KNOW THE BUSH FIRE ALERT LEVELS

If there is a fire in your area you will find its alert level on the NSW RFS website and in the 'Fires Near Me' app. You need to keep track of the alert level so you know what you should do.

Step 4 Keep

KEEP UP TO DATE WITH ALL S BUSH FIRE INFORMATION NUMBERS, WEBSITES AND APPS

In a bush fire, it's important that you stay up to date on conditions in your area.

The Cadet of the Year Award was established in 2009, to recognise the efforts of a participant in the Secondary School Cadet Programs.

The Deadliest Season in Australia Has Begun

As Australia heads into peak bites and stings season, the Australian Reptile Park joined forces with CSL Seqirus and St John Ambulance to remind Australians just how important awareness and first aid are when it comes to snake and spider encounters.

In November 2025, an event hosted at the Park, marked the start of the country's high-risk season for venomous bites and stings, a time when being prepared and knowing how to respond can be the difference between life and death.

To further support public safety, CSL Seqirus launched its new Bites & Stings app, a free, interactive resource that offers step-by-step first aid instructions, safety tips, and

information about Australia's venomous creatures.

To have a safe and enjoyable time outdoors, Australians should:

- Download the free Australian Bites and Stings App to have up-to-date first aid information on hand if bites or stings do occur.
- Dress and pack a bag for the bush or the beach with an in-date first aid kit, snake bite kit, mobile phone, and food and water.
- Wear long pants, enclosed shoes and stay on the trails.
- Never touch wild animals, get too close or put your limbs in places where you can't see.
- Wear heavy duty gloves and be careful when lifting logs, rocks, or debris, which may be home to snakes and spiders.

CB Radio Training And Community Dinner at Spencer Community Hall

A Strong Turnout Despite the Heat

River Cares hosted its third CB Radio Training session on Saturday, 6th December, and we warmly thank everyone who braved the searing heat to attend. As we move deeper into the bushfire season, it was wonderful to see so many residents committed to strengthening our community's emergency readiness.

Why the CB Radio Network Matters

The strong attendance highlighted the importance the community places in having a reliable backup communication system. During prolonged power outages or extreme weather, we can quickly lose all three levels of telecommunications.

The Emergency Communications CB Radio Network was implemented by the Mangrove Emergency Planning & Communications Committee (MEPCC) and incorporates over 300 CB radios, including a series of base stations, hand held and vehicle mounted units. These are ordinary UHF CB's and channel 57 selected as the standard.

The River Cares Committee actively joined forces with the MEPCC program and provided additional handheld CBs for Spencer and the River communities as part of the local Community Led Emergency Response Plan (CLERP).

The Emergency Communications CB network now extends essentially from Gunderman to Wollombi and out to Marlow, Somersby and Jilliby.

The River Cares Committee has provided some assistance to Wisemans Ferry in joining and extending this CB Network.

The CB network creates an

interconnected communication system that helps to ensure neighbours can still reach one another and critical information can be shared or forwarded on when it matters most. During times of isolation caused by floods, bushfires or major power outages etc, isolated people can still relay messages to contact "Triple0" [000] for help or get local assistance from neighbours etc.

The long range plan is to have links to communication networks in adjacent areas such as St. Albans.

Whilst the CB network operates on Channel 57 for initial contact and during emergencies, for general chitchat members must move to another free channel as agreed, and then return their radios to 57 on completion of that conversation.

Special thanks to our guest speakers and trainers.

River Cares extends sincere thanks to our guest speakers and trainers:-

- Tracey Ann Cook Spencer RFS. Who spoke about how important communication is for our isolated areas and also noted that RFS can't monitor our CB Network, so it is important for the members on the CB Network to pass on information to the 1st person that can actually contact 000 via a phone. This is because a RFS Unit cannot be dispatched unless instructed by the RFS Headquaters.
- Sebastian Southern Wisemans Ferry RFS. He did an excellent job in demonstrating and training our members in CB Radio "on air protocols" of communication so as to be more effective in passing on critical information.
- Ian Milne Mapping contacts for the CB Radio Network. Ian provided a detailed live map and MEPCC based spreadsheet on a laptop showing the communication links that have been established and confirmed between various members using their base stations and handhelds.

Grant Funding Supporting Local Households

Funding from the Black Summer Bushfire Recovery Program and FRRR (Flood) enabled River Cares to

purchase nearly 100 CB radio handsets, now distributed across Greengrove, Gunderman, Lower Mangrove, Lower Mount White, Marlow, Spencer and Wendoree Park.

These grants also funded the River Cares Go Bags, which include a first aid kit, emergency blanket, USB stick, document pouch, glow sticks, and a '4-in-1' device with siren, torch, windup radio and mobile charger.

A Delicious Dinner to End the Day After training, the community

enjoyed a beautiful shared dinner. A heartfelt thank you to George and Lee-Ann Vassilimis, who spent the entire day slaving over a hot oven to prepare mouth-watering lamb for everyone to enjoy. 

"By investing in their work, we are improving the quality of life for our community today and helping to build a stronger, more resilient Central Coast for the future."


Council Director Community and Recreation Services, Melanie Smith said Council provided support to local groups in the grant application process through two grant writing workshops and four grant information sessions.
