ask the Minister to allow it to simply move the charge to its residential rates.

The decision noted that there was no intent to raise additional general rates income from residents - apart from the annual rate cap indexation - as a result of the proposed change.

Then in September, Council voted to seek an 8 per cent water rate rise to take effect in the financial year 2026-

Council has said nothing publicly about the Minister's decision but Member for Robertson Federal Gordon Reid notified ratepayers after he advocated on their behalf by writing to the Minister.



Local Sport Defibrillator Grant Program – Open Now

The Local Sport Defibrillator Grant Program is now open, aiming to improve safety at community sport by increasing access to life-saving equipment.

Member for Gosford, Liesl Tesch MP has emphasised the importance of this funding for our local community saying, "We know that the chance of survival following a cardiac arrest is as high as 75% when defibrillation is applied within four minutes, making the timely availability of Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs) in our community so important.

"This program will save lives. The cost of an AED can be out of reach for many of our grass roots sporting organisations and this program aims to improve safety in our community by increasing access to life-saving equipment when you need it most."

Eligible sport and active recreation organisations across NSW can apply for grants of up to \$3,000 to purchase and install an AED at their facilities.

Ms Tesch called on all local clubs to check their eligibility and apply without delay saying "this funding could save a life, so don't delay in getting your application in."

A pioneering West Australian farmer is combining cattle manure, exotic dung beetles, and biochar to help combat the effects of climate change as well as tackling soil health issues.

WA farmer Doug Pow feeds biochar

to his cattle, and uses dung beetles to work the resultant manure into the soil

He says it reduces greenhouse gases, while improving soil fertility as well as the health of his cattle

A CSIRO scientist also says there's on-farm evidence that liveweight gain is improved if biochar is fed to Anguscross cattle.


